Held every three years and sponsored by the Holy See's Pontifical Council for the Family, the World Meeting of Families is the world's largest Catholic gathering of families. Each World Meeting of Families has a theme that energizes and enlivens the event while adding great depth of meaning to our understanding of families. The theme of the World Meeting of Families is "Love Is Our Mission: The Family Fully Alive," emphasizing the impact of the love and life of families on our society.

The St. John contingent arrived early in Philly and were immediately welcomed by volunteers in Orange, ready to assist the hundreds of thousands (some



They will be making rosaries for World Mission Rosary, which will be distributed to children in need around the world, as well as Praying with Paint, where artists will teach them how to use art as inspirational support for their souls," said Jean-Paul Boucher, general manager at St. John.

While they were walking around, a sister was drawn to our "To Know, To Love, To Serve" bracelets and she asked for some to give out to the attendees at the conference.

"We were able to spread our message to all those at the conference in a tangible way," said Jean-Paul.

Attendees were treated to the opening ceremony and wonderful keynote speech from newly-appointed Bishop Robert Barron. His focus on "Living as the Image of God: Created for Love and Joy" was inspirational. Some of the group even got to meet Bishop Barron backstage, when the group took a wrong turn looking for an exit.

After the evening Mass, everyone returned to the hotel tired, but spiritually energized for the rest of the week!

## Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

## Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

## #ToKnow — Clinic No Longer Providing Onsite Flu Shots

Unfortunately, I was informed this week that the Hope Visiting Nurses, formally Visiting Nurses of Southwest Florida, no longer provide a community flu shot clinic onsite at locations around the area. They were one of the last groups in the area that would come to a local spot to perform flu shots, so it means St. John will no longer have that service directly at our facilities. Instead, they recommend that our Parish Family go to the local pharmacies, clinics, and doctor offices that are now providing the flu shots at little or no cost.

This is a disappointment to me personally, as I was happy to have this clinic here as St. John, for the parishioners, the ministers, and the staff. We will continue to evaluate new ways to support wellness on our campus, and, hopefully, there will be another group we will be able to engage for this service next year.

# #ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe — Buildings and Grounds Council Renewed to Advise the Parish on the Future of our Facilities

St. John is a beautiful and supportive environment, focused on the growth of the faithful mission of our Catholic Church. In order to accomplish this tremendous feat for so many parishioners and the local community, it takes a tremendous amount of operations and infrastructure. From putting on over 4,000 events on an annual basis, to making sure each funeral

or moment of reflection in our prayer garden is properly prepared, it takes many people dedicated to proactively managing and improving our buildings and grounds. Our Buildings and Grounds Council is leading the charge to improve the spaces we have at St. John.


The scope of the Buildings and Grounds Council is to provide future direction, advice, and insight for the physical plant of Saint John the Evangelist, to include all buildings, the grounds, and all utilities therein. The focus should always be towards achieving the Mission of St. John and enriching the faith of our Parish Family and visitors through the campus of St. John.

The Council will meet quarterly to

evaluate any long-term strategy planning that is required to provide such a large and complex environment with multiple purposes. The Council will advise the Pastor of St. John, the General Manager, and the Facilities Manager on topics brought to the council by the clergy and staff, as well as develop an agenda for each meeting with a particular focus on a future initiative. The Council will be directly involved with the planning process for any new campus change and forecast needs that match the Mission of St. John, including providing decision-making support on Capital Planning and other subcommittees of St. John, in conjunction with the Finance Council and Pastoral Stewardship Council. Suggestions for improvement of the current environment will also be part of the responsibility of the Buildings and Grounds Council.

The primary focus of the Buildings and Grounds Council is the Facilities Master Plan. The Council will be responsible for developing and then overseeing this critical document, which will lay out the long-term strategic plan for our buildings and grounds, tying their function to the mission of the parish. This document will be created by this Council and then cyclically updated on an annual basis.



For 22 years, Sunlight Home has been a "Ray of Hope" for pregnant "at risk" homeless, abused and abandoned women and teens who choose life for their babies. 



## The One Christ of Faith

hroughout the scriptures there are many texts that warn us to guard ourselves against pride. There are many times when Jesus cautions the religious establishment not to burden the people with the incidentals of faith, but to encourage them to find God. He gets so frustrated with the religious people who have to prove that they are right. In today's gospel the disciples fall into the very same trap of religious pride. The disciples want to reserve the right to speak in Christ's name and proclaim the gospel. Jesus Christ offers John another way when he confronts him with wanting exclusive rights to the new evangelization.

In the history of Christendom there have been times when the church has lost sight of this basic teaching. We only have to think back to the Crusades, the Inquisitions, and the many bulls of excommunication that were given to historical giants, to see how people lost sight of what was important to God. There are many things we can do or say that may lead us from the truth, but nothing separates us from the love of Christ and the economy of salvation. While we are all called to the common ground of faith and reason, we must realize the mercy of God is in the forefront of the Christian life. When people err from doctrine or fall from grace, it is not an opportunity for condemnation; it is rather an opportunity for redemption and transformation.

The expression of faith within the Christian Churches must always reflect the wisdom given in the proclamation of the kingdom. Our Church once taught that there was no salvation outside the Catholic Church – now through study of scripture and doctrine, prayer and reflection, holy Mother Church, realizes that the Spirit of Truth exists in some way within all of those traditions. As a Catholic Church we belong to the fullness of tradition in the unbroken line of apostolic succession in which the deposit of faith is handed on unspoiled. However, we still realize the authentic experience of other Christian faiths that seek to understand and live the gospel of Christ. There are still problems

with the approach to the Christian faith. There are some fundamentalist Christians who teach that if one does not accept Jesus as personal Lord and Savior, they are going to hell. Is this what Christ came to teach? Jesus came to relate the message of a kingdom of mercy and love. Jesus did not use a specific religious language to refine membership of the kingdom, but to extend membership. He came to give us life and lead us to a deeper relationship with the Father in heaven. While we teach that we possess the fullness of truth given to us by Jesus Christ because our lineage comes from the apostles, we cannot ignore the presence of Christ in other Christian faiths. Once we embrace the commonalities of faith, we can start honest dialogue that will one day bring unity and peace.



## Prayer

We pray Lord that we will not use our words of faith to isolate, but to encourage others to know you. When we come into contact with those who are not of our faith, may we reverence your presence with them. Amen.




