Sacrament of Baptism

As part of an on-going effort to communicate the renewed focus and efforts of our Parish Mission, I wanted to start a new series in our bulletin, Getting #ToKnow Our Staff. Each week, we will spotlight a staff member here at St. John, including some of their responsibilities and background. That way, if you have a question, or need some assistance, you can put a name and face to those that will be helping you.

Getting #ToKnow Our Staff - Facilities and Project

Manager Rich Neville

St. John has some of the most beautiful and engaging church facilities in Southwest Florida (in my humble opinion). This is due to a large group of volunteers (especially our Buildings and Grounds Committee) and staff that work tirelessly year-round. These facilities continue to serve our parish well, even as they reach into their second decade and beyond. You may have seen in the past few months,



however, that we have taken a very active and proactive stance in cleaning and maintaining our buildings. This is due in large part to one of our newest employees, Rich Neville.

It was a wandering path that led me to Saint John the Evangelist. I had just declined an offer from an organization that I had been interviewing with for three months. After a few minutes I began to question the practicality of my decision. In my heart I felt that if it took that long to make a hiring decision they would not be decisive in the management and development of their properties. Thirty minutes later Scott called me and we had a brief and honest conversation about St. John and the buildings and grounds. I knew this was where I was supposed to be.

I have 20 years of experience in commercial and multi-family construction management. Much of that time spent in repair and renovation. I find that I am drawn to more challenging projects.

We have already seen Rich's capabilities significantly enhance our abilities here at St. John. From leveling our parking lots during Parish Beautification Day, to managing

complex concurrent projects for air conditioning, fire control, and cleaning at the same time, we are blessed to have Rich on staff, leading the charge.

I am excited about the future of Saint John the Evangelist.

#ToKnow – New Wineskin for Programs at St. John: Life Center Introduction

For those of you who have been following my weekly discussions here, you may remember my penchant for Our Holy Father's discussion how our Catholic Church must focus on renewal in order to draw, keep, and engage all people to our faith. He uses the Gospel of Luke to showcase how Jesus ask for "new wine" to be put in "new wineskins" (http://w2.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/cotidie/2014/documents/papa-francesco-cotidie_20140905_new-wine-new-wineskins.html). St. John is pressing the grapes for our new wine as we speak, with new and renewed programs and events for all the members of our Parish Family every week, from Trunk-or-Treat to Dad's Rule CYO-like sports programs to the Divorced and Separated Support Group to the Widows Social Activity Program. What we really need, however, is a new wineskin to put all these wonderful efforts into.

We are today introducing a new chapter of Saint John the Evangelist. We have been given the approval by the Bishop to build a new facility on our campus, a "Life Center". This

new Life Center will become the beating heart of the parish, constantly in motion with activities and events for the entire spectrum of individuals and families at St. John and the community as a whole.

There is a desperate need in the area of Naples to provide an active and involved community that includes events, programs, nourishment, and engagement, especially for Catholic individuals. Youth and young adults are leaving the Catholic Church because they are not finding connection to their lives. Too often, families and individuals will leave the parish grounds immediately after Mass, or simply pass by church on their way to sports or musical events at other churches in the area. The Life Center will become the beacon of activities for North Naples, from morning coffee and get-togethers for parents after dropping their children at school, card games and wellness activities for retirees after Mass, to afterschool activity programs for middle schoolers, to evening musical events on the stage with refreshments. It will be a place where our most "experienced" parish members can meet and talk over coffee and some food.

The Life Center provides something for everyone.
Full-service, pre-prepared food for breakfast, lunch, and snacks as well as evening intermission drinks and hors d'oeuvres. Easy, resort-style exercise facilities along with high-impact, crossfit-style space for those who are looking to get into and stay in shape.
Basketball courts for pick-up games and a theatrical stage for plays. Kid-friendly game room and play yard as well as adult contemplative space. Outdoor seating for relaxing, bocce courts for team play, and a fishing dock to spend time with other members of the community. There will be events and programs around the clock to enliven the parish and connect us all to each other and our faith.





63 O Come, O Come Emmanuel (verses 1, 5, & 6) Traditional

The O Antiphons and Advent Tom Oran

Each of the seven verses of **O Come, O Come Emmanuel** is associated with a particular day of the Octave (or "eight days") before Christmas Eve, the "Golden Nights": December 17th through the 23rd. The "O Antiphons", as they are known, each employ a different title for the Messiah, as foretold by the prophets Isaiah and Micah, of Jesus the Christ. The Church has used them at Vespers (Evening Prayer) for as many as fifteen hundred years, and perhaps even longer. They include, beginning on December 17, O Sapientia (O Wisdom), then O Adonai (O Lord), O Radix lesse (O Root of Jesse), O Clavis Davidicae (O Key of David), O Oriens (O Dawn), O Rex gentium (O King of nations), and O Emmanuel (O God with us). In a fascinating detail, the first letters of each title, read backwards, also spell the Latin phrase ERO CRAS, "Tomorrow, I come", a phrase completed only on Dec. 23 with the singing of the final antiphon. Thus: after we have called upon the Lord to come to us, he answers us, "ero cras!", referring to his coming in the great Solemnity of the Nativity! The antiphon for today, Dec. 21st, O Oriens, is translated below (cf. Isaiah 9:2). (V.5 was Saturday's antiphon.)

Φriens, splenδor lucis aeternae, et sol justitiae: veni, et illumina seδentes in tenebris, et umbra mortis.

O Dawn, splendor of eternal light and sun of justice:

Come, and enlighten those sitting in darkness and the shadow of death.

Humble Servant Says "Yes" to God

t is the tradition of the Church to focus on the person of Mary for the last Sunday of Advent. Over the last 2000 years of Christian history, the Church never worshipped Mary but gave her a place of honor. Mary has a central place in our Church and hearts because she bore the Son of God in her womb and gave birth to the promise of salvation. Have you ever wondered what Mary was doing the day that the angel Gabriel came to her? Was she about her household chores or out taking a walk, pondering life? That we will never know! However, what we do know is that this young virgin, who seemed to be like any other girl of her day, received an extraordinary call and task to which she said yes. Mary's 'Yes' was a response of total abandonment and trust. She did not know how she could conceive without engaging in intimacy. Asking this simple question and listening to the angel's answer gave her the confidence that anything is possible for God: "May it be done to me according to your word." The day the angel left Mary was the beginning of her journey which would lead her deeper into the heart of God.

Mary of Nazareth is a model of discipleship for us. She is the greatest of the Saints. Mary is the




Mother of God and the Mother of the Church. The abandonment, that Mary is witnesses to, encourages us to abandon ourselves to what is nonessential and embrace God's will. Throughout the Scriptures, we see that Mary contemplates the events taking place, holding them sacred to her heart. Likewise, we are asked to prayerfully consider where God is in our lives and acknowledge the sacred gifts that He has set before us. In the midst of the suffering of Jesus who was put to death as a result of Roman capital punishment, she stands by her Son's executioners and supports him as the life drains from his veins. She returns to the upper room of fears to await his return. All the time she ponders these things in her heart, trusting in God's mercy.

As we approach Christmas Day, we reflect on our human experiences that make up our individual stories. For many there is a lot to celebrate — memories of the past and joyful events in family life over the last year. For others, sadness comes upon them because

loved ones have passed away or because of a family or work problem. Regardless, in all of these human events, God is with us. Each of us stands on the holy ground of our experiences. No matter how joyful or sorrowful our lives are, each one of our lives is sacred. Like Mary, we are invited to ponder the great gifts that God puts in our path.

The prayers for Messiah are granted


But how could it happen

Behind the Surprise By Janel Esker

My husband turns fifty this year, and his family traditionally expects a giant surprise party when each of the eleven siblings hits the big 5-0. However, I've already informed my in-laws that (1) my husband doesn't want a party and (2) I exhausted my party-planning abilities on our wedding reception: "I'll be incapable of throwing any more parties until 2075." After all, while the moment everyone jumps out and yells, "Surprise!" is terrific, it takes a heck of a lot of coordination, work, and careful—often sneaky!—planning to get there.

I sometimes wonder if the angel Gabriel was accompanied by a heavenly chorus of angels shouting, "Surprise!" to Mary. How shocked she must have been at this unexpected announcement. The gospel tells us she was "greatly troubled"—she must have been confused and very afraid, not only at being chosen for such a profound mission, but also at the prospect of being an unmarried pregnant woman in a society that stoned such women to death.

Yet behind this "Surprise!" was God's magnificent plan. The surprise was on Mary and on us—that God would dare to become human to bring salvation to all people. Despite her initial shock and fear, Mary was open enough to trust God's plan and speak the yes that transformed the world.

Our preparations for this great surprise (better known as Christmas) are ending soon, yet we know the divine plan continues to unfold. God no doubt has plans to surprise us—with comfort in our pain, with a challenge for our growth, with a mission for us to undertake. Will we be open enough to say yes like Mary? And how might our yes transform ourselves, others, or even the world? †
