SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

Getting #ToKnow Our Parish Grounds: Prayer Garden for Quiet Reflection and Stations

For many of our Parish Family, the church is the singular part of our campus they interact with, aside from the parking lots and walkways. We are much more than the church, which will always be the core of our community and our faith. As part of our continuing illustration of St. John as an enlivening, inviting place for our parish and our community, I wanted to showcase some lesser-known areas of our facilities and grounds. Hopefully, you will get a chance to visit them the next time you come.

I have not been a parishioner of St. John to have experienced the open "back doors" of the church. Did you know that the wall immediately behind our Tabernacle is actually a large door, opening to the outside? It was news to me when I first started working here. With the gorgeous Tabernacle now in its place behind the altar, we no longer open those doors.

However, the space behind the church has taken on a new role. It is now the location of our Prayer Garden.

As one of the most gorgeous and serene locations on campus, the Paniccia Prayer Garden





The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: Year B

Exodus 24:3-8 Psalm 116:12-13, 15-16, 17-18 Hebrews 9:11-15 Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Priceless Treasure Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

he Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ which we celebrate today, teaches all Catholics throughout the world about the centrality of the Eucharist. Through the gift of the Eucharist we are brought to the edge of eternity where the risen Christ is present to His Church. As we invoke the Holy Spirit to come down upon the gifts of bread and wine,

we become aware of a love beyond all telling. We recall the words of the Last Supper and the Sacrifice that took place on Calvary as we offer the unbloodied sacrifice at the altar of God. There are some Christian communities who simply have communion services, emphasizing their communion with one another rather than divine interaction. Others say the bread and wine are merely symbols, not the body and blood of

Reflection Questions

- 1. In what ways is the Catholic tradition different to Protestantism in regard to the teaching on the Eucharist?
- 2. How does your faith in the real presence comfort you?
- 3. Do you allow Jesus to feed your soul or do you allow other things to satisfy you?

Christ. Catholicism teaches the doctrine of transubstantiation – that is, the bread and wine actually become the body and blood of Jesus.

In Lumen Gentium (Dogmatic Constitution of the Church) paragraph 11, we are told, "Taking part in the Eucharistic sacrifice, the source and summit of the Christian life, they offer the divine victim to God and themselves along with it." In the breaking of the bread, Christ becomes available to each one of us in a very tangible way. Jesus' life is broken for us, so that in the midst of our fragile lives we can appreciate that God understands. Each one of us through weakness admits that we are not worthy. On the other hand the words of the gospel give each of us the dignity of being called a son or daughter of God, making us completely worthy!

Through the gift of the real presence we are given a priceless treasure that is heaven's treasure. To the nonbeliever, the simple gifts presented to the altar remain just as bread and wine. However, people who have faith realize that the food and cup offered at the altar enable them to be fed and nourished, not only in the present moment, but for all eternity. At the moment of Holy Communion, Jesus Christ offers his body and blood as the life force for the Christian community. The Mass is the Sacred Meal in which we are fed by the Word and nourished by the Sacrament. It is also a moment that becomes timeless in which we relive the

events that give us salvation in Christ. The once and for all sacrifice of Calvary is relived again and again, reminding us of the great sacrifice that will lead us to eternal life. As we come to the conclusion of the Mass the minister sends us forth to encounter the Christ in the gift of another.

Wisdom of the Fathers

"The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. This truth does not simply express a daily experience of faith, but recapitulates the heart of the mystery of the Church. In a variety of ways she joyfully experiences the constant fulfillment of the promise: "Lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age" (Mt 28:20), but in the Holy Eucharist, through the changing of bread and wine into the body and blood of the Lord, she rejoices in this presence with unique intensity. Ever since Pentecost, when the Church, the People of the New Covenant, began her pilgrim journey towards her heavenly homeland, the Divine Sacrament has continued to mark the passing of her days, filling them with confident hope.

The Second Vatican Council rightly proclaimed that the Eucharistic sacrifice is "the source and summit of the Christian life". "For the most holy Eucharist contains the Church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our Passover and Living Bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life-giving by the Holy Spirit, he offers life to men". Consequently, the gaze of the Church is constantly turned to her Lord, present in the Sacrament of the Altar, in which she discovers the full manifestation of his boundless love."

A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 -9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.


