



#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.



## If Jesus Is Not Lord of All, He's Not Lord At All

Today we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. For America — a country founded on ousting the British monarch — this feast can be a little difficult to understand. We have grown up with a deep distrust and suspicion of kings and monarchies. As a self-governing people, we tend to bristle against authority — even legitimate authority. But we especially reject the notion of an authority that comes from the top down. So, how can we make

sense of this Feast of Christ the King?

I believe St. Ignatius of Loyola (spiritual master and founder of the Jesuits) offers us particularly helpful guidance in our struggle to understand Jesus as Christ the King. Ignatius offers us a powerful method of prayer that engages the imagination. He calls this the "composition of place." What Ignatius means is that when we begin our time of prayer — especially meditation on the Gospels — we use our imagination to place ourselves in the scene. For example,

if we are going to meditate on the Nativity: we imagine the night and the surroundings; what Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the angels looked like; and so on. The next step is to identify with one of the characters in the scene. Perhaps you are one of the shepherds and Mary allows you to hold the baby Jesus. After composing the scene and identifying with one of the characters in the scene, we pray that God will teach us something about Him, ourselves, and His will for our lives in light of the meditation we have just made.

A great way to help with your imagination is to think of a movie or a book that has images that would be helpful for the subject matter of your meditation. With the Feast of Christ the King, perhaps the Lord of the Rings or Braveheart would work. In the Lord of the Rings we encounter Aragorn, the kind of king for whom we would willingly lay down our lives. Similarly in Braveheart (whether it is historically accurate, I don't know), we encounter another kinglike leader who inspires his people to fight the good fight, even if this requires sacrificial death.

Literature and movies offer us countless examples of good kings
— kings who serve rather than be served, lay down their lives in
the place of their people, ride out into danger and battle rather than

lead from behind. Many of these characters are, in fact, the fruit of the imaginations of deeply Christian authors. Take for example Tolkien and Lewis. Both the *Lord of the Rings* and the *Chronicles of Narnia* contain deeply Christian symbols and images. Because we are so "used" to the Gospels — we've heard them our entire lives—the stories and characters we meet in such works of fiction actually help us to understand Christ and his mission better. In a paradoxical way, these works of fiction can help us to read the Gospels more deeply. Kind of like: "Wow, when Aslan is humiliated and killed on the sacrificial stone, that kind of makes me think of Jesus." And those deep feelings of sorrow we feel when Aslan's mane is cut and he is killed can inspire the transfer of those feelings to the Passion.

One final note: in his *Spiritual Exercises*, St. Ignatius asks us to meditate on what he calls the "two standards." He shows us two sides in an epic battle. The one side fights under the banner of Christ and the other side fights under the banner of the world. On the Feast of Christ the King, it is good to remember that this battle — while spiritual — is real and not figurative. On the Feast of Christ the King, perhaps with the assistance of some literary figures, we can realize the seriousness of the battle between good and evil, the battle between God and Satan. It is up to us to choose sides. Let us pray for the gift of recognizing the spiritual battle that is raging in our culture — and let us serve Christ the King. After all, Christ has won the victory — the war — we need to do our part in fighting the battles.







## The Unlikely King

oday we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, marking the end of another Church year. Even though time passes so quickly, once we know that Christ reigns over us during every living and breathing moment, then we are open to experiencing Him in the here and now. Jesus, the Anointed One, is the ultimate ruler of our lives. Monarchs, presidents and world leaders come and go, but Jesus' reign lasts for eternity. Jesus' kingdom is one where truth resides. By listening to Jesus, believing in his wisdom, and living his truth, we are able to become heirs to that kingdom.

It seems strange that we name Jesus "king". Christ our king was not born in a palace nor was he born

in decent housing. Instead, Jesus began his human life in the midst of poverty and inadequate shelter. Jesus did not surround himself with people falling about him to pay homage and to serve him everything as a king would expect. No, Jesus Christ the King surrounded himself with the poor, the sinners, the neglected, the isolated, the broken and the vulnerable, showing all of them that they were sacred members of his kingdom. Jesus did not die in the midst of affluence — no one was hoping to take the place of this 'monarch's legacy. Instead, Jesus was sentenced to death through capital punishment. He experienced as King of the Jews, the agony of the cross and the desertion of his disciples. The only person probably willing to take his place was his mother.

Unlike all the lives of the historical monarchs of the world, Jesus rose again and instituted a new reign called

eternal life and the kingdom of heaven. We all belong to this kingdom and through the teachings of Christ's gospel we possess the truth. Jesus reigns over our lives — he protects us through our death, and invites us to share in eternal life. We profess to be members of his kingdom, but do we really allow Jesus to reign over us? Every decision we make about our relationships, our work, or our lives, must always reflect what Christ would have us choose. Living in Jesus' truth is demanding and goes against the wisdom of our time. Love for the poor, forgiveness for the sinner, transformation of the broken and healing of the sick, is a way of building up the kingdom of God and living in it. By participating in the great works of mercy that Jesus intended for us, we demonstrate how Jesus is ruler over our lives. We are faithful members of his kingdom when we immerse ourselves in the unconditional love of our savior.



**LESSON** 

Jesus testifies to the truth

This gospel tells of Pilate's questioning of Jesus at his trial. He had been handed over to the Romans by the Jewish leaders, to be put to death since he had claimed to be the Messiah. If Christ were a worldly king he would be a threat to the Roman emperor, something Pilate couldn't allow. So Pilate was trying to find out who Jesus was.

Christ said that while he is a king, his kingdom is not of this world. Instead, Jesus came into the world to testify to the "truth," to testify to the Father, to bring the good news of salvation to all humanity. That's the purpose of his existence.

Pilate was skeptical of Jesus and his being a king. The apostles, on the other hand, looked upon him as their king. That is the essence of the choice each of us must make. Is Jesus my king or not?

What can a parent do? Parents can explain to their children that Jesus is our king and savior. We can have faith in him and trust him.
