Adult Choir Celebrates Successful Season

The Adult Choir of St. John the Evangelist recently marked the end of another season of exceptional liturgical music with a beach party last weekend. This weekend marks the last time the choir will sing at both the 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. Mass; beginning next week, the choir, as well as the parish, will be on its summer schedule. During the summer schedule, we will alternate singing at the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses for the next six weeks and again in August. In between we will take a well-earned vacation!

It has been a memorable year for a number of reasons — especially because of the new Yamaha baby grand piano, acquired just a month ago after an under-the-radar fundraising campaign. The sonic difference is palpable — and not

the only different sounds you've been hearing. This year the choir has sung much more *a cappella* music — which is to say, unaccompanied — voices alone. This style of music is of course far more difficult, but also rewarding. At the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday, all the music was sung *a cappella*, according to the ancient custom of the Church.

The term *a cappella* literally means “from the chapel”, as in the Sistine Chapel in the Vatican in Rome. And this fact brings us to the most exciting development

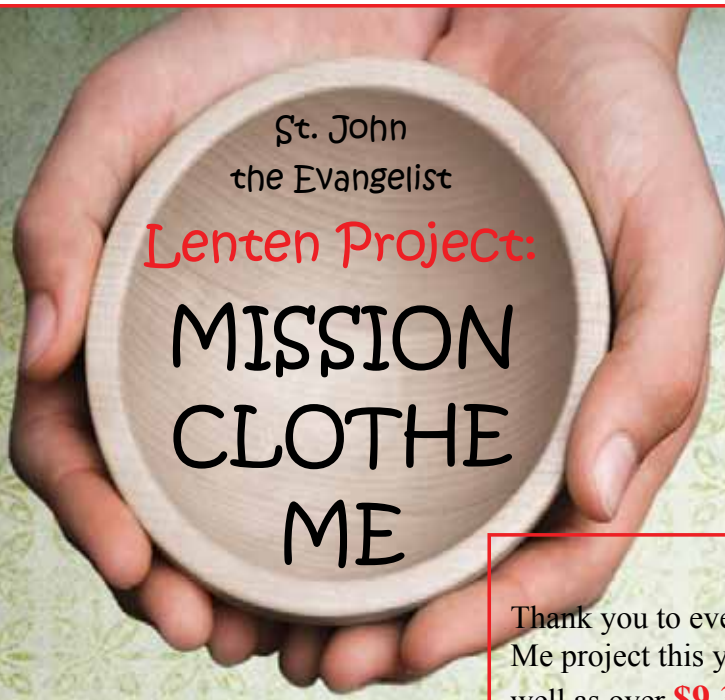

Sacrament of Baptism

Spotlight on Stewardship: Jamaica Outreach Program

Report on St. Pius X Medical Clinic

The St. Pius X Catholic Church Clinic is situated at 10 Olympic Way Kingston 11, Jamaica, W.I., an inner city area of Kingston Metropolitan Region. The clinic is open five days per week; Mondays – Thursdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The clinic sees an average of 20 to 30 patients daily from all the disciplines of medicine, from prenatal to geriatric. Most of our patients have chronic illnesses, like diabetes, hypertension and heart disease; but on any one day, there is a constellation of symptoms. In fact, a few months ago a patient came in for her routine follow-up visit for hypertension and a lesion was seen on her heel. Melanoma (malignant) was diagnosed and she was sent immediately to the University Hospital where she had a wide resection of the lesion. She has since been doing well. Over 90 percent of our patients need medications that they can ill afford. However, they are encouraged to sign onto the government National Health Fund and Jamaica Drug for the Elderly Program, which gives participating patients discounts at participating pharmacies.

We diagnose and treat new cases of diabetes, hypertension, STDs, tonsillitis, otitis media, etc. in our clinic every week. In addition, we treat acute asthmatic attack in our clinic on a weekly basis. A lot of the patients that we see at St. Pius are usually ones that are turned away from the government clinics. There are two government clinics nearby (one about a quarter mile and another about three quarters of a mile from St Pius), but they have specific days for certain things; for example there are specific days for antenatal and child clinic. And these clinics do not suture or do other minor operative procedure. When pap smears are done at these clinics the reports are not had most times for more than twelve months. Additionally, because we also operate in the late evening, when all the government clinics are closed, after work emergencies are dealt with here at St Pius X without the patients wasting time at the public hospitals.

Patients who are seen at our clinic cannot get their

prescriptions at the government pharmacies. However, those who have chronic health problems and are registered with the National Health Fund can get a discount at the participating pharmacies. Often times we see patients at our clinic who were seen at the government hospital or clinic with a prescription that they cannot get at the government pharmacies and they cannot afford to purchase. Whenever we can help, and have the medicines in our free dispensary, we provide the needed medicines.

The National Health Fund only covers chronic illnesses (of any age group); asthma, diabetes, hypertension, BPH, prostate cancer, vascular problem, heart disease, breast cancer, rheumatic fever, major depression, high cholesterol, psychosis, epilepsy and glaucoma. Of course, most of these chronic illnesses occur in adults.

We are grateful for the help in stocking the free medical dispensary at St. Pius X.

The medical clinic at St. Pius X was in operation before the JOP became involved with the parish. It is a private clinic that serves the working poor of the parish and its environs. Our involvement with the medical clinic centers mainly on providing medicines for its dispensary. Prescription medicines were very, very scarce before our arrival at St. Pius, but now through our efforts and the generosity of our supporters at St. John the Evangelist, meds are available at no cost to the clinic's patients. In recent times, monies from our second collections are routinely used to finance the meds we donate. Dr. Martin is a caring and conscientious doctor who provides care to a deserving people.

J. Michael Bone, Ph.D.

Dr. Bone, from Winter Haven, FL, is widely respected as an international expert on PAS- Parental Alienation Syndrome. He worked with Dr. Richard Gardner on PAS evaluations as an invited member of the Parental Alienation Research Foundation in Washington, D.C. He has authored numerous research articles for journals, the Florida Bar, and regularly serves as an expert witness and consultant for PAS. He presents at many international conferences, including the Canadian Symposium on PAS, and is an authors group member of the task force of the PAS committee on DSM-V and ICD.

“Dr. Bone is an experienced consultant for cases involving Parental Alienation and has spent over 25 years working with high conflict divorce as a therapist, expert witness, mediator, evaluator and consultant, both nationally and internationally.”

Dr. Bone states, “PA and PAS are two of the most destructive and devastating phenomenon that can affect parents, family, friends and especially children. Cases involving these issues are perhaps the most vexing and difficult that exist in Family Court. They require careful and painstaking preparation, analysis of voluminous documentation, preparation of experts and collateral witnesses. They can be difficult to demonstrate in court and include arduous steps that exceed the normal representation of a Family Law case without parental alienation. These cases exploit and wear down the system and do so in the service of the alienation.”

This past Tuesday afternoon I sent out the first of what we hope will be many informative emails to our parish family using our new platform. The email subject line was entitled “inaugural email.” If you did not receive this email then we either do not have your email address or you gave us

your email address at the ministry fair back in January. I inadvertently sent the email before I had added the ministry fair registrants to the group. Yours will be sent out at a later date. If you would like to receive email from the parish, I strongly urge you to submit your email address to me at your earliest convenience. I am very excited about the possibilities with our new email tool. In addition to regular email, we have the option of sending completely interactive newsletters which will give you the option of clicking on numerous links which will connect to whatever we feel appropriate. Until now, our only true form of communication with you has been the bulletin or announcements from the altar.

The inaugural email was sent to 1,174 parish families. We have well over 3,000 registered families. As of Wednesday morning, 642 of these emails had been opened. This is an open rate of over 57% which is incredible. Of these emails 58 bounced back, 8 recipients opted out and only 2 were marked as spam. In addition, over 100 of our families personally responded with their thoughts about the new email system. There was not one

negative response. Everyone seems to be thrilled with the new form of communication. The greatest part of this program thus far has been the personal responses I received from you. In a parish as large as St. John the Evangelist, there are always those who feel disconnected from the mainstream. It is possible that our new email platform could also help in this area.

Did you experiment with the QR code on the front of the bulletin last week? I know that some of you did as I received a few calls and emails from those who were

unable to figure it out. If you had problems or simply don't understand, please give me a call and I will walk you through the process. If you are on site, feel free to stop by and I will give you a quick tutorial. We are still working to update our mobile site to include information that you feel is relevant. This will be an ongoing process.

We have sold seven of the remaining 15 benches on our campus with one more pending. If you are interested in purchasing a bench to honor or memorialize a loved one, please contact me at 566-1678. The cost for a bench is \$3,000.00. If you are unable to pay the entire amount up front, I will work with you on terms.

I received a call this week from a parishioner of eight years who was inquiring about the Memorial Garden. Interestingly, he claimed to be unaware of the existence of the Memorial Garden until last month. Although I find this amazing, there are many other parishioners that fit into this same category. I would like to take this opportunity to ask our parishioners (newcomers or long timers) to take a walk through the Memorial Garden following Mass this weekend and see this beautiful space. The Memorial Garden is located directly in front of the church on the East side surrounded by a very large ficus hedge. Our Buildings and Grounds committee has worked tirelessly to transform the garden into a true masterpiece.



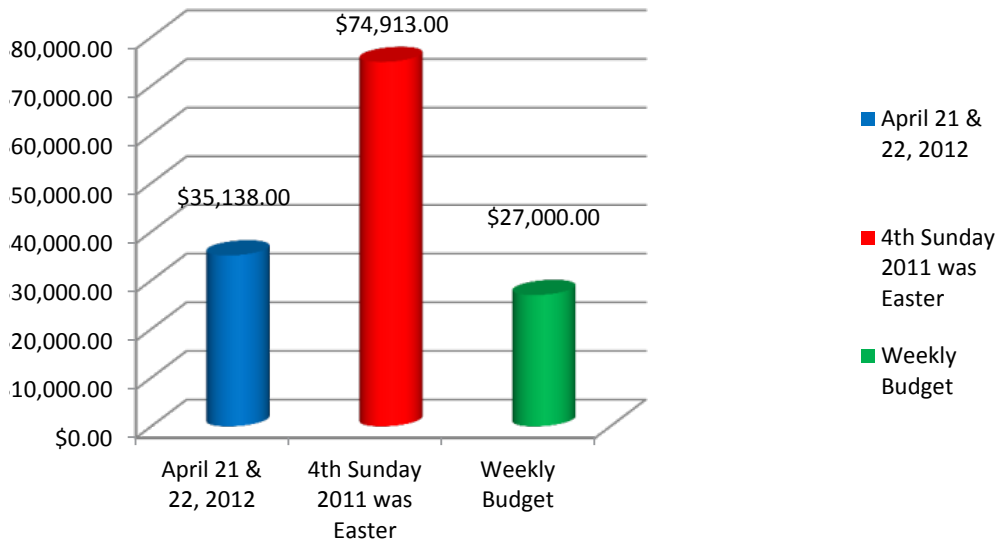

and plaque. This is a mere fraction of what you would pay at a cemetery. In addition, your final resting place will be in consecrated grounds right here at your parish.

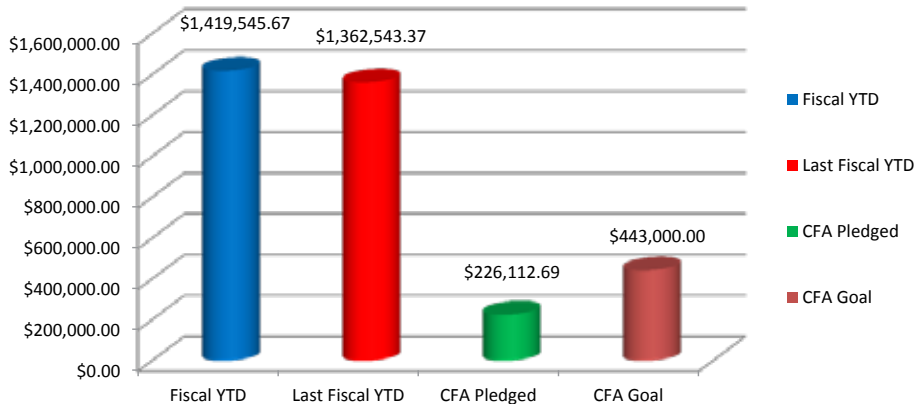

The Word & Life

One Flock – One Shepherd

As we journey through the Season of Easter we hear various accounts of life for the post resurrection Christian in Acts of the Apostles. We are given an insight into how the early Church began to organize itself and hear about the bold witness of the apostles. In today's first reading, Peter stands before the leaders of the people after

healing a man. He points out fearlessly how the power of the Risen Christ had healed this man. Peter acclaims Jesus as the stone rejected by the builders, but the cornerstone of salvation. Peter puts his life on the line by confronting the leaders with the wisdom of the Shepherd. Peter knew what it meant to share in the work of the Shepherd. As a true Shepherd he was willing to lay down his life for the sheep, that is, for the people he was called to serve.

Today's gospel speaks to the heart of God's generosity. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who is willing to lay down his life for God's people. He is not half committed, but wholly committed, to his mission and ministry. This is bore out upon Calvary, as he took upon our sins and that of the whole world. When Jesus spoke to his listeners, he was telling them that he was sent to lead them. His message is not to the people of Israel alone, but to the whole world. He tells us: "There will be one flock, one shepherd." Jesus Christ's mission is to gather us into the loving embrace of the Father and to guide us in the way of peace and truth. In this way, we can confidently say that we are children of God.

Reflection Questions

1. How does the image of Jesus as The Good Shepherd speak to you?
2. In what ways do you listen to Jesus in your day to day experience?
3. Do you allow yourself to listen to wisdom that contradicts the will of God?
4. Name the ways in which you allow yourself to belong to God?
5. How do you believe God cares for you?
6. The wolf in the parable represents that which steals and kills the sheep – what would characterize 'the wolf' today?
7. What are you willing to sacrifice for God knowing that Jesus laid down his life for you?
8. In what ways are you participating in Jesus' desire for unity in the world?

Jesus continues to guide the Church today. Sometimes personalities get in the way of the message, but overall, the Church stands the test of time. Christ is still the chief Shepherd of the Church. He continues to call us all by the virtue of our baptism, leading us to the Truth. The wisdom of Jesus Christ constantly directs us toward the right relationship with ourselves, others and God. The way of Christ in the gospel inspires us to transform what is broken and to seek out what is lost. If there are situations in our lives that do not embrace the reality of Jesus, then we have an opportunity to change that situation. Jesus Christ can accomplish his work in us if we allow his wisdom to penetrate our consciousness. Surrendering to the Truth of Christ in our experience allows us to enable Jesus to work through us. Just as Jesus is committed a hundred percent to the message he proclaimed, we too are called to the same commitment. Jesus also sends Shepherds our way through the gift of the priesthood to challenge, shape and renew the message of the gospel in the community. Together as priest and people, we are being led into the experience of God.

Prayer

We pray: Jesus, Good Shepherd, lead and guide us. May we surrender ourselves to the wisdom you have given to the world. We thank you for your sacrifice to save us from sin. We ask that you lead us through the trials of life as we seek to follow your will. Let us give witness to you in all that we do and say. As you send shepherds to lead your Church, may we recognize within them your handiwork and guidance. May we embrace your presence as you embrace each one of us in love. Amen.

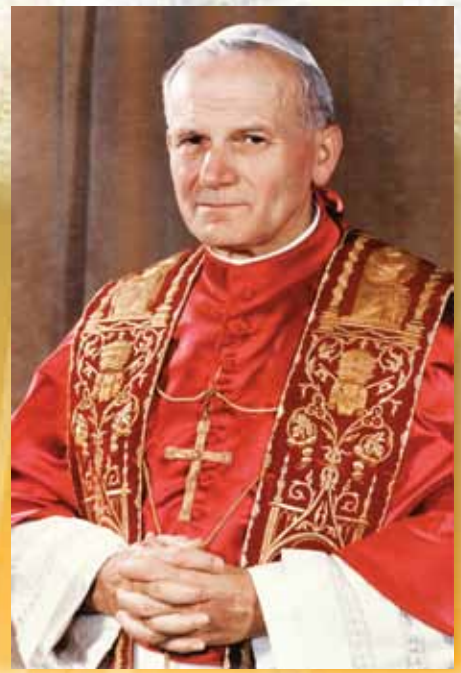


Wisdom of the Fathers

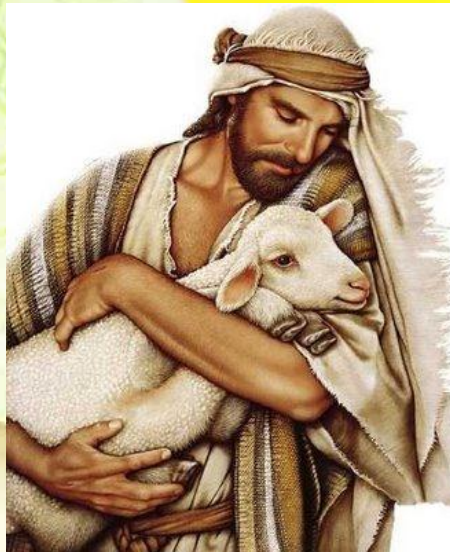
Jesus wants everyone to be a “good shepherd”.

Scripture Lesson

John 10:11-18, The Good Shepherd

This Gospel tells of our relationship with God. Jesus is the Good Shepherd, we are his flock. A shepherd guards and guides his flock. A flock of sheep knows its shepherd by voice. When he calls, the sheep follow that voice but not any other.

Society tells us today to follow our own voice. In fact, we get the message that it's okay for us to each pursue our own desires and look after ourselves. As a result, when trouble strikes, we would have no one to turn to for guidance and comforting.

Jesus is now the Good Shepherd for everyone. As the Good Shepherd, he gave his life for his sheep. But he also looked beyond the sheepfold of Israel. His hope is to have one flock and one shepherd for the whole world, the Church which he founded.

What can a parent do? The picture of Jesus as the Good Shepherd and us as the sheep he takes care of is appealing to children. We can reinforce that picture by stressing that our children can trust in Jesus.

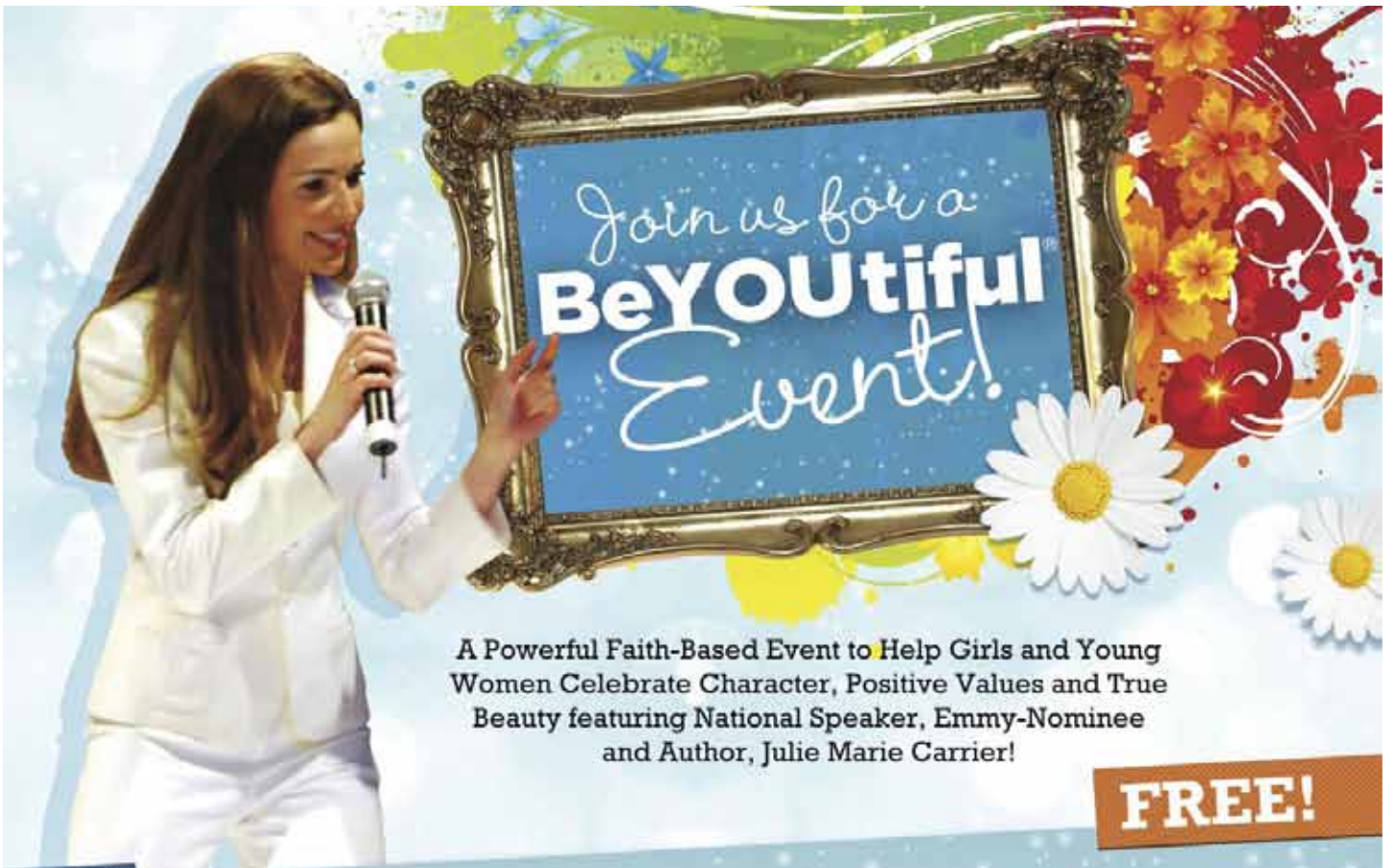
JOP Ships Over 1,300 Items to Jamaica
