



# Following Directive of Bishop Dewanes's HHS Letter

The HHS has issued a rule forcing nearly all private health plans to include coverage for all FDA-approved prescription contraceptive drugs and devices, as well as surgical sterilization. These are listed among "preventive services for women" that all health plans will have to cover without co-pays or other cost-sharing -- regardless of whether the insurer, the employer or other plan sponsor, or even the woman herself objects to such coverage.

The exemption provided for "religious employers" is so narrow that it fails to cover the vast majority of faith-based organizations, including Catholic hospitals, universities and service organizations that help millions every year. Ironically, not even Jesus and his disciples would have qualified.

During the public comment period last fall, the bishops' grassroots campaign alone generated over 57,000 comments to HHS opposing their mandate.

Now that the Administration has refused to recognize the Constitutional conscience rights of organizations and individuals who oppose the mandate, the bishops are now urging Catholics and others of good will to fight this unprecedented attack on conscience rights and religious liberty.

#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.







Everyone was amazed at the quality of the picture, and the fact that there was not a bad seat in the house was an added bonus. Attached is a picture; although

dark, you get the idea. Cappelli's catered the event for the first time and did an excellent job. Our guests gorged themselves and there was plenty of food remaining until the end. If you did not join us, talk to someone who did, and I guarantee that you will buy a ticket next year. Many thanks to those who gave rave reviews of our 14th Annual Super Bowl Party. The proceeds from the event will be used for Youth Ministry.

Included on the opposite page is a consolidated statement of

receipts and disbursements for the first six months of our fiscal year. I have also included a comparison to the same period in 2010/2011. Items that may be of particular interest to you are:

- Offertory collection is up nearly 4% over last year.
- 2. Receipts from all sources are up 5.25% over last year.
- 3. Salary expense has been reduced by 3.5%.
- 4. Repairs and maintenance includes several large projects including the re-sealing and re-striping of the parking lot and complete renovation of the kitchen.
- 5. Subsidies to parishes include the final payoff for the convent in Clewiston.
- 6. The Early Learning and Childcare Center closed in June of 2011.

As you know, we generally operate "in the red" seven out of twelve months. Five of those seven months (July – November) are recognized in this financial statement resulting in a net loss of \$138,752.00. With a strong showing through the remainder of the fiscal year (July1-June 30), we will optimistically finish "in the black." We thank you for your continued financial support to allow us to remain solvent.

Painting of the doors in the church has begun and will continue until completed. We have made the decision to paint all of the church doors (interior and exterior) due to extremely competitive pricing. We are confident that you will appreciate the change.

After a slight delay, you will now notice that we have sprayed Roundup on much of the grass on the east side of the church in

order to kill any weeds or nuisance grass that may be lying in wait to re-emerge. Once we have eradicated all of the problem grasses we will replant with new Floratam St. Augustine sod. Please accept our apologies for the poor aesthetic appearance over the next several weeks

Due to popular demand, we have decided to bring back the Reverse Raffle. The raffle will take place on Saturday, March 31 in the ballroom of the Parish Life Center. Tickets will be \$100.00 each and includes admission for two, dinner, entertainment, open bar and the chance to win \$10,000.00. We will sell ONLY 300 tickets. The proceeds from the Reverse Raffle will be used for the Catholic Faith Appeal. This is a very fun event and I urge you to buy a ticket. For \$100, this is an amazing deal. For those unfamiliar with a reverse raffle, I will include the details in next week's bulletin.

Also due to popular demand, we have begun a new bench campaign for those who missed out last year. The beautiful granite benches are currently located in the memorial garden,

prayer garden and in front of church. They are engraved with a silver lithograph and have been very well received. We are going to offer 15 more benches for sale at the cost of \$3,000.00 each. Three will be located in the memorial garden, one in the prayer garden and the remainder will be in the courtyard between the church and the PLC. If you are interested in honoring or memorializing a loved one, please contact me at your earliest convenience to reserve a location

Do you have trouble hearing during
Mass? If so, we have ordered 10 new hearing devices to assist
you. The devices may be checked out during Mass in the sacristy.

The second excursion to the Horse Races at Gulfstream Park will take place on February 24. Please see this bulletin for further details on a great day trip.

As you can see from the collection summary, we have received our 2012 Catholic Faith Appeal Goal. Our new goal is \$443,000, which is an increase of \$3,000.00 over last year. Although our assessment could have been much higher, we received substantial credits (26%) for the payment of our remaining debt on the convent in Clewiston. We also received credit for our contributions to Catholic Schools for subsidy at the rate of 30%. Due to your generosity, we are already at 12% of our goal before the appeal has begun. Please prayerfully consider making a pledge for the CFA next weekend as we officially kickoff the 2012 appeal. Thank you so much for your consideration.





# Reach out and touch the leper clean

s we examine the Sacred Scriptures of today's liturgy, we discover a startling contrast. Both the first reading from the Book of Leviticus and the gospel reading from Mark deal with the disease of leprosy. Leprosy was a deadly disease in Jesus' day. The disease attacks the nerves and skin, which leads to a loss of feeling. In some cases the extremities of the body waste away. Leprosy is extremely contagious. During Jesus' time people who fell prey to leprosy would die from this terrible affliction. Indeed a leper at the time of Jesus was condemned to a life of loneliness, forced solitude and separation from their family unit. In

the Book of Leviticus the leprous were asked to humiliate themselves, neglecting their appearance and shouting out, "Unclean, unclean!" This reading tells us the leper would be cast aside by the priest who makes the declaration that the person is unclean.

It is not surprising the leper in today's gospel yearned to be healed. What is surprising about this encounter is that the leper had the courage to break the prescribed laws to ask Jesus' healing. Jesus' response also goes against the prescribed law. If a Jew touched a leper, it was said to make him unclean as well as putting him at risk of catching the disease. Jesus' mercy transcends the observance of the law, the fear of contracting the disease and risk of social rejection. The compassionate way in which Jesus reaches out and touches the leper shows the world that God wants to bring healing and restoration. When the leper is made clean, he is restored to a rightful place in society and is returned to his family and community of faith. He is told to continue with prescriptions of the law of Moses in which he presents himself to the priest as one cleansed in order to be returned to his community. The healed man is also told to keep quiet about this, but his sheer excitement and healing urges him to tell everyone. The miracle worked in the cleansed man's life, leads others to seek out the presence of Jesus in order that they be healed.

The Sacred Scriptures remind us that we all belong to God. The heavenly Father does not want us to be separate or discriminated against. Neither does God want us to suffer. Every time someone is healed in the gospel, it is a statement of God's intention to heal, restore, forgive and make whole the dignity of the human person. Leprosy exists today in developing countries and is kept under control with the use of drugs. However, there are things that create "an emerging leprous reality". A.I.D.S. has appeared as

the new pandemic destroying many lives in poorer countries. All across the continent of Africa countless people contract HIV and continue to infect others by having sex. While it is possible for people to live a long life when they become positive with the help of medication, there are few resources provided and thousands upon thousands continue to die from other infections brought on by a weakened immune system. The stigma of living with this reality brings isolation to many of our African brothers and sisters.

As we examine the state of society today, we encounter "leprous" attitudes towards individuals and certain groups. Discrimination of all kinds adds to this emerging severance of human relationships. The poor are neglected and looked down upon. The immigrant finds it increasingly difficult to find a place to call a home. People of faith are increasingly attacked by structural sin, which allows the liberal minority to legislate and discriminate against them. People are no longer free to express their faith in public forums. Indeed, many are penalized for taking part in such religious practices. Actions such as President Obama's Administration to force religious institutions to provide provisions in healthcare that go against their religious beliefs lead to an increasing isolation as our religious

freedom and liberty are slowly being eroded and taken away from us. As Catholic Christians, we are called to reach beyond ourselves and touch the painful realities of the world. The dignity of the human person can be made sacred by the choices that we make today as we seek religious freedom and to help people find their place of belonging in the midst of a secular world.

## Prayer

We pray: Heavenly Father, inspire us to bring your healing and dignity to those who feel they do not belong. Give us the courage to face the unknown and fears that keep us from loving others. Let your love be our love, your mind our mind, your heart our heart. May our lives become the song of the Spirit. Amen

### Why do we genuflect in church?

In medieval Europe, one demonstrated respect for a king or noble by going down on one knee. Building on that tradition, we bend on the right knee to show reverence for the Lord in the Eucharist when it is on the altar, in the tabernacle, or in the monstrance. (We also genuflect before the cross from Good Friday through the Easter vigil.)

Note: While the right knee is reserved for Jesus, we genuflect on the left knee before the pope, cardinals, or bishops.

A few K of C members along with other adult and youth runners in unity with pro-life principles are running to help our local life-affirming organizations that protect the unborn through crisis pregnancy centers, provide maternity and post-birth homes and provide shelters for battered and abused women, children and senior citizens.

Last year we ran from Marco Island to Ocala (272 miles) and raised \$8,000. Funds raised in Collier & Lee Co were distributed to Collier Pregnancy Centers, Our Mother's Home, Providence House and Sunlight Home through Florida K of C Charities, Inc / Helping Life Fund — a 501 (c) (3) IRS certified, non-profit organization dedicated to help life-affirming service providers.



The financial needs of these organizations to fulfill their missions are huge. In addition the Immokalee Pregnancy Center needs to purchase an ultrasound to counter the abortion option offered by Planned Parenthood. The Florida K of C "Run for Life" with your act of charity as sponsors of our runners will help these organizations.

This year our goal is 360 miles from Marco Island to St. Augustine. Beginning February 18th we plan to cover 40 miles per day for the next 9 days. You can sponsor our efforts by making a donation while we run the miles; examples at  $10\phi$  per mile = \$36.00,  $20\phi$  = \$72.00 or any small / large amount that you care to donate.
