Safe Environment Training Will Be Held at St. John January 8 and January 10; Fingerprinting Now Available at St. John Also

As part of the Safe Environment Program, the Diocese of Venice requires that all diocesan employees, clergy, religious, laity and those volunteers who have routine contact with children and/or vulnerable adults be fingerprinted and trained in Safe Environment.

"As Christian adults, we have a moral and legal responsibility and are entrusted by God with the spiritual, emotional and physical well-being of minors and vulnerable adults. As they participate in activities within or sponsored by our diocese, it is our commitment to provide an environment which is safe and nurturing. 
Fingerprinting is now available here at St. John. St. John employees and volunteers as well as employees and volunteers from other parishes in the diocese may be fingerprinted here.

Before visiting a processing center, either here or one listed on the website *http://dioceseofvenice.org/programs/safeenvironment/fingerprinting/* applicants must complete registration form online using photo identification, such as a driver's license, at *www.dov.sofn.net*. After registration is complete, a receipt with a bar code will be issued, and new applicants must present this receipt at the screening location in order to continue the process. Individuals who do not have access to a computer or require assistance in registering should contact parish office.

The cost for fingerprinting is: *New Applicants*: Employee/Clergy/Religious/Seminarian/Vendor - *\$57.50. Volunteers - \$51.00.* Rescreening after 5 years of the "initial" electronic screening (reuse of retained prints): Employee/Clergy/Religious/ Seminarian/Vendor - \$47.50, Volunteers - \$40.00. Payment must be made in advance by credit card only – NO PERSONAL OR DIOCESAN ENTITY CHECKS accepted. St. John will reimburse all parishioners who are required to be fingerprinted. When you perform the online background check, the system will provide you the ability to schedule your fingerprint confirmation at the St. John location.

Parishioners will also have the opportunity to attend a Safe Environment Training session here as two sessions have been scheduled at St. John. The first session is Thursday, January 8 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. in the Seminar Room in the Claussen Center. Another session will be held Saturday, January 10 from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. in the Library. Please call the parish office to register for the class. In addition, other sessions will be offered in other locations throughout the diocese. SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



The Dream of Prophets and Prophetesses Fulfilled

he day parents bring their child for baptism is a special day. It marks the beginning of a journey into God and into the world. The parents bring their child and promise to teach their child in the ways of faith and to allow their child to participate in a life of the Church. As we listen to the gospel from St. Luke on the Feast of the Holy Family, we recall the great day that Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple to dedicate his life to God and to circumcise him. Mary and Joseph were marking Jesus' entry into a life with God and also preparing him to journey into the world. This religious rite was a sacred passage for them and for their child. It was a moment of encounter in which God speaks through others to the Holy Family.

The two people God chooses to reveal his plan are Simeon and Anna, a prophetess. Simeon is an old man whose name means 'God has heard'. We are told that he was religious and devout. He had prayed to God all of his life that he would not die before he had seen the Anointed One of God – the Christ. What a tender moment as we listen in the gospel account recall how Simeon took Christ Jesus into his arms and realized that his prayer had been heard and his life's dream fulfilled. "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace,

according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all peoples, a light for revelation...." This is a moment of encounter with Simeon and his Lord, and for Jesus' parents and Anna, the discerning prophetess. However, for Simeon, it is a bittersweet moment in which he realizes that the life of Jesus would meet opposition and pain. Anna whose name means "favor" or "grace" and whose life was spent in fasting and prayer, thanks God for the redemption the child would bring into the world.

The most amazing thing about this encounter is that Mary and Joseph, along with their son, Jesus, had to return to their own town of Nazareth and make sense of what was going to unfold in their lives and the life of their son. We are told that Jesus, after returning, started to grow and become strong. He also allowed the favor and wisdom of God to be with him. The Holy Family, like all families, would help one another discern God's wisdom and help bring security to one another. Sometimes we have to listen to what is not being said in the Sacred Scriptures to figure out the divine drama that was waiting to unfold. Jesus had to come to terms with who he was and his purpose in regard to the heavenly Father's will. As a young child he must have asked the impossible questions in which Mary and Joseph in the simplicity could only respond in a humble way. There were most probably times when Jesus' parents were confused and unsure of the path that God was leading their son on. However, we hear elsewhere, that Mary pondered on all these things in her heart and trusted in the Lord.

So we could ask ourselves how can such an example inspire us many years later. The truth is that God is still with us. God wants to be a part of our lives and so encourages us to bring others to this reality. Salvation is within our grasp when we discern and live the will of the Father. Contemplating the wisdom of Jesus and living the truth of his love enables us to pave our destiny that leads us to our heavenly wisdom. It is within the context of the family that we start to build a civilization of love. Parents share in the nature of God, as they become co-creators – bringing life into the world and teaching their children the ways of faith. Just as the Holy Family had to deal with divine consequences in raising Jesus, so too, parents share in the same sacred dilemma as they seek to do best for the children. The place of the family is of upmost importance to society. It is there that a solid foundation is firmly set and where children learn values, morality and ethics. It is within the context of the family that children learn by example of their parents, setting the stage for their lives. Hopefully, it is within the interaction of family life where children comprehend God's love and God's will. As children become adults and move away from the family unit, they are called to shape the world around them with the values that have been instilled in them

Wisdom of the Fathers

"How do we keep our faith? Do we keep it for ourselves, in our families, as a personal treasure, or are we able to share it by our witness, by our acceptance of others, by our openness? We all know that families, especially young families, are often "racing" from one place to another, with lots to do. But did you ever think that this "racing" could also be the race of faith? Christian families are missionary families, in their everyday life, in their doing everyday things, as they bring to everything the salt and the leaven of faith...!

... There is one more thought we can take from God's word: the family experiences joy. In the responsorial psalm we find these words: "let the humble hear and be glad" (33/34:2). The entire psalm is a hymn to the Lord who is the source of joy and peace. What is the reason for this gladness? It is that the Lord is near, he hears the cry of the lowly and he frees them from evil...






