#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

#### Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

# #ToKnow — Pope's Message: Children are a Sign of the Health of Families and the Entire World

While on his historic trip to the Holy Land, our Holy Father celebrated Mass in Bethlehem. In Manger Square, he focused on how the Child Jesus was a sign of God's tenderness, and how children in today's world are a sign for all of us about the health of our society and world:

"This will be a sign for us: you will find a child...".

Perhaps that little boy or girl is crying. He is crying because he is hungry, because she is cold, because he or she wants to be picked up and held in our arms... Today too, children are crying, they are crying a lot, and their crying challenges us. In a world which daily discards tons of food and medicine there are children, hungry and suffering from easily curable diseases, who cry out in vain. In an age which insists on the protection of minors, there is a flourishing trade in weapons which end up in the hands of child-soldiers, there is a ready market for goods produced by the slave labor of small children. Their cry is stifled:

the cry of these children is stifled! They must fight, they must work, they cannot cry! But their mothers cry for them, as modern-day Rachels: they weep for their children, and they refuse to be consoled (cf. Mt 2:18).

"This will be a sign for you": you will find a child. The Child Jesus, born in Bethlehem, every child who is born and grows up in every part of our world, is a diagnostic sign indicating the state of health of our families, our communities, our nation. Such a frank

and honest diagnosis can lead us to a new kind of lifestyle where our relationships are no longer marked by conflict, oppression and consumerism, but fraternity, forgiveness and reconciliation, solidarity and love. — Pope Francis 2014-05-25 (http://www.news.va/en/news/popes-homily-at-bethlehems-church-of-the-nativity)

Fr. John and several parishioners spent the day touring the town of Immokalee this past week. Habitat for Humanity has sponsored and built several communities within the township. Our Lady of Guadalupe has dedicated their mission to the poor and homeless, and Catholic Charities, along with our own Ladies of Charity, have supported them with a USDA-

sponsored Food Bank, a soup kitchen for hot lunches, utility support, a clothing bank, and a shower program.

The tour included current dilapidated housing and living environments of the poor workers of Immokalee. Additionally, Fr. John met with individuals who have benefited from Habitat for Humanity houses and those who are still crying out for support.

St. John is developing a program specifically to support both the efforts of

Catholic Charities and Habitat for Humanity. We can take our Mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God and turn it into action just a few miles down the road from our own front doors. Stay tuned for details on how we as a parish will provide assistance. Our Pope has asked us to focus on ensuring every person in the world has food and shelter. That is our focus and where the Holy Spirit will work through all of us. Although this is just a snapshot of one month of operating costs, it is important for our parishioners to see the substantial expenses we incur monthly. Some of the above expenses were slightly higher in April versus other months due to the fact that Easter fell in April this year. As I have mentioned previously, the finance council is working diligently to further reduce our operating expenses.

I received a call from a parishioner last week regarding the Catholic Faith Appeal. She is a faithful supporter of the CFA but suggested that I should occasionally allude to the programs that the appeal supports rather than simply ask that everyone support the CFA. The funds raised by the CFA are allocated to the following areas: Pastoral outreach, pastoral ministries, support of missions and poorer parishes, a portion of Catholic Charities budget, the Offices of Worship, Ministry, and Vocations, Department of Education, support of schools, and administration of the Diocese. As you will see from the collection summary, we are slowly inching our way towards the \$300,000.00 mark with respect to the 2014 Catholic Faith Appeal. If you are a remaining seasonal resident or visitor, please continue to make your checks payable to the CFA with St. John the Evangelist in the memo line. Thank you for your unrelenting support of the Catholic Faith Appeal.




#### Men's Club Scholarship Recipients



## The Gift of Loving and Hopeful Assurance

s we gather to celebrate the Feast of the Ascension, we recall the great event of Jesus' return to the Father's house. In Matthew's gospel we are told how Jesus appeared in his risen state before his followers. As soon as they see him, their immediate response is one of worship; we also learn about the doubts that took hold of their hearts. The profundity of the risen Christ's presence takes them beyond an ordinary to an extraordinary reality in which they offer their worship to the divine teacher


who had walked with them. No one can easily answer the question of why the eleven disciples doubted on the day of the Lord's ascension. Maybe the reason was telling them there was no way the man standing before them was Jesus who had been raised from the dead. When Jesus speaks, their doubts dissipate and the eleven are given the ultimate mission to evangelize to the ends of the earth. Jesus passes on his authority to them and enables them to continue his work of redemption and salvation. He tells them they will not be alone on their mission. His promise? "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." The reading from the Acts of the Apostles, tells us how Jesus was taken up into the clouds and vanished from their sight. The angels inform them that Jesus had returned to the Father's house, and one day he will come again.

The Ascension of the Lord is a gift to all Christians because it reminds us of our destiny. It calls us to a deeper reality and knowledge of God's purpose for us. Each one of us is gifted with our earthly existence in order to glorify God. In baptism we are told that we share in his divine life by participating in the ongoing reality of the gospel of life. By following Jesus' gospel and living God's will, we can realize the promise that one day we will be brought to the threshold of eternal life and invited into the Father's house. The Spirit that hovered over the waters of the deep at the beginning of creation is

the same Spirit we are imbued with at baptism; and the same Spirit that remains with the Church today and inspires us to follow Christ.

Our challenge as Christians is that we open ourselves to the presence of the Lord in all things. We discern this gift through the power of that same Holy Spirit that descended upon the apostles at Pentecost. Our real hope, as people of the Way, is that we will see the Lord Jesus face to face one day in the joys of heaven. That is the ultimate dream that all of us can ever hope for!

The day that Jesus was taken up to heaven marked another milestone in salvation history. It meant that the people left behind would have to continue his work and ministry on earth. Jesus' command was very simple and clear: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." Once the disciples received the Holy Spirit, they were able to make this command of Jesus a reality. As a result of their missionary activity, Christians occupy the seats of churches all over the world today. When we are received into the Church through the sacrament of baptism, we also are led into the deeper reality of Jesus' command to love and know the Father in heaven. Today, we are asked to remember that Jesus Christ does not abandon his Church but rather journeys with it through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The healing and teaching that Jesus brought to the people who walked with him on those dusty roads of Galilee and sat with him on the mountainside as he taught, remains through the Church's activity today.




