Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

A few weeks ago I mentioned our "somewhat" new vendor for online credit card and bank draft contributions. We had previously used a vendor by the name of "Blue Pay" which was supposed to sync with our internal LOGOS database. Unfortunately, the payment information never correctly synced with our database, and as a

result, we made the decision to switch to "Pledge Connect" used by the Diocese of Venice. In April of this year on two separate occasions, I asked those still using Blue Pay to please discontinue doing so and switch over to Pledge Connect. Many of you did so, however, a few did not see my comments. As of last week, the Blue Pay site is completely shut down and any recurring transactions have been discontinued. I kindly ask those of you who were using Blue Pay to please register on our website with Pledge Connect. This is a very secure process and will ensure that your gifts are being correctly posted internally as they are recorded.

I am very proud to say that St. John the Evangelist is

becoming technologically advanced. Most of you have visited our website for one reason or another. Some of you may also have visited our website from your smart phone to obtain pertinent information. Accessing a website via a smart phone can be daunting as the information which appears on your screen can be very difficult to read because it is intended to be viewed from a much larger screen. We have developed a mobile application for our website which allows parishioners to view our site in a much more user friendly format. In addition, beginning this week you will see a "QR Code" on the front of our bulletin. Many of you may be asking yourselves...what exactly is a QR Code? For our tech savvy parishioners, no further information is needed. Upon seeing our QR Code, I am sure that many of you noticed these same codes on anything and everything from literature to consumer products. Basically, our QR Code is a link to our website. In order to use the code, you must first download a QR scanner application (app) to your smart phone. For Iphone users this may be done free of charge via the app store. For those on the Droid platform, you may visit your marketplace to obtain the free application. Once the app is downloaded, you simply click on the "QR Code scanner" icon. A screen similar to your camera will appear. Position the phone over the QR Code on our bulletin and you will automatically be redirected to our mobile website once the scan is complete. Upon arriving at our mobile website for the first time, you will

have the option of placing our "St. John the Evangelist" app on your smart phone. I strongly suggest choosing this option as for future visits to our site, you will only have to click the app on your smart phone's home screen. If you do not want to download the QR Code scanner app, you may also type our website address www.saintjohntheevangelist. com into your smart phone's browser. Our mobile site can automatically determine whether you are using a smart phone to access our website and you will be redirected to the mobile site. We are still experimenting with which buttons are of most interest to our parishioners on the mobile site. If there is something that you would like to see that is currently not an option, please contact me and I do my best to make changes that will incorporate your wishes. For those willing, I encourage you to download the OR Code scanner app. Everyday, there are more and more vendors using this valuable tool to make it easier for you to access their website. It is actually a lot of fun and no more difficult than taking a picture with your smart phone.

On April 14, a JOP committee of sorters and packers met for perhaps the last time to pack a 40 foot container bound for our sister parish in Jamaica. Over 1,000 cartons



of goods donated by St. John the Evangelist parishioners were shipped. An additional 231 cartons donated by the good people of Blessed Pope John XXIII parish were placed on board as well. It was a sight to behold as the crowd of over 70 volunteers scrambled like a bunch of "young guns" to get the job done. Regretfully, the JOP Board of Directors has suspended this



The Tangibility of Resurrection (Luke 24:35-48)

everal years ago, there was a heated discussion among the Anglican communion about the bodily resurrection of Jesus. There were some who suggested that Jesus rose from the dead spiritually not physically, while most argued in the traditional and orthodox teaching of bodily resurrection. Sacred Scripture authenticates the reality of bodily resurrection. In today's gospel, taken from Luke, the disciples think that they are encountering a ghost when they see Jesus. Christ himself points out that this is not the case. He reminds his followers that ghosts do not have

flesh and bone. To prove the point, Jesus asks for something to eat and eats it in front of them.

Today's gospel account is teaching us that resurrection is tangible. The resurrection is not a mere spiritual notion. Resurrection is real and transformative – it takes death and transforms it for all eternity. Jesus fulfills what was said of him in the Scriptures and opens the hearts of his post-resurrection listeners to the message of life. The risen Christ predicts and gives witness to what he had said about dying and rising on the third day. Jesus now reminds us that his mission of repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, has already begun in Jerusalem and must now be proclaimed to the ends of the earth. As Peter reminded the people, "The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead; of this we are witnesses....Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away." He is obviously reminding us that we must respond to the gift of the resurrection by taking action and changing our hearts because of this mystery revealed.

Jesus did not rise again just to prove that what he said would come to pass. The resurrection of Jesus is the crowning of his life that paves our way to salvation. Jesus reveals the resurrection so that we may continue his redemptive work here on earth. What is that redemptive work? It is a journey into transformation, using Jesus as the guide and the shepherd in this transforming work in progress. The message of the gospel is clearly given credence in Jesus rising from the dead. His message for repentance continues as the Church journeys through time. The call to conversion still remains. The wisdom and healing of Christ still needs to be proclaimed, so that all may know the saving power of Jesus Christ in their lives. The resurrection is tangible for us in the way that we encounter the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is at the altar that we take, bless and break the body of Christ, for all who gather in His name. At the moment of Holy Communion, we tangibly accept the gift of Christ who continues to offer us his body and blood. The tangibility of the resurrected Christ is discovered among the poor, the sinner, the outcast and the forgotten, in the vast wastelands of humanity that await transformation and attention. Once we respond to the need, the resurrected Christ is plainly seen in the Mystical Body of Christ - that is, in each one of us responding to the needs of the world.

Prayer

We pray: Help us to see clearly the vision that you have set before us. May we touch the reality of the resurrection among those we reach out to in love. Let our minds and hearts be open to signs of your resurrection among us. Increase our strength to do your will, bringing others to your wisdom and to the gift of repentance. We ask this through you, the Christ, the Risen Lord. Amen. Reflecting on the Sunday Readings with Fr. John J. Ludden, Pastor

Wisdom of the Fathers

"Easter is a time of joy — a joy not confined to this period of the liturgical year, but to be found really and fully in the Christian's heart. For Christ is alive. He is not someone who has gone, someone who existed for a time and then passed on, leaving us a wonderful example and a great memory.

No, Christ is alive. Jesus is the Emmanuel: God with us. His resurrection shows us that God does not abandon his own. He promised he would not: "Can a woman forget her baby that is still unweaned, pity no longer the son she bore in her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will not forget you." And he has kept his promise. His delight is still to be with the sons of men.

Christ is alive in his Church. "I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Counsellor will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you." That was what God planned: Jesus, dying on the cross, gave us the Spirit of truth and life. Christ stays in his Church, its sacraments, its liturgy, its preaching — in all that it does.

In a special way Christ stays with us in the daily offering of the



holy Eucharist. That is why the Mass is the center and source of Christian life. In each and every Mass the complete Christ, head and body, is present. *Per Ipsum et cum Ipso et in Ipso*. For Christ is the way; he is the mediator; in him we find everything. Outside of him our life is empty."



Make family prayer fun

The more children enjoy praying, the more likely they are to adopt the habit in adulthood, so try using these different or enjoyable ways to pray.

Stop, drop, and PRAY! Prayer isn't just for mealtime or bedtime. Whenever someone yells "Stop, drop, and PRAY!", all hurry to the same spot to kneel together in brief prayer led by whomever made the call. It can be for any reason – praise, thanksgiving, petition or contrition.

Pass-it-on prayer. Use a crucifix small enough to fit in a child's hand and sit in a circle. Choose one person to start the prayer and hand her the crucifix to hold. She starts a prayer out loud and passes the crucifix to someone else to continue the prayer. The crucifix is passed to each person in the circle until everyone has a chance to pray out loud.

Pick-a-person prayer. Open a newspaper or turn on the television. Choose the first person you see in a news story as the object of your family prayer that night.
