Altar Servers Have New Look With Navy Albs and Cinctures

Group of six ladies sewed all 29 vestments of various sizes

As everyone has noticed by now the altar servers are wearing new navy blue albs, the liturgical vestment they wear while serving the priests at Mass. Gone are the old white albs. It was Fr. John's idea to give the altar servers a newer look.

"The original albs were tearing and falling apart," Fr. John said. "There was a difference of opinion regarding the color. White is impractical for children. The navy is a non-liturgical color. It is a neutral color that doesn't speak to any particular liturgical season."

With an idea for the new robes and a navy blue sample in hand, Fr. John approached the sewing group to see if they would be able to make the robes.

"I like the different colors (of the cinctures) and how the colors mean something."

Nancy Cote, head of the sewing group, offered her help. She started by making one robe and submitting it to Fr. John for approval.

Once, she received Fr. John's approval, Nancy made a total of seven patterns of varying sizes from the sample robe.

"I purchased the required 90 yards of material from a variety of sources," Nancy said. She used as many discount coupons as she could to keep the cost down.

The ladies met weekly for four weeks to cut and assemble 29 robes. "It took about a month from purchasing material to completion. The total cost for each robe is approximately \$18.00," Nancy said. "Each robe took nearly eight hours to complete, from making patterns, cutting, sewing to pressing."

The navy blue albs are worn with a cincture, a cord that is belted at the waist. The colors of the cinctures are

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

While it is true that a very generous parishioner donated the Pascal Candle stand in memory of her late husband, it turns out that she also donated

the other two candle stands which I claimed to be the gifts of others. Sondra Sheehan and the Men's Club did indeed purchase candle stands for the altar, however those have yet to arrive. There are not two, but four candle stands that remain available for purchase at a cost of \$1,900.00 each. My apologies for the error. This will humbly serve as my retraction. If you would like to purchase one of these beautiful candle stands (see attached picture), please contact me at 566.1678.

After an electrical problem and a leak, the new fountain in our memorial garden is now fully operational and quite stunning. This is a beautiful addition to our serene memorial garden. We continue to make improvements to the landscaping in the garden. In the upcoming summer months, we will add a secondary hedge around the interior of the garden to provide additional privacy. Space still remains in the memorial garden if you are interested in making St. John the Evangelist your final resting place. The cost to purchase a plot in the garden is \$1,200.00. This is an all inclusive price which includes the opening, closing, urn, headstone and plaque. If you care to check pricing locally, you will find that our pricing is nearly 33% of what you would pay elsewhere. I can assure you that planning in advance is one of the greatest gifts you can give to your family of loved ones as they will not have to deal with this added stress after your death. 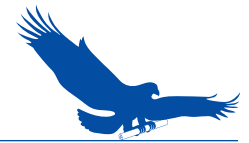

white, violet, red and green to coordinate with the vestments the priest wears, according to the liturgical season.

Brendan Budlong, director of youth ministry, taught the altar servers how to tie and knot the cincture.

Sacristan Lorna Woonsam said the new albs are a much needed improvement. "They are very nice looking and much easier to take care of. They are easy to wash and ready to wear. The old albs required a lot of ironing. The servers like them too. The new cinctures provide the finishing look."

"I really like the color of the new albs. If they get dirty, they won't show a lot of dirt like the old ones. The ropes (cinctures) look good and show what church season we are in. My Grannie helped make them!" altar server Mason Campbell said.

Michael Dina said, "They are soft, comfortable and easy to put on. However, they still make me feel hot, but

not as hot as the old ones."

For Maggie Gahan the new albs, "are not itchy like the old ones, and I like the color better. The belts (cinctures) are hard to tie, but I like the different colors (of the cinctures) and how the colors mean something."

The English term liturgy comes from the Greek word "leitourgia". Basically it means public service, or work of the people.

"The work that has been put into making these albs is

certainly an expression of the dedication of our parishioners' love of the liturgy. I am thankful for the countless hours that all of the women spent in this service to God," Fr. John said.

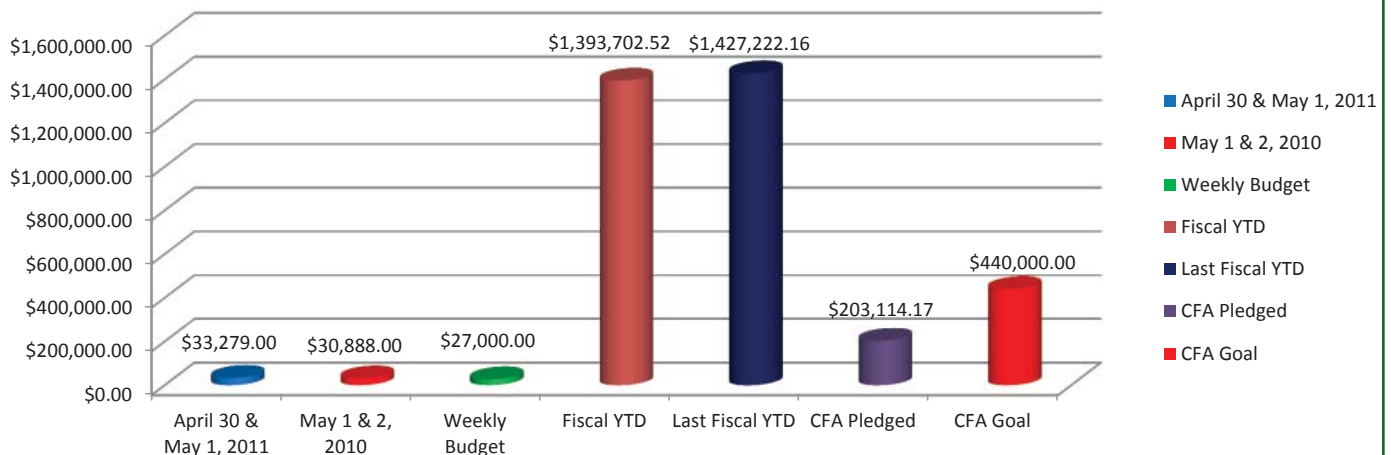
