Contemplation - Easiest of All Forms of Prayer

Centering Prayer is the prayer that Jesus suggested in the Sermon on the Mount: "When you pray, enter your inner room, close the door and pray to your Father in secret and your Father who sees in secret will reward you." *Mt.* 6:6

One of the easiest of all forms of prayer is one that most people think is out of their league: contemplation. We usually associate contemplation with mystics, monks or saints. The truth is that contemplation was meant for all of us. We all do it, for example, when we look at a sleeping infant's face or an evening sunset or a sky full of stars at night. We are in awe and wonder. Centering prayer, which leads to contemplative prayer, is the same kind of experience except that we are captivated and in awe by the presence of God resting in the center of our being.

The Doctrine of the Divine Indwelling affirms that the Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) is present in us all the time. What is important about us is the divine presence in us. We do not earn God's love, we already have it, for God loves to be with us. Jesus said, "My Father will love you and we will come and make our home in you." *John 14.24*



Did you attend the St. Patrick's Day Mass? We had a full house for the annual Mass celebrated by our very own Fr. John. Following Mass, the St. Vincent De Paul Society once again hosted a reception serving pastries, juice and Irish coffee. This year the Black Velvet Band entertained for several hours to a standing room only crowd in the ballroom. If you have taken a glance at the collection

summary, you will see that the collection from St. Patrick's Day was \$15,377.00. This is an increase of nearly 80% over last year's collection of \$8,548.00. All of the funds from this collection will be used by our St. Vincent De Paul Society to



help those in our community that are in need. Thank you very much to everyone that gave so generously to help our brothers and sisters in need.

The website is now up and running in a limited capacity. You are able to view mass schedules, download bulletins and most importantly, read Scott's Corner. 


Two new additions to the prayer garden available for sale: We are going to offer a beautiful

Our Prayers Are Working

Following is a message from Shawn Carney, National Director of 40 Days for Life Campaign. He tells how our prayers are working.

"It is about that time of the campaign ... the time when the abortion facility workers are starting to get a little agitated at — well — YOUR prayers. It usually happens about 10 days into a 40 Days for Life campaign...

We've seen the power of those prayers convert the hearts of many frustrated abortion center workers."

Shawn highlights the events in Naples, FL in one of his daily updates:

It looks like the staff is getting nervous at Planned Parenthood in Naples, where faithful volunteers are praying outside during 40 Days for Life prayer vigils.

One of the area's TV stations received a complaint that the people on the sidewalk were "harassing" Planned Parenthood's clients. So they sent out a news crew.

The reporter interviewed the woman who said she was harassed.

The reporter also talked to a couple of 40 Days for Life vigil participants who were flabbergasted at the idea that peacefully praying on the sidewalk could ever be viewed as harassment.

I (Shawn) was in Naples just a few weeks ago and met these sweet women — and that's
