Diocese Will Tape Two Masses for the Homebound at St. John on October 3

Taping of two different Masses for the homebound is scheduled for Thursday, October 3 starting at 1:00 p.m. here at St. John the Evangelist.

The first liturgy that will be taped at that time is for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time which is also Mission Sunday. The celebrant will be Fr. John. The taped liturgy will air on Sunday, October 20.

The second liturgy that will be taped is for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The celebrant for that liturgy will be Fr. Jim. The taped liturgy will air on Sunday, November 17.

All parishioners are invited to participate in the tapings as a congregation. Arrive around 12:30 p.m. Snacks and drinks will be served before the taping.

The Sunday Mass on Television is an outreach of the Diocese of Venice Department of Communications and is supported by the donations of viewers. According to the Department of Communications, "This outreach serves those who, for reasons outside of their control, are unable to attend Sunday Mass in one of the parishes of the Diocese. For many homebound individuals, this outreach reminds them that they are loved by their brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the Diocese of Venice, and that they remain a vibrant and loved part of our faith community."

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



now. Her weight is approaching 2 pounds. She sits up straight now to accommodate her internal organs which have moved into their final place in her little body. Babies born prematurely at this time have a very

good chance of surviving. The medical advances in caring for extremely small newborn infants are extraordinary indeed. Don't forget to pray for your baby. Abortion is legal through all nine months and her mom might still feel pressure to abort.

Life Matters



I owe all of you, my readers, many apologies for missing Life Matters since the end of July. I will confess now that I have been facing a fairly serious health threat over the past few months. God has been working His miracles for me and the worst of the crisis is past, and as Autumn is upon us, I hope I can get back to work.

On September 14 I led many in the Naples pro-life community in a prayer service at the Florida Memorial for the

Unborn in Palm Royale Cemetery on Vanderbilt Beach Rd. The service noted the first ever National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children which was co-sponsored by Priests for Life, Laity for Life and Americans for a Pro-Life Society. There were 25 pro life faithful in attendance at the 9:00 a.m. service. We prayed and set our sights on the upcoming 40 Days for Life campaigns in Fort Myers and Sarasota beginning at the end of September. September 14 also noted the fourth anniversary of the return of surgical abortions in Naples. Pam Kessen, faithful sidewalk counselor, noted that four years ago, Planned Parenthood was averaging 20 plus procedures each week. They are now down to performing surgical abortions only every other week, and those number are in the single digits. Our prayers are working!!! We need to keep the prayers coming at Planned Parenthood. It will be a wonderful thing indeed when we celebrate their doors closing in Naples, just as they have in so many locations across the country.



The kids are back in school, including those in Faith Formation. Adult Faith Formation is also kicking off its new "school year" with some wonderful offerings to get our brains working again. In other words, summer is really over and the time has come to get back to work! Upcoming from your Respect Life Committee, look for our Respect Life activities all during the pro life month of October.

henever natural disasters take place such as hurricanes, floods, earthquakes, etc., people become aware of what is truly important in their lives. Such events leave people homeless or displaced. We can ask ourselves "what is the most important thing for me – my possessions or my family?" Hopefully, most of us would say that family is most important.

Our home comforts are important. People need roofs over their heads and a safe place to sleep. In today's gospel, Jesus asks us to be faithful stewards with the treasures that are gifted to us. We are asked to do the truth in love and choose what is right. Material comforts are the blessings of hard work. However, if we start to let materialism consume


us, it starts to eat away at the fabric of what is truly important. The greatest treasure gifted to the Church is that of the wisdom of Jesus Christ. We are asked to be faithful stewards of the Living Word handed down to us.

All of us are entrusted with a faith that is to be lived. We are reminded that we have to be trusted in the small matters of life in order to be trusted in great matters. This is faithful stewardship. Jesus' example and the great example of the Christian witness throughout the centuries teach us about what it means to be entrusted with the small things of faith. We are simply called to serve and to love as Jesus loved. Whenever we encounter need in others, we are asked to reach out as best we can thus offering healing to God's people. Whenever we defend life and seek dignity to those who are undervalued in the world, we serve the Lord. As we gain the Lord's trust in what we say and do in life, it is then that we are entrusted with something much greater. What is this treasure? It is the gift of eternal life.

We share in a common purpose by virtue of our baptism. During baptism, each one of us is anointed with oil and commissioned to be His witness to the world. The rite prays: As Christ was anointed priest, prophet and king, so may you live always as a member of His Body sharing everlasting life. Each one of us is called in our own small way to bring others to have an encounter with God. As a Church, we are asked to seek the Lord and discern his will in society. We all have a common purpose – to recognize that everyone around us belongs to God and should be respected. We must seek the ways of the kingdom where peace, dignity and respect is reality for all.

REFLECTION

When Cardinal Jorge Marion Bergoglio became pope, he chose the name Francis. He gave his reason immediately – Francis of Assisi was the "man of poverty." Pope Francis came into leadership with the message, "Don't forget the poor." Sunday's Gospel is about a manager who cheats people who are poor. Maybe in Jesus' time people were talking about this man, just as we learn about cheaters in our news today. A wealthy man discovers his business manager is taking money for himself. The manager is embezzling. Embezzling is taking other people's money for oneself. It is a crime. The rich man fires the business manager.

What does the business manager do? He cheats some more to make friends with the people who owe his boss debts. The business manager changes a debt of 100 sacks of grain to 80. He changes a debt of 50 to 40. Perhaps the business manager overcharged these people to make money for himself in the first place. We don't know. But the story tells us Jesus wants his followers to be as creative about helping people who are poor as the business manager is about helping himself.

Jesus teaches us not to cheat. No one can trust a cheater. If we aren't trustworthy about little things, how can anyone trust us in big things?

Jesus also teaches that helping people who are poor is a better way to use money than working to become wealthy. It is better to serve God than to pursue wealth.

Follow Francis

One of the things many people may not know about Francis was that he not only counseled his friars to live in radical poverty but he commanded them not to touch money.

Story after story in the early documents talk about his scolding his brothers for handling money. In his first Rule of 1221, he said: We should have no more use or regard for money in any of its forms than for dust. Those who think it is worth more or who are greedy for it, expose themselves to the danger of being deceived by the devil. We have left everything we had behind us; we must be very careful now not to lose the kingdom of heaven for so little.

In his day, money was beginning to be an important part of the economy. One can imagine what he would think of our own economy, in which many people do nothing but exchange money with no actual goods entering the equation. Francis' perspective may have been extreme, but the intention behind it was good. Money should never be more important than the well-being of others or the state of one's immortal soul.
