SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

#ToKnow: Facilities and Operations – Progress for Parish Improvement

We have had a very busy week when it comes to our facilities and some of the issues that the overuse and taxing of the campus have illustrated due to our extremely busy parish life. Did you see on our Capital Campaign page that we have over 4,200 events every year, and that is not including the Masses? That is extraordinary. When you have that many events and activities, however, things can get a bit hectic. We have Irish Dancers practicing in classrooms while a Sock Hop is going on in the Ballroom. We have community support groups like Al-Anon meeting next to the Naples Council of World Affairs.

Last Wednesday, we had an incident where a gas smell was detected by a group meeting in the Library. I want to thank Natalie Campbell, Tauni Grossklas and the entire set of volunteer catechists who ensured the safety and well-being of our Faith Formation classes while the fire department checked out the situation. Our gas company confirmed that we did not have any issue with human error or our equipment, only that the smell came from our gas tanks because they were extremely low. There was no danger, but it does give us an opportunity to refine our safety and security procedures as a Parish. We have already taken certain steps to ensure the kitchen is only accessed by authorized personnel and groups, as well as updating our emergency procedures. We have been working with the Fire Department to determine the proper signage and capacity requirements for our facilities, making sure that the safety of our Parish Family is our top priority.

Since the protection of our parishioners is paramount, we have instituted measures in our parking areas as well. We had issues with speeding and poor parking in our parking lots this past

weekend. New speed limit signs have been placed around the lots to ensure we all keep to the 15 miles per hour limit and we are all vigilant about how we drive around the church. We need to remember that small children are attending Faith Formation and could be walking in the parking area around the same time as Sunday Masses. No Parking signs have also been placed in critical areas that are used for emergency vehicle passage, and we have to work together as a community to enforce those locations. This includes the entire driveway in front of both the PLC and Claussen Center. We would not want an ambulance to be blocked from getting to a critical situation in our buildings because of an improperly parked car. There are plenty of parking spaces, even if they are a little further away from the church. If you have never been to the back parking lot, I highly recommend it, especially since that will be the best spot for visiting our Life Center once it is built.

#ToServe – Ladies of Charity and Knights of Columbus Combine for Best Ever Ash Wednesday Event

It fills me with joy to say that our first ever Feeding Hunger, Filling Hearts event for Ash Wednesday raised over a recordbreaking \$12,000 for the Immokalee-based Guadalupe Social Services. That number will be even higher based on the support from groups like Pelican Sound, the Ladies of Charity, and the Knights of Columbus. From the impassioned music to the donation of various soups from restaurants in the area (shout out to Steamers for a delicious Clam Chowder!), the event could not have gone better as a first step for our Immokalee Mission Team, which brings together the various groups in the parish to support the area and people of Immokalee. 





Cleansing Absurdity



he arrival of Jesus as Messiah has a profound impact on our lives as Christians. Jesus is the one who brings the salvation. He is the bridge between heaven and earth. The teaching of Jesus challenges the conventional wisdom of his day and cleanses the absurd practices that had become commonplace in the Judaic faith. In today's gospel we encounter an angry Christ. The people of Jesus' day were hungering for intimacy with God as they tried to reconcile their failures. It was common for the people to sacrifice animals in atonement for their sins. The temple traders benefited from the people's guilt and the sale of animals for sacrificial offering became a lucrative business. Jesus recognizes the people's faith. He confronts the abuses of the day traders. The anger that Jesus demonstrates is a justified refusal to allow anyone to fool around with God's mercy. The temple was a house of

prayer — not a place for people to be taken advantage of. Jesus' sign would be to destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days. For the discerning Christian we know this means his death and resurrection, the once-and-for-all sacrifice that would bring atonement for sin!

The Christian experience has from time to time bargained with the mercy of God. The Reformation occurred because of the absurd practices that had become the fabric of the ecclesial life. One of the common abuses was that of the sale of indulgences. People believed if they bought and sold indulgences that they could buy their way into heaven. The only problem was that the Reformers went too far. The Reformation provoked the muchneeded reform in the Roman Catholic Church. The Counter Reformation grappled with the pastoral realities of the Church prompting change in regard to the education of its priests. It also defined exactly what the Church taught and believed. All the abuses that existed in regard to the sale of indulgences was confronted and ended. The mercy of God was to be found through the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

If we are truthful with ourselves, we have all played games in our relationship with God. How many of us promise God that we are going to

walk away from a recurring sin and break that promise? People find it hard to let go of the sin of the past. One of the greatest sins we commit is not allowing God to forgive us. It is absurd to believe that God will not forgive us when we are contrite. The whole project of Jesus' mission was to reconcile the world to himself by the blood of His cross. We can use the Ten Commandments to see what God expects from us. *Each commandment points to the significance of right relationship with God and with one another*. Human weakness breaks that right relationship. However, God constantly invites us to come back and to be reconciled with Him. This is the beauty of Lent. We are reminded every time we celebrate mass in the once-and-for-all unbloodied sacrifice that Christ desires reconciliation and intimacy with us. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we can name our sin and allow

Christ to forgive us and bring us incomprehensible healing.

The cleansing of the temple reminds us that mercy is sacred to God. Jesus was consumed by his love of the temple which was his Father's house.

Prayer

Be merciful to us, O Lord, for we have sinned! May our hunger for you bring us to the threshold of eternal life. Enable us to experience your Truth and forgiveness through the gift of the Church. Encourage us in the midst of failure and help us to move on. Create within us a new heart so that we may experience You in new ways. Amen.




