Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

There are many ways to pray. Jesus suggested one way when He said in the Sermon on the Mount: “When you pray, go to your inner room, close the door and pray to your Father in secret and your Father who sees in secret will repay you.” (Matthew 6:6)

Jesus also tells us: “My Father will love you and we will come to you and make our dwelling with you.” (John 14:23)

Centering Prayer develops our relationship with Christ as one way of receiving the fullness of unconditional love pouring out of the depths of the Trinity into creation and into us.

The source of Centering Prayer is the Trinity; God’s life within us began in Baptism. The Doctrine of the Divine Indwelling is the most important of all the principles of the spiritual life. Only pure faith can access this divine presence within us.

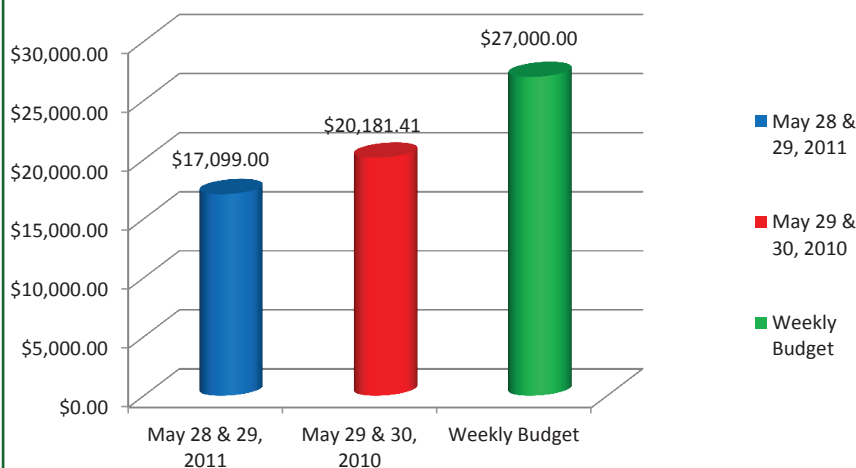
When we learn to enjoy and trust the presence of God within us, we will naturally turn to that presence in prayer.

Wear Red on Pentecost Sunday, June 12

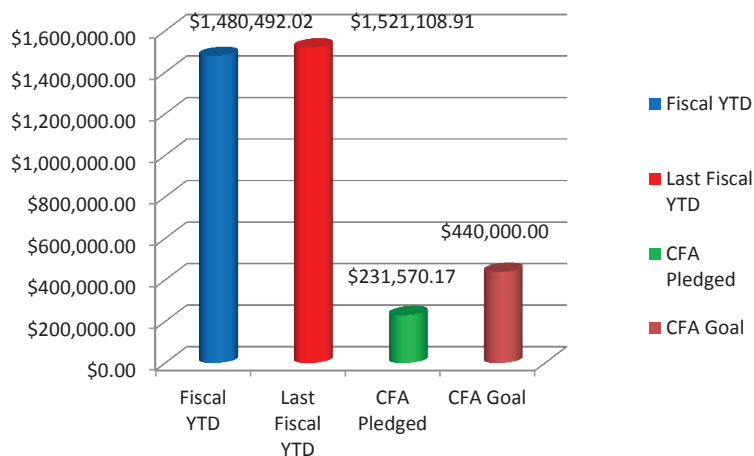
Pentecost Sunday, June 12 is the great feast that marks the birth of the Christian Church by the power of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost means “fiftieth day” and is celebrated fifty days after Easter. Red is the liturgical color for this day and it is encouraged that the faithful wear red to Church that day. Red is symbolic of the love of the Holy Spirit and recalls the tongues of flame in which the Holy Spirit descended on the first Pentecost. The color red also reminds us of the blood of the martyrs. These are the believers of every generation who by the power of the Holy Spirit hold firm to the true faith even at the cost of their lives.

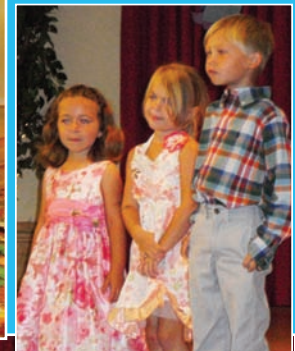

The Occasional Difference between Vigil & Day Mass Readings, or Why Did Ethel & Ron Hear Different Readings Than We Did That Weekend The celebration of Pentecost Sunday next weekend gives us the opportunity to explain why the Saturday Masses will have different readings than Sunday. After all, don't the Saturday vigil Masses "count" the same as Sunday? Well, yes they do. *But* if you've ever been to a different Christmas Mass than your "usual one", you'll have noticed the same thing: different readings at different Masses. *I.e.*, Christmas Eve (a vigil) readings are different from the Midnight Mass readings (actually considered Day, not Vigil!), both of which, in turn, are different from those on Christmas Day—one option is Mass at Dawn and the other During the Day.

On Pentecost, there are "just" two options, but why are there two when, say, for the Solemnity of the Ascension, which we celebrate today, there is only one option? On the highest of Holy Days—I believe there are a half-dozen—we mark the passage of time with different readings for different times. So, just as at Christmas—and Easter, for example—different things happened at different times, so also on Pentecost we *anticipate* the coming of the Spirit on Saturday, and *celebrate* His coming on Sunday. I'm only sorry both Masses omit one of my favorite verses in all of Scripture: Acts 2:15, in which St. Peter tells the crowd, "These people are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning!"

Perhaps you're someone who would like to sing, but can't join us for regular rehearsals because babysitting would be required, or it's poker night, or some other (understandable) reason. 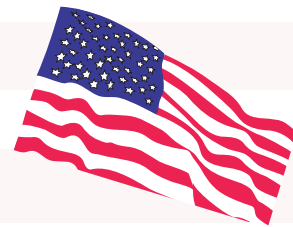
