Life Matters



St. John parishioners met a different challenge from God on our day on Friday, February 15. The day was gloomy and drizzly with a small but dedicated turnout. They were blessed, however, with a visit from a lady who pulled off of Goodlette Road to explain that she had once had an abortion and she encouraged the prayer warriors to keep up the good work and prevent someone else from making the same mistake she made. Moments like that make the damp and the drizzle worth it.

This Monday, February 25, is our regular Parish commitment Monday. That day, on the fourth Monday of every month, we support the other regulars who are at Planned Parenthood week after week, all year long. Please join Fr. John from 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. in prayer for an end to abortion outside Planned Parenthood in Naples. Monday is abortion days on Creech Rd. The atmosphere is even more prayerful as we recognize that children are losing their lives inside. But we are there, once a month, to pray for those children, to pray for the mothers and fathers to change their minds, and also to pray for the abortionist and the staff members who truly believe they are providing a valuable service to these poor women. Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.





Please see page 20 for the consolidated financial statement (July 1 – December 31, 2012) with a comparison to the same period last year. This six month statement encompasses four of the months where we generally operate "in the red."

I will now touch on a few points of interest with regards to the statement.

The most glaring item appears on the first line as Offertory Collection. As you can see, we recognized an increase of nearly 20% over the same period in 2011. Total receipts for the six month period increased nearly 13%.

Income from the Divine Gift Boutique increased nearly 32% over the same period last year.

On the expense side, after very few staffing changes, we were able to reduce salary expense by over 2%.

Under facilities expense, you will notice an expenditure of \$72,222 for property and liability insurance. This expense is generally not recognized until the second half of the fiscal year. Due to much better than expected cash flow for the first six months, we were able to recognize this expense in September. By doing so we were able to take advantage of a 3% discount for early payment, thereby saving the parish over \$3,000.00.

We were also able to recognize a larger portion of our tuition subsidy responsibility during the first six months of the fiscal year.

Due to a complete new line of merchandise in the Divine Gift Boutique, expenses increased substantially. Sales thus far in the second half of the fiscal year have increased nearly 100% over the same period last year.

Overall, we recognized a loss of just under \$10,000.00 for the first six months of the fiscal year versus a loss of over \$138,000.00 in the same period last year. All of this while recognizing numerous expenses earlier than expected. This bodes extremely well for us moving forward. And let's not

forget that we exceeded our goal for the 2012 Catholic Faith Appeal. So not only will we not have to recognize a CFA expense in the next six months, we will instead have an extra \$60,000.00 returned to the parish to be used for our parish ministries.

None of this would be possible without your continued generosity. Thank you so much!

Since we are discussing finances, did you take a glance at the collection summary for last week? The offertory collection was in excess of \$50,000.00. This was the first time that we have broken the \$50,000.00 threshold since February of 2007. Allow me to thank you once again for your extreme generosity. As I have mentioned on numerous occasions, we generally operate "in the red" seven out of twelve months. We depend on the increased seasonal income in order to build a buffer to allow us to survive the lean summer months. As you know, our average weekly operating budget hovers around \$27,000.00 depending on the time of year. During the months of May through October, we fail to meet budget and must use our surplus to operate efficiently.







The Voice That Calls to Each of Us

n our gospel today we recall the event of Christ's transfiguration. As the apostles headed out for a walk with their Rabbi, they probably had no idea what would happen as they climbed the mountain to pray. They encounter the extraordinary magnificence of God on what they thought would be another ordinary day. Peter, James and John witnessed the face of Jesus change in appearance as well as his clothes. In this moment the apostles realize that Jesus is more than ever they imagined. One could say that they experienced Christ in his divinity and glory. The voice from heaven tells them, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." Jesus' authority is given him by heaven – an authority that brings eternal life, not only to the apostles but to the entire world.

The voice spoken from heaven, also invites us to listen to words of Christ. Every time we



hear the gospel proclaimed, we encounter God's voice speaking to us. Jesus always speaks to the heart of the matter in the midst of the vast circumstances in which he finds himself. Whenever we hear the words of Christ calling us to forgive, to heal and transform our lives in the proclamation of the gospel and the homily of the priest, God is speaking to the heart of our own situation – especially when the Liturgy of the Word strikes a chord.

We are also all called to see the extraordinary reality of God in the ordinary things that we take for granted. If we look through the lens of our Christian experience, then we will ultimately find Christ in places where he has always been. The face of Christ changed in appearance on the mountain 2000 years ago – today that face is transfigured in many different guises. Jesus, God's Son, continues to speak to us every time we come to the mass. Jesus is present in the Sacred Word proclaimed to us. Jesus appears to us at the altar under the forms of Sacred Bread broken.

and blessed wine outpoured. However, his presence is not to be limited to our Mass. At the very end of the Mass, we are called to go in peace and encounter Christ in society. We are challenged to see Christ's presence in the face of the poor, to hear his voice in the voices of the vulnerable who have no-one to speak for them, and to embrace Christ in the needs of our world. This act of listening involves a great sacrifice and act of will to recognize the divine fingerprint of God engraved upon the shattered souls of our society.

The event of the Transfiguration reminds us that God reveals himself throughout human history. Peter, James and John receive a foretaste of Christ's divinity and resurrection. As we recall this experience today, we call to mind the glory of Christ that will be revealed to us in the transition from this life to eternal life. As we, and all those belonging us leave this world, Christ will illuminate the darkness of death and lead us to a place of eternal light.



Prayer

As we continue to go through our Lenten journey, we pray that we open our hearts and our eyes to your presence around us, O Lord Jesus. May we be attentive to the needs of others around us. Enable us to hear your voice calling out to each one of us. Inspire us to be generous with our time and our treasures to transfigure the darkness of the world into a beacon of light and hope. Amen.


Wisdom of the Fathers

"Today's Gospel reading also reminds us of this, re-proposing to us the episode of the Transfiguration of Christ on Mount Tabor. Awestruck at the sight of the transfigured Lord who was speaking with Moses and Elijah, Peter, James and John were suddenly overshadowed by a cloud, out of which came a voice which proclaimed: "This is my beloved Son on whom my favour rests; listen to him".

When one has the grace to live a strong experience of God, it is as if one is living an experience similar to that of the disciples during the Transfiguration: a momentary foretaste of what will constitute the happiness of Paradise. These are usually brief experiences that are sometimes granted by God, especially prior to difficult trials.

No one, however, is permitted to live "on Tabor" while on earth. Indeed, human existence is a journey of faith and as such, moves ahead more in shadows than in full light, and is no stranger to moments of obscurity and also of complete darkness. While we are on this earth, our relationship with God takes place more by listening than by seeing; and the same contemplation comes about, so to speak, with closed eyes, thanks to the interior light that is kindled in us by the Word of God.

The Virgin Mary herself, among all human creatures the closest to God, still had to walk day after day in a pilgrimage of faith (cf. *Lumen Gentium*, n. 58), constantly guarding and meditating on in her heart the Word that God addressed to her through Holy Scripture and through the events of the life of her Son, in whom she recognized and welcomed the Lord's mysterious voice.





And so, this is the gift and duty for each one of us during the season of Lent: to listen to Christ, like Mary. To listen to him in his Word, contained in Sacred Scripture. Finally, to listen to him in our brothers and sisters, especially in the lowly and the poor, to whom Jesus himself demands our concrete love. To listen to Christ and obey his voice: this is the principle way, the only way, that leads to the fullness of joy and of love."

When my eldest graduated from basic training, he stood in formation with the rest of his unit—dozens of young men in black trench coats and black berets carrying rifles and the same stern, serous expressions. Though I hadn't seen my son in weeks, I stood and stared with all the other families: None of us could pick out our own children.

Today's Gospel story of the transfiguration reminds us how hard it can be to see people—especially those to whom we're closest—as they really are. We clothe our family members with labels and rarely check to see if they still fit. It can sometimes take a dramatic experience to demonstrate that "the funny one" is clinically depressed or "the slacker" has become wildly productive.

It might be a good Lenten discipline to try to see our loved ones as though we're meeting them for the first time. We may find a few surpises close to home. And it wouldn't hurt to look at ourselves with new eyes as well. That could be the biggest surprise of all.

Luke 9:28-36 Transfiguration of the Lord

The Transfiguration of the Lord is one of the most spectacular events in the Gospel. Jesus took Peter, John and James up a mountain to pray. Jesus became a radiant figure and began to talk with Elijah and Moses.

The three discussed Jesus' coming journey to Jerusalem and what awaited him there – his death and Resurrection. A cloud came over them and a voice said, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him."

This Gospel show that Jesus was a man of prayer. He often went off by himself to pray. In fact, some think this was Jesus allowing his disciples a glimpse into his prayer. It was at such a high level that he could converse with prophets and hear God's voice.

Praying is not only for times of trouble or danger.

Prayer is something for us to learn and to do regularly. It involves talking and listening. By listening we learn to hear God's voice in us.

What can a parent do? Reinforce the importance of prayer to children by joining them in prayer at bedtime and any other occasion that arises.


