Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.


Masses for Victims of Abuse

We will begin to collect **NEW** clothing for infants, children and teenagers right away. The children are in need of everyday play clothes, as well as fancier clothing to wear to church on Sundays. For Girls: Sun dresses, dress tops, t-shirts, shorts, skirts, socks, shoes and hair accessories.

Spotlight on Stewardship:

Did you know?

Last year, 2011, we were fortunate to average approximately \$18,000 on each of the 4 second collections for our sister parish, St. Pius X. One of those collections covered the \$17,800 cost of providing needed prescription medications for the free medical dispensary at the parish clinic. The dispensary supplies medications to indigent patients who depend on it for conditions like high blood pressure, diabetes and asthma. This year we expect to add free basic laboratory testing at the medical clinic for those who need it and can't afford it.

Please be as generous as you can to the St. Pius X second collections so we can add this benefit to the medical clinic and continue sending medicines as well to its dispensary.

the lattice is also exploding with countless white flowers. Inside the garden, many other shrubs are displaying vivid color. From the Indian Hawthorne to the Bougainvillea, our prayer garden looks a lot like a botanical garden. This is basically a side bet or a hedge. You have the chance of winning \$10,000.00, or possibly splitting the grand prize with some of your fellow parishioners. Every 25th ticket drawn (including the 1st ticket) will win \$100 so twelve lucky parishioners will enjoy a night "on the house." As you read my column, we are less than two weeks out from the


to Mass. When emergency vehicles need to access our parking lot to attend to a sick parishioner, these illegally parked vehicles cause a major problem. After we receive confirmation that you have completed the FACTS survey, we will then use our internal criteria to determine whether you are eligible to receive a subsidy from St. John the Evangelist.

Tuition Subsidy Criteria

In order for your child to be eligible for a tuition subsidy at either St. Ann, St. Elizabeth Seton or St. John Neumann, the following criteria must be met.

- The family **must** have been parishioners at St. John the Evangelist for 6 months prior to the initial request.
- The family must regularly attend Mass. Regularly attending Mass is defined as weekly attendance
- The family **must** be contributing on a regular basis. The only way to accurately monitor attendance and donations is by use of weekly envelopes. If you do not place your envelope in the collection basket, then there is absolutely no record of your attendance or contribution.

We agree with the importance of your desire to have your child receive Catholic education and sound formation in the faith. Accordingly, the first responsibility of any Catholic parent is to attend Mass with their family regularly at St. John the Evangelist.

At St. John the Evangelist, we strive to be good stewards of the treasure that our parishioners share with us. Granting subsidies to families who meet the above criteria is the best way for us to be responsible stewards.

oday's gospel speaks to the heart of the economy of salvation. Jesus' comment to Nicodemus is one of the most wellknown phrases of the gospel and has been preached countless times. God's initiative for humanity is clear: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." God gives us the blueprint for the way that we


are to sacrifice and give. In essence, today's gospel reminds us of God's stewardship. He makes the ultimate sacrifice by sending us his only Son to be the vehicle through which we are granted salvation. The sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross and the Resurrection offer us a covenant that can never be broken. Through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) God enters into a covenant relationship with us, and we with God. Christ becomes the bridegroom and we, the Church, become his bride. In this covenant a pledge of love is given from now and into eternity. This covenant is given through the Trinity. The Trinity represents God's giving of himself completely to us through salvation history. The Trinity is a model for us to imitate. When we think of how God's gift to the world brought the blessing of salvation, we can also think of how our sacrifices and the sharing of our gifts can be a blessing to others. Every time we give in the name of God, we participate in his divine nature of the Holy Trinity. The Father gifts us with the Son, the Son bestows the Spirit, and the Spirit encourages us to listen to the gospel and give worship to the Father. The three persons of the Blessed Trinity are teaching us how it is possible to return the

gift. This is ultimately about right relationship.

When we look at the experience of Jesus in the gospels, we constantly encounter the generosity of God. Every time Jesus heals another or exorcises evil, God's gift is outpoured. When Jesus teaches his disciples about God's mercy and forgiveness, we are given an unfathomable gift. Many times we are faced with the darkness

of sin and uncertainty, but God is always present, ready to forgive. When Jesus seeks solitude, his heart is moved with pity at the sight of those who are crying out to him in their need. He is generous in his mercy in the way he abandons his need for solace to provide for God's people.

Sacred Scriptures shed their light on our human condition, offering us a way out of the darkness of sin. The way of Christ invites us to embrace the life beyond death and the light beyond the darkness. The gospel message always gives hope and challenges the things in our lives that block us from fully experiencing God. Jesus teaches us that an important part of his message focuses on the poor and brokenhearted. Elsewhere, he reminds us if we neglect the needy, we neglect him. As Christians we belong to the mystical Body of Christ. Christ dwells in a community that belongs to him. Our challenge is to recognize that he is always present in the gift of the other. This is why we are called to be one in spirit and truth. Each of us is called to sacrifice and share our gifts with others so that Christ can be experienced through us. We can be truly blessed when we enter into relationship with others in this way.



Prayer

We pray: Even in our darkness, O Lord, you are near. Your light of truth shows us the way. Teach us to give the way that you gave to the world. Let us see that every time we give, we will receive. Help us to move beyond self-interest and embrace others so that in turn we may experience the gift of your blessing. When we come to our journey's end, may we have accomplished your dream in us and receive your eternal blessing. Amen.


Contemporary Wisdom


