Getting #ToKnow Our Staff: New Sacristan Lan Tran

Many Catholics are not aware of the planning, logistics, and structure needed to successfully perform one of our our most sacred moments, the Mass. The Roman Missal, the book of prayers and instructions for celebrating Mass, has over 1,500 pages. From the color of the altar cloth to the readings to the positioning of vessels, every detail is planned out for every service. Some are very simple, others, like the beautiful Easter Vigil, take weeks of preparation. When we have between 10 to 2,000 people celebrating together, with various liturgical requirements and unique needs, our church requires a group of people dedicated to supporting the priests, the ministries, and the Parish Family within our church. Those individuals are called Sacristans. It is the responsibility of the Sacristans to prepare the church for Mass and ensure a joyous and positive experience for those serving the Mass (clergy, musicians, lectors, ushers, EMEs, and altar servers), and our parishioners and visitors. From opening the church at 7:00 a.m. to closing it up at 6:00 p.m., and for every baptism, funeral, and service in between, the Sacristan prepares our church, stocks our liturgical materials, and handles all the details that allow our priests to focus on pastoral support and engagement with all of us. While they may appear invisible sometimes, the Sacristans are the glue of our liturgical environment.

It saddened me to have to say goodbye to our Sacristan Lorna Woonsam this week. Her dedication to our church is extraordinary and we will miss her in the Sacristy. She will continue to be a wonderful part of our Parish Family. We are very blessed to have in our midst another individual who is equally devoted and ready to lead our Sacristans, Lan Tran. Lan has been assisting Lorna for many years, so she can "hit the ground running" and continue the wonderful efforts we have in place for our Parish Family.

My name is Lan Tran. I have been a member of the church for about 10 years. It has become a very important part of

my life. I am a widowed mother of seven wonderful children and eleven beautiful grandchildren. I am honored to become a part of Saint John the Evangelist. It's a blessing to be able to serve God by working in his church. I look forward to working with everyone in our church community. 

Fr. Bob shared quotes from one of his favorite contemplatives,





Called to Serve

hen we take a glance at civilized society we see very much at play the system of reward and punishment. As children grow in wisdom, behavior, and maturity they are rewarded (at least when I was at school) with a gold star. When individuals achieve great things in their place of work they receive a promotion. In the world of economics when a product is purchased in large volumes the price of the stock goes up because of the principle of supply and demand. The concept of competition and achievement was not alien to the ancient world. People have been vying for power since the time of Cain and Abel. The history of the world has seen the rise and fall of many empires and civilizations. The hunger for power and domination has been a driving force in the human psyche. However, such hunger for greatness and prestige can often become a stumbling block to faith and the will of God.

In today's gospel, the twelve were arguing about who was the greatest. The twelve wanted to know who was going to receive the greatest reward for following Jesus. As we listen to the story we can almost sense Jesus' frustration at the lack of clarity that the disciples had succumbed to. Jesus' message was the contrary. The very ones who follow Jesus are not to receive earthly rewards, but become servants of that world. In God's eyes, no one is more important than another. To serve means to put ourselves last. Is this the way the world thinks? Absolutely not! The world teaches us to look after number one. There are so many reality shows on television which reward people who manage to dominate a group and show the greatest strength. The rules of play are sometimes harsh, hostile, and cruel. Individuals conspire against one another to get to another round of play. The ratings of such shows are very high because many identify with the power of domination and achievement. Jesus' way is clearly contradictory to our world's innate drive for power and domination.

The gospel of Jesus invites us to become 'other centered' - to be selfless in the way we live our lives and to put the needs of others before our own. How many times have we heard someone say, "I'm not dealing with this problem because I have enough of my own?" The way of Jesus discourages practices in the work place that seek to undermine in order to be promoted. As Christians, we are called to do what is right, to love the truth, and walk humbly with God (Micah 6:8). The gospel urges us to move beyond our cultural restraints, notions, and ideas, to embrace the wisdom of Jesus. Our approach to the world must reflect Jesus' approach, not in some things, but in all things. Our personal choices, our economics, our sense of justice, and our beliefs must always identify with the Christ experience and to build on his kingdom that is in the service of all.


The ladies are well represented, but **men need faith formation too!** Men of the parish, please consider attending this great program that is just as relevant to your life as it is for the ladies!!

Becoming Catholic

The first phase of the RCIA process begins in just a week, on Tuesday, September 29 at 7:00 p.m. in the Seminar Room of the Claussen Family Center. During these first 9 weeks:

- Those who have never been baptized can investigate what it means to be Catholic.
- Those baptized in another Christian tradition can explore the process to come into full communion with the Catholic Church.
- Those baptized Catholic as infants but not raised as Catholic can begin the process to be Confirmed and receive the Eucharist.
- This INQUIRY PERIOD provides the basis upon which the participants can determine whether or not they are called to continue toward membership in the Catholic Church.

Royal Palm Academy Honors Responders and Victims of 9/11

The faculty, staff, students, and parents of Royal Palm Academy (RPA) held a special presentation on Friday, September 11 to remember the first responders and all those who died on 9/11/2001, to thank the men and women who protect us, and to look forward with hope. Everyone gathered in the Courtyard with representatives from the North Naples Fire Control & Rescue District and the Collier County Sheriff's department and Florida D.A.R.E. Officers.

After the entrance of the Knights of Columbus Color Guard (Arthur J. Corr Assembly) and RPA Cub Scouts, the Morning Assembly began with our Scouts raising our American flag. The flag was lowered to half-mast before Dean of Students, Mr. Scott Baier, addressed the audience to honor the fallen and read the poem, "Never Forget". There was prayer and a moment of silence. Stories of RPA families affected by September 11th were introduced to the crowd. Chief Stolz, of the North Collier Fire District, spoke, and Corporal Ramos' two-year-old Spyder, from the K9 Unit, showed off his search and attach skills. At the conclusion of the event, the children had the opportunity to meet and greet the distinguished guests. Inspirational music was selected for this remembrance.
