A sure sign of spring is the blooming of my favorite tree in Southwest Florida, the Tabebui. The Tabebuia is an absolutely spectacular deciduous tree which displays spring-time color in the form of yellow trumpet shaped flowers. Although we only have a few remaining on campus due to Hurricane Wilma back in 2005, what we do have will put on quite a show when in full bloom. These trees will

also provide a breathtaking backdrop for the upcoming prayer garden. I am going to approach the Buildings and Grounds committee to see if we may add a few more to our campus so everyone can take advantage of this beautiful tree.

On the opposite page you will find a succinct plan for the Paniccia Prayer Garden. You may depict the locations of the individual Stations of the Cross, St. Francis of Assisi statue as well as the benches. There are currently nine Stations of the Cross and ONE bench remaining. The statue of St. Francis of Assisi still remains although I am meeting with an interested family this week that is considering purchasing this lone statue and fountain. The Stations that are committed are noted in red. The cost for the St. Francis statue is \$15,000.00, Stations of the Cross are \$7,500.00 and benches are \$3,000.00. We are also planning on offering benches in the Memorial Garden and in front of the Church, if that would suit your needs better. Two benches have been purchased in the memorial garden leaving six from which to choose. Some of you have taken advantage of my offer to pay for your Station or bench over the course of seven months or by the end of October. We would like to have all of the Stations, benches and the St. Francis Statue spoken for by the end of season so that we may order the granite, break ground and have the grand opening by the end of the year.





100 Prayer Warriors Respond to 40 Days for Life With Bishop Dewane at Planned Parenthood

Opening day of 40 Days for Life was absolutely blessed by God. The Bishop Dewane and approximately 100 prayer warriors lined the corner of Goodlette-Frank and Creech Rds. in front of Planned Parenthood on March 9. The prayers were punctuated with a beautiful trumpet version of "Ave Maria". Passersby were either strongly for us or strongly against us. There did not seem to be any ambivalence on the controversial subject of abortion.

Ignoring the occasional shout out from passing vehicles, the participants continued to pray. Peaceful prayer is the first cornerstone of 40 Days for Life. People prayed not only to end abortion, but more specifically for the employees at Planned Parenthood, including the abusive security guard, the staff and especially the doctor who performs the abortions every Monday.

In the 40 Days for Life campaign in the fall of 2009, Planned Parenthood Director Abby Johnson



responded to the prayers she had been ignoring for years by leaving Planned Parenthood and joining forces with 40 Days for Life cofounder Shawn Carney. I highly recommend her book: *Unplanned*. She eloquently describes the attraction of the peaceful praying outside her work place.

The second cornerstone of 40 Days for Life is fasting. God has been asking the faithful to fast as a way of defining our commitment to

Him for thousands of years. As I fasted on Ash Wednesday, I realized why fasting is so effective. Each time I thought of eating (about every 10 minutes) I had to pray to God and ask for His help to not fall to the numerous commercials with food, the magazines with pictures of food and the snacks lying around my own home. Fasting is a great way to get in touch with God and allow Him to lead us.

Sherman Garvin Receives 'Gift of Sight' Corneal Transplant

an you imagine being blind? Actually, Sherman isn't totally blind, but from birth, he has only been able to determine light from dark and general shapes and sizes. He does very well with his limited abilities, but he is far from independent, still living with his mother and stepfather at age 31, with no personal income.

Dr. Jeffrey Zimm performed a corneal transplant on Sherman's right eye on February 8, 2011, here in Naples. Sherman was checked by Dr. Zimm's associate during our recent JOP mission trip to St. Pius X in Kingston and was told his eye was doing fine. (Sight is not immediate after a corneal transplant.) Dr. Zimm donated his surgical services and facilities, and JOP donors funded the cost of the corneal tissue.

As background, another young Jamaican man received a corneal transplant almost two years ago. His eye was also checked on this past trip — 20/30— almost perfect!

Sherman stayed with us during his week in Naples. He's a very quiet young man until it comes to music. Sherman can sing like an angel! He currently sings at church, for weddings and funerals, as well as performing at popular venues near his home in Clarendon, west of Kingston. Sometimes he sings with a partner. And he has a girlfriend, but he



tells me he's not quite ready to take the big step!

Sherman hopes that the gift of sight, even in only one eye, will help him to do more with his music and to help others. And he'd like to learn to drive! He and his family are extremely grateful to JOP and St John the Evangelist optical donors for this life-changing gift of sight.

Sherman still needs another corneal transplant for his left eye. There are also

others in Jamaica with similar situations but this type of surgery is not available there. Dr. Zimm donates his time and services here in Naples, but the corneal tissue itself costs \$3,000, plus the cost of travel to Naples. This is a huge amount for a young man such as Sherman to come up with, and JOP's funds are limited for these one-person needs. If anyone would like to sponsor Sherman's left eye or another person's specialized surgical needs, we would welcome your donation.


