## Ministry Spotlight

#### St. Vincent de Paul Conference.

The work of the St. Vincent de Paul Conference here at our parish for the past fiscal year – October 2012 – September 2013 was extensive. The St. Vincent de Paul Society is composed of ordinary parishioners, men and women who attempt to carry out the Gospel message: "Whatever you do for the least of my brothers – you do unto me."

How are they able to do this work? It is only possible because of the continuing support of the parishioners. The poor boxes in church are never empty; the three SVdP envelopes a year are always filled; and the collection baskets at the Thanksgiving Day and St. Patrick's Day Masses are overflowing. Last year their food drive kept their food pantry supplied for six weeks! In addition, donations from parishioners of clothing, furniture, knick knacks, cars, boats to the SVdP thrift shops in Naples and Bonita Springs generate income to be given to those in need.

Their main focus is the geographical area of the parish that includes zip codes 108,109, and 110. However, Fr. John encourages the SVdP to help all wherever possible. For example, they help support a SVdP Conference in

a poor parish in Georgia.

Below is what SVdP members have done during the past year:

Contacts: 156 including 92 visits to people's homes.

People Served: 193 Adults and 200 children.

Assistance Given: Rent, Florida Power and Light, water bills, gas cards, food, clothing, and furniture. Most importantly, the SVdP bring the Good News of God's love of all. Many are amazed that they are being helped by neighbors who attend St. John the Evangelist Church.

Monies Expended: approximately \$96,000 dollars!

#### Sacrament of Baptism

After arguably the wettest "rainy season" in recent memory, we have officially entered "dry season." Did you notice that the swale at the front of our campus has finally dried out and was able to be cut? Once it cools down a few more degrees, we will experience "Chamber of

Commerce" weather for the foreseeable future.

As I write my column this week, I reflect on the same week last year when Hurricane Sandy was making landfall in the northeast, changing the lives of those in her path forever. One year later, more than \$1.4 billion in Individual Assistance has been provided to more than 182,000 survivors, and an additional \$2.4 billion in low-interest disaster loans have been approved by the U.S. Small Business Administration. More than \$7.9 billion in National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) payments have been made to policy holders, and FEMA has approved more than \$3.2 billion to fund emergency work, debris removal, and repair and replacement of infrastructure.

Although it will not be installed prior to Veterans' Day, did you know that we are working on the final piece of granite for the Veterans' Memorial? In the grassy area immediately to the east of the flagpoles, we will erect a granite memorial in the shape of a hexagon recognizing the five branches of our military. We are currently in the design stages, but feel confident that the finished product will be an amazing testament to our military.

Thanks to a \$14,000.00 donation from our illustrious Men's Club, we are the proud owners of a Hearing Loop System in the church. The system was installed over the summer, so many of you may not be aware of its existence unless you read my column on our website while up north. By installing this loop system, we are one of only approximately 100 facilities offering this technology in the **entire state of Florida**. Thank you Men's Club for your incredibly generous donation! Below, I have included some information that may be of interest to those of you with poor hearing.



Hearing Loop Installed

St. John the Evangelist has installed a Hearing Loop to assist those with hearing loss hear more clearly during services. A Hearing Loop is an assistive listening system that transmits sound directly into ones hearing aids or cochlear implants rather than depending on sound coming from the loudspeakers. To receive the Loop signal, manually activate your T-coil or telephone setting on your hearing aid or cochlear implant. If you don't know if you have a T-coil or if yours is properly programmed, consult with your audiologist or hearing aid professional. If you don't wear hearing aids, ask to use a Loop receiver to receive the sound. Loop receivers are available in the sacristy. If you have further questions about Looping, please contact the installation company, Complete Hearing Solutions at *www. CompleteHearingSolutions.org* or call 727.260.3488.







## **Encountering the Mercy of God**

s we journey through the Sunday gospels, we are exposed to the radical message of Jesus Christ. In our reading today we meet Zacchaeus; he may have been short in stature, but many were aware of his reputation in Jericho. Tax collectors during the time of Jesus were known to be corrupt and sinful. They were the ones who collected monies for Caesar (the dictator who had held Israel under Roman occupation). Hence, tax collectors were held in disdain by the Religious State of Israel. It is of no surprise to us, then, how people became hostile when Jesus invited himself to Zacchaeus' house. Jesus takes this risk in order to bring salvation to a man who was hungering for God and the truth. Jesus' action of entering the house of Zacchaeus etches into salvation history the imprint of a new initiative of God, i.e., to enter into the world of sin to transform it! Zacchaeus recognizes a new way of life

by encountering Jesus. Therefore, it is not surprising to hear that once Zacchaeus encounters the truth in the love and compassion in Jesus, that he moves to change his life and do what is right.

The Church continues to be the refuge of the sinner. The work of salvation is never done. Salvation has to be worked at and the presence of Jesus still needs to be made known. There are still many people today who have heard of Jesus and understand the concept of his message — but they do not know him. Lives often remain unchanged because the personal encounter with the Lord Jesus has not taken place. If we truly know Jesus deeply, our lives will change and be transformed in ways that we never knew possible. The challenge for us today is to seek Jesus out as Zacchaeus did. Once we find Christ in the midst of our every day realities, it is then we can offer to change our lives for the better. Whenever we turn our lives over to Christ, salvation comes to rest in our homes. The only way we can enter into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ is through prayer, discernment, and contemplation. Just as it takes time to cultivate our personal relationships, it also takes our time and sacrifice to get to know Jesus.

What does all this mean in concrete? *It means that we commit ourselves to the path of ongoing conversion.* It means that we recognize the grounds of the endless possibilities of God's mercy when we encounter sin. It means that our lives must always be open to Jesus' message of love and acceptance of the sinner. It means that we take the risk that Jesus took to make Zacchaeus his disciple. It means that we have to think outside of the box so that we can ultimately bring people into the conformity of Christ's truth in love. The first reading today reminds us that God does not loathe or hate any of his creation. All God expects from humanity is that people abandon wickedness and believe in his Word. In Jesus' words, "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost!"


## Wisdom of the Fathers



#### REFLECTION

Zacchaeus cared mostly about himself before Jesus came into his life. Being a friend of Jesus changed him from being a cheater, to being a person who cared about everyone as Jesus does. He cared about the common good of all.

This time of year the Church remembers all the saints, all the people who have been baptized and believe in Jesus' power to help us grow more like him.

The word saints refers to all followers of Jesus. To talk of the saints is the same as talking about all baptized Christians. In this sense we become saints by Baptism and by believing that the power of Jesus' death and resurrection helps us become loving people. Saints also refers to the followers of Jesus who give outstanding examples of becoming like him. The Church proclaims these people saints through the process of canonization.

The whole Church is more than the sum of all living Catholics. The whole Church includes all the saints living and dead. The Church includes saints and sinners.

My older daughter learned the hard truth early on: Just because money is a necessity doesn't necessarily mean you have any. She expressed a wish for some luxury good or other and I told her I didn't think we had the money for it. "You can just go to the bank and get some more," she offered, helpfully. When I explained how money got to the bank, she was shocked and a little depressed. (I found myself nonplussed as well.)

Money, and the getting and spending of it, has always been a problem. The story of Zacchaeus tells us three things about the man: he was short, he was rich, and he was crooked. By the end of the story, he was less crooked, considerably less rich, and (presumably) the same height. He was still himself, just an enhanced version. In the space of one dinner, he learned to see himself as independent of his finances. Have we learned the same?




