Coleman, offers a compassionate
and empathic approach to personal
prayer. Each page is a meditation

on the challenges faced by one person: a soldier being fitted for a prosthesis, someone struggling with an addiction or a child starting chemotherapy. The meditation ends with a request for a prayer for that person from your heart, in your own words. At the core of *Special Intentions* is a simple concept – say one prayer, once a day for someone other than yourself.

Joan D. Lynch's novel, *Women of the Passion*, opens with the Crucifixion and continues through the persecution of the women and men who followed Jesus. The Chief Priests, Herod and Saul wanted to stamp out these followers. The women who were also the early leaders of the church were in just as



much danger as the men. Experience what Jesus' Mother, Mary Magdalene, Susanna and Joanna were thinking, doing and feeling during these historic days in Jerusalem.

Adventures of Pudgie & Cuddie, by Ernest Woonsam, is the story of two adolescent porcupines who decide to explore the world around their home when they should be sleeping during the day. A children's book, it tells about the various animals that they encounter on their journey and the reactions that they receive.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.



s we approach Holy Week, Sacred

with loving servitude brings along costly


The disciples did not fully appreciate the wisdom that Jesus imparted to them until they endured the folly of the cross. Jesus became the grain of the eternal for them and for us. Even as He went forth to celebrate the paschal feast and establish the new covenant in his blood, the violence of his departure must have been overbearing for those who had left everything to follow him. Through his death, he is brought to resurrection. The fruits of his sacrifice lead all of the world to salvation. Jesus' death opens wide the gate to eternal life for all of humanity.

The Church is great in her wisdom. Every year we are reminded of the events that gave us new life in Jesus Christ. Our scriptures

lead us into the reality of sacrifice. Sacred Scripture reminds us of the vast emotions present in Jesus and the disciples. These were real events with real people. God had become flesh to redeem the human condition. The cross takes the burden of sin. As Jesus is raised high on Calvary, so too is the hope that leads us beyond the torment and suffering of the cross and to the glory of the resurrection.



As we complete our Lenten journey, we are invited to meander the byways of salvation and contemplate how salvation is possible for us. This is a sacred time to reflect on the new covenant that inscribes upon our hearts the promise of life eternal. We are called to the same servitude to which Jesus gave witness. The cross of discipleship needs to be embraced every day in order for the Father's will to be done. The needs around us in our community, country and the world are most certainly the fertile ground of God's mercy waiting to unfold. We are seed — we are asked to die to self in order that others come to know the bounty of God working through us. Our dying to self ultimately leads us to others. Our sacrifices make the Word given to us in Sacred Scripture. As Catholics, we are called to evangelize the world through the way in which we lead all lives and respond generously to the wisdom of the gospel. The Word of God can come to life through our selfless acts of love.


Prayer

John 12:20-33

Obedience yields new life

Jesus tried to warn his disciples about his death and prepare them for it. A grain of wheat dies in order to produce new life, and Jesus had to die to pay for our sins and bring us new life. With his resurrection, he proved he has eternal life and can offer it to us.

Then, he said that we must "hate" our lives and be willing to lose them so we can live. He meant that we have to be ready to lay aside our attachment to goods, worldly security, and pleasure to serve God freely. Serving God brings eternal life. Jesus knew that his crucifixion lay ahead and being human, he dreaded it. He also knew that God sent him into the world to die for our sins in our place. So, Jesus said "no" to his human desires in order to obey his Father.

Although we will never have to face such a difficult task, we are still called to obedience. Whatever the father asks we should be willing to do and bring glory to his name.



Why do Catholics go to Confession?

Disobeying God damages our friendship with him, so we need his forgiveness to heal it. That's why Jesus initiated the Sacrament of Reconciliation (also called "Confession"). "Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:19). This brings us back to God.

In Confession, we admit what we did, say that we're sorry, and resolve never to do it again. Penance helps us make up for it. When the priest conveys Christ's forgiveness to us, our friendship is restored.


A few minutes later, Ms Gosling, the school principal, arrived to tell everyone that this shipment of school supplies had been sent to them from the generous parishioners of St. John the Evangelist church, and the friends of the Jamaica Outreach Program. With that announcement there was a loud cheer and applause that lasted for several minutes, followed by complete silence as the children waited in hopeful anticipation for the first box to be open. When all the boxes were open there was a virtual treasure trove of new educational supplies, toys, games, puzzles, and art and craft materials to help develop their Fine and Gross motor skills and establish the foundations for their Readiness for entry into Elementary School.

We believe without a doubt, that these donations will go a long way in preparing these children for their schooling in the future, as well as, eventually making a strong impact, breaking the cycle of poverty that has existed in this community for generations.


