#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

#### Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

Amy and Hung worked tirelessly to assemble 100 new bikes for us. Marcus and Ovideo from St. John delivered all the bikes to the Guadalupe Center. Merline Dejeuste was in charge of the distribution at the Guadalupe Center.

The Ladies of Charity made all the beautiful ornaments under

the magnificent direction of Sandy O'Connor.

What a beautiful sight to behold, 226 new bikes. Many of the parishioners commented on what a great idea it was, especially since they had never experienced a new bike growing up. The children were ecstatic!

Over \$7,000 was also donated with a second giving tree to help support St. Matthew's House and the Guadalupe Soup Kitchen.

Thank you to all those involved in making our first bike drive a HUGE SUCCESS as well as those that contributed to our food drive.

Here we are in the middle of January and it feels like it could be April from the weather we have experienced recently. By the time you read my column, we will have set several record highs for the month of January. While we are experiencing unusually warm weather,

many other parts of the nation are dealing with normal winter conditions. As you may remember, last winter in Naples and throughout most of the contiguous United States was the year without a winter as everyone experienced above normal temperatures. For those wintering in Naples and for those who may be vacationing, enjoy the amazing weather while it lasts. Although my comments may irritate some, I for one would like to have some cooler weather so that it feels like winter rather than late spring. I believe that us "year rounders" pay our dues during the brutal summer months and are entitled to cool weather, if only for a few short months.

This past week, our entire staff realized first-hand how dependent we are on technology in our personal and professional lives. Our computer server crashed (hard) on Saturday and we were not back up and running until Wednesday morning. All of our files, calendars and contacts are stored on the server and we were basically helpless for two business days. On behalf of the clergy and staff, I would like to apologize for the delay in responding timely to email or other requests which required computer assistance. Unfortunately, we were at the mercy of our server and had very little recourse. The good news is that everything is backed up nightly and we didn't lose any data. Thanks for your patience and understanding.

#### Important notice regarding IRA Charitable Distributions

The retroactive reinstatement of the highly popular IRA charitable rollover provision (as part of the "fiscal cliff" deal) is welcome news for donors and charities alike. It clarifies that direct transfers made from an IRA to eligible charities at any time during 2012 qualify for IRA charitable rollover treatment, as ATRA retroactively reinstates the rollover treatment to January 1, 2012. Although the transitional relief is welcome news, such relief is somewhat limited, as taxpayers having taken distributions from their IRAs prior to December 1, 2012, are not eligible for rollover treatment with respect to such distributions, as the relief provision only applies to distributions received in December 2012, not for any distributions received during 2012. The transitional relief does allow, however, a direct distribution from an IRA to charity in January 2013 to be treated as made in 2012, so that another charitable rollover can be made in 2013. So, for charitablyinclined individuals having large IRAs, the transitional relief

does allow, in any event, for a \$100,000 IRA charitable rollover in both 2012 and 2013. Contact me at 566.1678 if you have questions about making a charitable gift from your IRA to St. John the Evangelist.



# A New Beginning

n today's gospel we recall the event of Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River. It marks the final day of our Christmas season. In Christmas, we celebrate salvation dawning upon the world and in the celebration of the Lord's baptism we recall Jesus Christ's entering into the depths of the human condition. Christmas recalls how salvation came to us the Baptism of the Lord explains why Jesus came. On the surface we might well say that Jesus was just following the local custom of his fellow citizens who were going through the baptism of repentance. As always, Jesus' act of being baptized goes far beyond the surface. Did Jesus need this baptism for himself? No - Jesus was conceived without sin and did not enter the world of sin because he was the Son of God. Jesus was baptized in order to identify with our humanity. When people came to the Jordan to be baptized, they entered into the waters of rebirth. In immersing themselves in these baptismal waters, they were washed clean of their sins. Such baptism offered transformation because of this change of heart and it also initiated a new beginning. As Jesus walks into the waters of the Jordan, he is making a statement about God's initiative to save us. Christ is the embodiment of transformation. His Incarnation ushers into the world a new beginning. Whilst he enters these cleansing waters, he is the one who is born clean and he becomes the means by which humanity will be saved once and for all by the blood of his cross. Jesus' baptism is a radical gesture in which God knows the state of humanity and wants to restore it by giving us his only Son. Jesus offers to us a new baptism in his Spirit – a new beginning where we can be restored and made whole.

The two choices of reading from Isaiah prophesied that God would not send his Messiah with forceful fanfare. On the contrary, the Messiah would come with authority, ruling the people with mercy and justice, carrying the lambs in his arm. God's presence would firmly be established in the coming of the Messiah in which he would take us by the hand and show us how we are to live. Jesus' ministry does not bring damnation and

judgment, but communicates the tender compassion of our God, dawning upon each one of us. In entering the world of sinners, God's initiative becomes clear. Conversion and transformation comes through the very person of Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus' words and outreach to the poor, the broken and the forgotten, reveals that God wants us to feel comforted by his presence. Once we experience Christ's compassion in our lives, then we are asked to reach out to others in the same way.

Today, we remember the call of our own baptism – the call to be priests, prophets, and people of the kingdom. Priests, in the way that we are called to charity and sacrifice; prophets, in the call to discern the will of God in the midst of the complexities of the world; people of the kingdom – walking in the newness of life! Our baptism is an entry into the life of the Church in which we allow ourselves to be taken by the hand of God and allow the gospel to impact our lives. Every aspect of the gospel becomes a sure foundation in building our lives. Jesus' example of unconditional love, servitude, mercy, transformation and healing, becomes a blueprint for the Christian life. As Jesus entered into the River Jordan, he was telling us that God wants to walk with us. As we remember our baptism this day, we are telling God that we want to walk with Him by loving one another!



### Prayer

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of Jesus, your Son. In gratitude we remember His willingness to accompany humanity as he stepped into the waters of new beginnings. May we be always be aware that we have been immersed into his life, in which we are shown to live in right

relationship; his death in which we surrender to what is passing; and his resurrection in which we have been promised hope and salvation. Amen.


