Personal notes are sent to Fr. John and me all the time, discussing the current and future plans of our Parish Family. This one specifically illustrates the focus of our Capital Campaign:

Dear JP & Mr Lichwalla,

Having attended one of the "awareness" meetings to learn more about the campaign for the new Life Center, I am excited to help as a volunteer.

My mother had a home built in Naples Park in 1985 and we attended Mass at St. William's Catholic Church when staying in the area. The property where St. John the Evangelist now stands was just a vast empty piece of land, covered with trees and brush. My brother and I would scurry along the walking path, watching for snakes as we ventured toward the tennis courts adjacent to the elementary school. Naples Park Elementary School became a place or worship for 4 years, starting in 1988 when the "mission church" was announced, through 1990 when the campaign funds were in place to commence groundbreaking and concluded when the structure was completed in 1992.

It's been truly amazing to witness firsthand the development of that acreage over the years! Remembering at one time and not long ago, how it was just a piece of barren land which never would have been developed if it wasn't for the vision of a few and support of many! For me personally, this campus has been both a place of worship or refuge, depending on my own life circumstances over the years. Both the Claussen and Parish [Life] Centers remain a focal point for the many ministries supported by the church. The Prayer Garden, Memorial Garden and Lest We Forget Memorial are retreats — offering places for peace, reflection and remembrance.

It'll be very exciting to have a new [Family]Life Center for recreational, dining and companionship opportunities that will be "inclusive" for people of ALL ages, regardless of marital or socioeconomic status. Fr. John, reflecting on words from Pope Francis, reminds us that our life circumstances change, based on decisions by us and others, but the one constant in this world and in our lives is the presence of God's Love!! I pray the community of St. John the Evangelist will see the New [Family]Life Center as a beacon of God's Light and Love. I hope they will embrace this new venue with a spirit of Faith, Hope and Love and support this venture with their time, talent and treasure, just as others did many years ago.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

Parish Mission & Life

#ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe — Finance Council

It always amazes me to see just how much is going on here at St. John, and how many people dedicate so much of their lives to the ministry of our Parish Family. Some of you may not realize the opportunities you have to get involved in such amazing and rewarding functions of the church, from supporting the Masses to assisting the local community. The following series will give you a snapshot on some of these programs, along with some stories of how wonderful it can be to engage our faith through action.

One of our most sacred duties as leaders of our Parish Family is to ensure we vigilantly maintain and operate our church efficiently and effectively, always focused on our Parish Mission and Pastoral Vision. You entrust in us your gifts of time, talent, and treasure. In order to ensure we accomplish our Mission together, our Parish Family has a very dedicated group called the Finance Council, whose responsibilities include oversight and prioritization of the budgetary planning process as well as determining key initiatives for the Parish to focus on. This past year, St. John took on the daunting task of performing an inventory assessment, as part of our asset management initiative. We had to go through every inch of our campus, accounting for each chair, each chalice, and each computer. Imagine looking around your home after living in it for 26 years and then writing down everything you have amassed in that time, from pictures on the wall to freezers in the kitchen. Anything worth \$500 (as a single item or in bulk, like the 46 eight-top tables we have in the Ballroom) needed to be accounted for so we can understand how much we have, how much we need, and how long those items will be usable. Every item, like a refrigerator, or an AC unit, has a lifespan, and we should be planning on replacing them so we can ensure we can afford to do so. This is the first time St. John has ever done such an inventory. It is thanks to the Finance Council, who took the lead to accomplish this task, that we now understand our physical and fiscal environment.

The Financial Policies of the Diocese of Venice illustrate the function of each Parish Finance Council: to assist the Pastor in the administration of the income and expenses of the parish, in an advisory and consultative capacity. The members of the Finance Council are to be parishioners who are competent in financial matters. The DOV Policies also highlight the Finance Council Responsibilities:

- 1. To ensure that the parish employs sound business practices
- 2. To review and coordinate the parish annual fiscal budget with department heads
- 3. To review the quarterly financial reports sent to the Diocese

- 4. To review monthly & YTD financials, i.e., budget vs. actual variances
- 5. To review contracts and agreements
- 6. To encourage support of diocesan fund-raising projects
- 7. To assist with parish financial campaigns, drives and collections

At St. John, we are blessed to have a wonderful set of individuals who have joined our Finance Council. They are led by **Barbara Kuryea**, one of the kindest and most generous people I know. Barbara is President and founder of AP Consulting Services, an independent consulting firm dedicated to preparing third party assessments of accounts payable operations to identify areas of improvement and to educating companies on "best practices."



Prior to consulting, Barbara's 30 year plus tenure at Scott Paper Company/ Kimberly Clark Tissue Company covered a broad spectrum of corporate

management positions including re-engineering the purchasing and accounts payable functions across 15 manufacturing sites, saving millions in staffing and inventory costs. Her key leadership role was establishing and managing a Shared Financial Services Center for 30,000 plus employees, which included Accounts Payable, Payroll, Accounts Receivable and Employee Expense Reimbursements. These Best Practice models have been used as a benchmark for Fortune 500 companies and have been the foundation for the Procure to Pay "Best Practices."

After retirement, I wanted to serve God in His church and in our community by sharing the talents He gave me. In my role on the Parish Finance Council, I will ensure that our parish's income and expenses are accurately reported and accurately accounted for. And as a mentor to single mothers living at the Providence House, I am able to serve and support God's less fortunate in our community.

Members of the Ushers and Greeters Ministry know what it is like to brighten someone's day, and they will tell you it takes very little effort and time.


All you need to do is smile, be willing to meet and help other people, and it only takes as little as an hour a week or an hour a month or anything in between. The schedule is very flexible.

All parishioners are invited to attend one or both of the Mass tapings.





Reflection Questions

- 1. How is today's gospel teaching me?

t seems so strange to find that the only people who annoy Jesus in the gospels are the religious people – those who criticize others because they think their understanding is the only way to God. In today's gospel, Jesus confronts the Pharisees who are the observers of the Law. The orthodox Jew was expected to follow every precept of the Torah, especially where purification rites were concerned. The Pharisees in the gospel criticized the followers of Christ for not adhering rigidly to the laws of purification. The Pharisees were zealous in the observance of the Law, but fundamental in the execution of the practices of the Law. Jesus recognizes the very Law that was meant to lead people to God had become a stumbling block to people's faith. Laws were meant to bring people closer to God. The external practices of the Law of the Torah were there to remind the people of the interior dispositions which lead one to live a good life. Jesus rebukes the Pharisees because their focus had moved away from making people aware of God's presence, to making sure the systems and practices were strictly followed. In essence, the Pharisees' only concern was the externals. They had no interest for the interior being which shapes the soul.

To believe in God requires more than practice and observances – it involves the language of the heart that leads others to God no matter where they are in life. As a Church we are called into the depth of God's heart. The laws of our Church are there to guide and govern – to lead people to the point where they are touched by God's heart – by God's love. Our laws are not there to control, to set apart or to diminish someone's dignity. They are there, rather, to bring others to the fullness of life in Jesus Christ. We are called to humbly welcome the Word that has been planted in us by Jesus. Our very attitudes must always reflect that of Jesus. Even when someone falls short of the laws of our Church – through our prayers, our witness and our

efforts, we must always be willing to go the extra mile to convince others of the power of God's love and forgiveness. This is not accomplished by words alone. It is communicated by the acts of love and reconciliation that we perform.

Millions of peoples have tried to follow God's will since the time of Abraham. Much knowledge has been imparted upon the world throughout salvation history. This knowledge communicates the wisdom of God passed on to us through those God chose to communicate his message. Jesus Christ

as Word Incarnate brings us the fullness of revelation which is passed on to the Church through the apostles. This knowledge remains with the Catholic Church to bring the whole world to salvation. The challenge for the Church is to transform people and the world through the knowledge and love of God that has been bestowed upon the world. The Magisterium of the Church, the ordained clergy, theologians and catechists in local parishes are entrusted with the sacred duty of handing on this deposit of faith. Each parish throughout the world shares in this great endeavor of transformation. Every individual who lives in the parish must remember that tradition and the practices of the Church are handed onto us to shape our lives and lead us to salvation. All members of the Body of Christ are called to look at the interior disposition of their lives and to nurture that which is perfect and pure.

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Before visiting St. John (or another diocesan screening location) for fingerprinting, applicants must complete the registration form online at: http://www.dov.sofn.net. Registrants will need a photo identification (such as a driver's license), a major credit card and your social security number. After registration is complete, a receipt with a bar code will be issued. New applicants must present this receipt at St. John (or another diocesan screening location) in order to continue the process. Do not make an appointment at St. John until you have the printed receipt with the bar code.

When registering online, choose St. John as the place to get fingerprinted.
