

# **Lovingly Crafting Items for Non-Profit Groups**

Over the last few months, members of the Knitting/Crocheting Ministry have been creating little hats, booties, prayer shawls and other items for donation to several non-profit groups.

While many ministries at St. John take the summer off, the Knitting/Crocheting Ministry meets year-round on Tuesdays from 10:00 a.m. -12:00 noon in the Claussen Center. Although

smaller in number than the seasonal group, they continue to craft articles which represent their ministry of Christian outreach.

The original ministry began as a "for-profit" group of crafters creating articles for purchase at parish events. In 2010, Fr. John asked the group to become a "non-profit" ministry creating items to be given to charitable organizations. This idea evolved into relationships with hospital neo-natal units, chemotherapy clinics, nursing homes,

pregnancy centers, and even the U. S. Army!

With pastel baby hats and booties, rainbow chemotherapy caps, multi-colored lap robes and prayer shawls, and woolen helmet liners for our troops, their cupboard is never bare. Although an inventory has never been kept, the talented crafters have lovingly knitted/crocheted hundreds of items not only during

their Tuesdays together, but during their free time at home. From fellowship to sharing patterns to discussing world events, the group has never lacked a Christian identity. Many have commented how blessed they are to share their talents with so many. The group has received many letters of thanks. Other handcrafters are always welcome to join the ministry.

Even if you can't physically gather with the group, handcrafters can always knit/ crochet items at home and donate them to the ministry. Common patterns are available upon request. Handcrafters might also wish to donate yarns to be shared within the group. (Joann Fabrics cashiers cringe when they see the crafters coming with their fistful of coupons!) 

Many of you most likely saw the first set of new doors this past week if you entered through the main entrance. Unfortunately, the new doors were not completely finished due to an issue which developed with the hinges. As a result, new (full length) hinges were ordered and optimistically both sets of doors should be completely operational by this weekend. Regardless of the issues with the hinges, the new doors are absolutely beautiful and make quite a statement for those entering the church. The wood used is called "Sapele" and comes from a very large tree native to Tropical Africa. Believe it or not, Cadillac uses Sapele for the interior wood trim on some of its vehicles. The frosted impact glass cutout with our logo in the middle panes of the doors turned out great. In addition to adding beauty to the front of our church, these doors will also provide the enhanced level of security we have been lacking for quite some time.

As a result of damage from the lightning strike in July, we will be installing a new phone system in the next few weeks. Our capabilities will be increased exponentially with our new

system, however, I am sure there will be a lengthy learning curve. In addition, I am sure at some point our phones will be down while we transition from the old to the new. We will do our best to notify our parishioners via email blast if there will be any interruption of service. I, for one, am looking forward to this update to our phone system which was over 16 years old.

We have finally settled on a vendor for our new surveillance

system. The new system will have (like our phone system) amazing capabilities and give us endless options as far as implementation. We hope to have the new system in place by the end of August.

We recently made some repairs to the wood facia of the Claussen Center. It is hard to believe, but after only seven years, much of the wood (where the water collects on the roof) had begun to rot. New wood has been installed and will be painted to match next week.

Marty Gauthier has nearly completed the conversion of the sacristy to include a new Altar Servers room. Marty has spent the last two weeks building a wall, complete with a door and closets to house the albs for the Altar Servers.

The priests will now have a very private area to vest while the Altar Servers and Sacristan will share a space. Jackie Gibson has returned from vacation and explained in detail her plans for the new expanded gift shop. Much of the demolition work in the gift shop will take place later this month. If everything goes as planned (which it never does) then we should have everything completed by mid-September.







# The Value of Preparedness

f all of us knew the time and place of our death, we would do our best to avoid that place! All joking aside, we must acknowledge the fact that death is as natural as birth. We all have to die, but it is not up to us to know the day or the hour. Jesus tells us to be prepared for that moment when it arrives. He advises us to get our own house in order so one day we will be ready to enter the Father's house.

In the gospel today, we hear Jesus present two parables. The first talks of the need for the servants to be ready for the Master's return from the wedding. Veiled inside this parable is the message that Christ will return some day and we are expected to be attentive to his needs. In a concrete way, we are reminded elsewhere in the gospel, by Jesus that we tend to His needs by attending to those around us. Similarly, the second parable is offered in response to Peter's question, "Lord, is this parable meant for us (apostles) or for everyone?" In response,

Jesus offers the apostles the parable of the servant who is left in charge to distribute the food. We hear that if the servant wastes the resources of his Master, he will be severely beaten and punished because he knew what was expected of him. This parable is meant for all of us. We are well aware of the expectations that God has for us. The expectation is that we live as Christ asked us to live and be accountable to the gospel message.


We have often heard the remark that each one of us should live each day as if it were our last day. When people find out that they are terminally ill, they tend to seek reconciliation and to heal past resentments in order to prepare themselves to meet God. It is unfortunate that it takes something so dramatic to give people a push in this regard. God has entrusted us with such a special gift – the gift of life itself. He endows us with this gift to nurture it and bring forth from what is life-giving, using the freedoms that are so rightly ours. Our choices and life mission should always reflect the choices and life mission of Jesus, that is, to do the will of the father and to accept the truth in love.


We should all take stock of our everyday activities to see where Jesus is present in our lives. If we cannot find the reality of Jesus in our experience,

Our choices and the accomplishments that we achieve in the name of Jesus are what ultimately pave the way to our true destiny.

Lord, may we be ready to meet you when you call us from this life to yourself. Help us to rid ourselves of the barriers that keep us from each other. May we, with your help, cherish the gift of the present moment. Let our lives become a prayer to you as we set our hearts on the life of the world to come. Help us to use our gifts wisely so that we please you when we come to meet you face to face. When the sun finally sets on our lives, may your radiant dawn shine upon each one of us. Amen.


