

St. John Welcomes New Director of Family Mission and Communications

In July, Pope Francis spoke about the need for "the Holy Spirit to Renew Our Lives" (*Vatican Radio: http://en.radiovaticana. va/news/2013/07/06/pope_francis:_the_holy_spirit_renews_our_lives/en1-708070*) through the parable: "New Wine in New Wineskins" (Matthew 9:17).

"In the Christian life, even in the life of the Church, there

are old structures, passing structures: it is necessary to renew them! And the Church has always been attentive to this, with dialogue with cultures . . . It always allows itself to be renewed according to places, times, and persons."

We have a unique opportunity as a parish to develop and enhance our Church's engagement with the Youth and Family programs in the new Evangelization. This "full-lifecycle" strengthening of the services, programs,

and efforts will be called Family Mission. Further details on this exciting endeavor will be provided as part of its upcoming outreach and communications. As part of this new wineskin, I have asked Jean-Paul Boucher, the current lead of the Altar Service Ministry, to take a position as the new Director of Family Mission and Communications. JP will be keeping you abreast of upcoming events in the parish and share with you the

great endeavors of the new Evangelization. Please join me in welcoming him to the St. John family. He will be available at the office if you would like to discuss any questions or thoughts you might have about the Family Mission.

Jean-Paul (JP) Boucher grew up in a small suburban town in Southwestern Connecticut. While attending high school, he

met and fell in love with his wife, Donna. Upon receiving an Air Force scholarship to Georgetown University, JP moved to Washington, DC. He graduated with a History degree, concentrating in Ancient Rome and the Middle East. He learned early on from his Jesuit mentors how essential the integration of spirituality, social action, and ministry are to truly live the Faith.

He embarked on a 20year career in information technology. His focus

on large, advanced technology solutions allowed him to become an industry-recognized expert in computing

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.





Mid-way through the month of January it looks as though we have finally found winter in Southwest Florida. High temperatures for the past several days have actually been below normal and it looks as though we may have a continued stretch of at least average temperatures for the next week or so. High temperatures

in the mid 70s with lows in the 50s sounds pretty good to me so let us all enjoy this magnificent weather while it lasts.

The final results are in for the 2013 Catholic Faith Appeal. To say that our parishioners really came through again this year is an understatement. As you know, our assessment (or goal) was \$454,000.00. We officially ended the annual appeal with pledges of \$484,194.19. This means that we exceeded our goal by \$28,194.19. This is now the second straight year that we have exceeded our goal substantially. The entire surplus will now be returned to the parish free of assessment to be used for whatever programs and ministries are most in need. Thank you again for your extreme outpouring of generosity.

Tickets for the 16th Annual Super Bowl Party are flying out of the office at a very brisk pace. If you would like to join us, please get your ticket soon. We are limiting sales to the first 300 to ensure that everyone has a great viewing experience. Your \$25 ticket (price has not increased in 16 years) will entitle you to a full buffet and an open bar with beer and wine included. Ask those who have attended in the past and they will confirm that this is a great party. Although we are not yet sure of the matchup, we do know that there will be representation from the west coast. Peyton Manning and Tom Brady will decide this weekend whether or not we have representation from New England or whether this is a west coast/mountain west Super Bowl. Either way, it will be a great game in a great atmosphere. Proceeds from this event will be used for the benefit of our Youth Ministry program.

As the director of our Memorial Garden, I have written on more than one occasion about the guidelines for placing flowers and other items on gravesites. Every year during the holidays, we take a softer approach as many loved ones visit and place anything and everything in the Memorial Garden. This will serve as notice that we are going to remove all non-approved items from the garden this coming week. For those who are not aware, I will once again address the proper protocol for placing flowers on gravesites. One glance around the garden and you will notice that there are countless flowering shrubs and annuals. Some examples are geraniums, hibiscus, knockout roses, penta and more. We kindly ask that rather than placing an obtrusive bouquet or display on the grave that you instead simply pick one of the many flowering


varieties and place that flower on the grave of your loved one. Miniature American flags are always welcomed and will not be removed. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Following up on my prior paragraph, limited space still remains in our Memorial Garden. As mentioned before, this pricing is extremely competitive and only a fraction of what you will pay at a cemetery. Annual Contribution Statements were mailed out last week to all parishioners who contributed at least \$100.00 during the 2013 calendar year. In year's prior, we have mailed statements to everyone that contributed at least \$1 in the calendar year. By using this new threshold, we will save money and eliminate a lot of hassle for those who do not itemize. Remember that the IRS now requires your cancelled check or credit card receipt as acknowledgement to accompany your statement from Saint. John the Evangelist. The statements were mailed "first class" in order to eliminate any problems with the bulk rate mailing process. As you know, we have made great strides in the past several years to ensure that your statement is accurate. If there is an error on your statement, please contact me as soon as possible so that I may research and rectify the situation. The following are examples of contributions that will NOT appear on your annual statement from Saint John the Evangelist. 1) If you have been contributing to the Catholic Faith Appeal in the 2013 calendar year and have exceeded the IRS \$250.00 threshold, you will receive an acknowledgement directly from the Diocese of Venice. If you did not meet the \$250.00 threshold for CFA contributions in 2013, you will need to use cancelled checks for tax purposes. 2) If you made a contribution directly to the Jamaica Outreach Program (JOP), your gift will be recognized by JOP. 3) If you made a contribution to the St. Vincent De Paul Society (directly or through the parish,) your gift will be recognized by the St. Vincent De Paul Society. 4) If you deposited loose cash in the offertory and did not use an envelope, we have no record of the gift. 5) If you are not a registered parishioner, you will not receive a statement. Thank you very much to all of our parishioners for your generous support in 2013. We would not be able to efficiently operate without your generosity.







ohn the Baptist must have brought tears to the eyes of his listeners the day he proclaimed Jesus to be the Lamb of God. It was a day when a dream came true. John had been calling the people of his time to the baptism of repentance because the time was near at hand. The day he watched Jesus coming toward him was a day of recognition – Jesus was the Son of God who would baptize the world with the Holy Spirit and set it on fire! The people who followed John were hoping for the promised Messiah – now their hopes were realized and, as the gospel continues, they leave John to follow Jesus to embrace the wisdom of God!

How is this good news for us today? As the Church continues to proclaim the gospel in the modern world, we are asked to behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world and allow him to lead us. The Holy Eucharist reminds us of this as the priest holds high the Host after the breaking of the bread. This is beyond all imagining and beyond a shadow of a doubt, the real presence of Jesus in our community. Such a divine presence demands a respect, reverence and deep faith from all of us as we gather to celebrate the Mass. However, we are called to go further than that also. As we end the Mass, the priest or deacon tells us, "Go in peace glorifying the Lord by your life!" In concrete this means that we are to be attentive and to watch for the Lord throughout our week. We do so by encountering Christ within our families, the domestic Church and within our community. In a sense, the disciples of John had it easier than us because they could see Jesus with their own eyes and hear him with their own ears. For us, all these years later, we must discern where Christ

is to be found in the world today. Such discernment comes through our reflection, prayer, and a willingness to follow Christ in all that we say and do.

Once we have knowledge of Jesus, the challenge is to experience him in the here and now. This requires a conscious effort on our part to fully embrace him in our lives by being open to his presence in all things. Jesus invites each one of us to "Come and see" where he lives. As we move through this year, every gospel we hear proclaimed will challenge us to go deeper. Every encounter of Jesus that we hear of in the gospel will ultimately disturb our complacency to go the extra mile – to bring forgiveness where there is a reluctance to forgive, to heal where there is pain, to bring hope where there is despair, and to establish peace within the broken realities of our lives and of the world.

Lord, in this New Year may we watch for you. Help us to embrace your message as difficult as it may be. Let our firm belief in the Eucharist lead us to the many ways that you reveal yourself to us every day. Wherever our lives take us may we always be open to your transforming love. May our lives be a reflection of your presence in the world. Amen!

THE HOME CHURCH

On a weekend family trip some years ago, our trusty minivan was caught in a snowstorm. My husband and I took turns driving in the near white-out conditions, eyes straining to make out even a short patch of the road ahead. shoulders hunching with tension.

During a spell as navigator, I turned to check on the unusually quiet children. The two youngest were sound asleep. The two oldest were turned around in their seats, looking out the back window. "What are you two doing?" I asked.


