

Jamaica Outreach Program JOP Christmas Tea

The poor in Jamaica will be blessed with net proceeds of over \$5,500, as a result of the annual JOP Christmas Tea, which was held Wednesday, December 7. Some 230 people attended the Christmas Tea, which included a champagne reception, vendors, entertainment and the traditional tea, sandwiches, scones and sweets.

"We got rave reviews about the yummy scones and the food served by Cappelli's Catering," said Jeanne Stamant, event organizer.

Eight gentlemen served the guests champagne upon arrival or sold raffle tickets, and Fr. John said the blessing.

There were 14 raffle prizes, all worth over \$100 each, in addition to door prizes. Vendors also sold jewelry, purses and silk flower designs.

"Kohls (the Naples store) sent five employees (on their own time) to volunteer and are expected to generate a grant to Jamaica Outreach of \$500 for children's education in Jamaica," said Jeanne.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Israel — God's Chosen People



Have you finished your Christmas shopping? As you read my column, at best only seven shopping days remain. I had a visit from a long time parishioner this past week asking if I knew of a family within our parish that had a child

who could use a new bicycle for Christmas. She had purchased bicycles for deserving children in Christmases past and wanted to do the same this year. I explained that there were several families that came to mind. After considerable thought, I further explained that there was a family in dire need but they had several children and one bicycle would most likely not suffice. I set up a meeting with the mother of the children and this benevolent parishioner. After talking for a short time, the parishioner offered to take the mother of these children on a shopping spree to purchase toys for her children for Christmas. I was very touched by this incredible act of kindness, so much so that I plan to emulate her efforts with my family during the Christmas season. This is yet another example of the amazing parishioners we have at St. John the Evangelist. While you are finishing up your last minute shopping, please do not forget those who may not be as fortunate this Christmas.

Another parishioner gave me the following story on the candy cane and its relevance to the Trinity. Although there is no historical evidence to support the claim, I feel it is very fitting at this time of year.

The Story of the Candy Maker who loved Jesus

There was a man who loved Jesus so much that he decided to do something special for Jesus' birthday. Since he was a candy maker, he decided to use his talents to make a special candy to honor Jesus; so he designed the first candy cane.

If the candy cane is held upright, it is in the shape of a shepherd's staff, which the shepherd uses as he watches over his sheep. Jesus is our shepherd. If the candy cane is turned upside-down it becomes the letter "J" for Jesus.

The scriptures tell us that by Jesus' stripes we are healed. Jesus was beaten and stripes were put upon his back when he was crucified in payment for our sins. So the candy cane was made with red and white stripes to represent the blood of Jesus which

washes away our sins and makes us pure and white as snow. One bold stripe represents our belief in one God who is Father to us all. The three fine stripes represent the Trinity: one God who has revealed Himself to us in three ways; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

There are a lot of candy canes in the stores today made with different colors, but they are not TRUE candy canes unless they are red and white and have one bold stripe and three fine stripes.

So when you see a candy cane this Christmas season, let it remind you of our Savior and the reason for His birth. For it is true, "with His stripes we are healed." – Author unknown

As an active member of the Stewardship Council since its inception, I truly understand the importance of becoming involved in parish life. Many, when hearing the term Stewardship, automatically think of the treasure component. While treasure is an integral component in the operation of the church, it is not the focus of







The O Antiphons and Advent

Tom Oram

Each of the seven verses of O Come, O Come Emmanuel is associated with a particular day of the Octave before Christmas Eve, the "Golden Nights", December 17th through the 23rd. The "O Antiphons", as they are known, each use a different title for the Messiah, foretold by the prophets Isaiah and Micah, of Jesus the Christ. The Church has used them at Vespers (Evening Prayer) for as many as fifteen hundred years or more.

They include O Sapientia (O Wisdom), O Adonai (O Lord), O Radix lesse (O Root of Jesse), O Clavis Davidicae (O Key of David), O Oriens (O Dayspring), O Rex gentium (O King of nations), and O Emmanuel (O God with us). In a fascinating result, the first letters of the titles, taken backwards, spell the phrase Ero cras, "Tomorrow, I come", completed only on Dec. 23 with the singing of the final antiphon. Thus: after we have called upon the Lord to come to us, he answers us, "ero cras!", referring to the arrival of the great Solemnity of the Nativity! The antiphon for today, Dec. 18th, O Adonai (Hebrew for "the Lord"), is below. It corresponds with verse 3 of the hymn we sing today (cf. Isaiah 11:4-5 & 33:22; Exodus 3:2 & 24:12).

Humble Servant Says "Yes" to God

t is the tradition of the Church to focus on the person of Mary for the last Sunday of Advent. Over the last 2000 years of Christian history, the Church never worshipped Mary but gave her a place of honor. Mary has a central place in our Church and hearts because she bore the Son of God in her womb and gave birth to the promise of salvation. Have you ever wondered what Mary was doing the day that the angel Gabriel came to her? Was she about her household chores or out taking a walk, pondering life? That we will never know! However, what we do know is that this young virgin, who seemed to be like any other girl of her day, received an extraordinary call and task to which she said yes. Mary's "Yes" was a response of total abandonment and trust. She did not know how she could conceive without engaging in intimacy. Asking this simple question and listening to the angel's answer gave her the confidence to truly believe that anything is possible for God: "May it be done to me according to your word." The day the angel left Mary was the

beginning of her journey, which would lead her deeper into the heart of God.




Mary of Nazareth is a model of discipleship for us. She is the greatest of the Saints. Mary is the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church. Mary totally surrenders to the will of God and is selfless. Mary is a constant reminder of what a true disciple is. Through her example she encourages us to abandon ourselves to what is nonessential and embrace God's will. Throughout the Scriptures, we see that Mary always contemplates the events taking place around her, holding them sacred to her heart. Likewise, we are asked to prayerfully consider where God is in our lives

and acknowledge the sacred gifts that he has set before us. In the midst of the suffering of Jesus who was put to death as a result of Roman capital punishment, she stands by her Son's executioners and supports him as the life drains from his veins. She returns to the upper room of fears to await his return. All the time she ponders these things in her heart, trusting in God's mercy.

As we approach Christmas Day, we reflect on our human experiences that make up our individual stories. For many there is a lot to celebrate — memories of the past and joyful events in family life over the last year. For others, sadness comes upon them because loved ones have passed away or because of a family or work problem. Regardless, in all of these human events, God is with us. Each of us stands on the holy ground of our experiences. No matter how joyful or sorrowful our lives are, each one of our lives is sacred. Like Mary, we are invited to ponder the great gifts that God puts in our path.


