Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe – Parish Giving Envelopes: Essential Tool for the Church

The office has received many messages over the past week from parishioners who are returning from their summer abodes, requesting that their envelopes be reactivated. This is a wonderful opportunity to educate our Parish Family about these envelopes. The Parish envelopes are sent out every other month. The packet includes two month's worth of envelopes for each weekend Mass, our Capital Campaign giving, and any special collections that may occur during that timeframe. The envelopes have a unique number on them, which corresponds to your family (whether you are a single individual or a family of 12) within our parish systems. Every family has an envelope number, even if you elect to not have those envelopes mailed to you, or you use our online giving program.

Did you know that St. John is one of the largest parishes in Southwest Florida, with over 2,700 active Parish Families? But, how do we know who is a Parish Family, and how do we classify them as "active"? For a long time, our parish did not have a systematic way to answer either of these questions in an accurate way, which has led to some issues. With the hard work and dedication of our volunteers, who have combed through our parish records, finding individuals who have passed away, moved out of the area, and new families who have registered, we have a clear understanding of the make-up of our parish. We now classify "active" parishioners as those who have some activity within the parish in the past two years. The envelopes are the easiest and most effective way to show activity.

These envelopes are much more than just a mechanism to receive your generosity. They are essential tools for our parish operations and allow us to serve you effectively. And they are incredibly important for you as well. Here are just a few of the reasons for everyone to use their envelopes:

• **Participation in our Parish:** Your use of the envelope when you come to Mass is the most direct illustration of your active participation at St. John. The envelope does not have to be filled with money to be important. By placing the envelope in our collection baskets, with whatever gifts you may be able to share with your Parish Family, we are able to reflect your attendance. The attendance is the first item we are asked to use when setting up letters for Catholic

functions, like sponsorship for sacraments, direct assistance requests, or enrollment in church programs. Being a "Catholic in Good Standing" requires illustration of attendance, and we know that all of our Parish Family deserves to be considered "good", if not "amazing".

• **Tracking Giving for Tax Purposes:** You all give so generously, with your time, your talent, and your treasure to our Parish Family. We want to ensure any giving you provide to our parish is properly accounted for, especially in the case of your donations. By using the envelopes, we can properly account for those gifts and provide an appropriate

letter at the beginning of each calendar year for your tax needs. With the thousands of letters we send out each year, we want to make sure to properly provide your full giving amount. That can only be accomplished if your donations are associated to your envelope number.

- **Gauging Mass Sizes:** As many of you have noticed, we are blessed with a beautiful church that swells to capacity (and then some), especially during some of the busiest times of the year. One of the only ways we can plan for the growth of our Parish Family, and therefore provide Masses that fit our needs, is by understanding how many people are at each Mass. There are many moving parts to these Masses, including how many hosts to order for the coming weeks, and how many chalices to place on the Altar, and we want to ensure a faithful and pleasant Mass that focuses on the Eucharist.
- **Information Changes:** From phone numbers to name changes, sometimes the church is the last to know of a change to your information. The envelope is a great way for you to pass on any changes to your contact information, or any comments you may have. That way, we can keep in touch with you as part of our Parish Family.

Please help our parish help you by utilizing your envelopes when you attend Mass. If you forget your envelope (which I do all the time), we have blank envelopes at each door of the church and you can write your name and/or envelope number on those. And if you are a guest or new to our Parish Family, please go ahead and use those envelopes as well. You can even start to register with our Parish via those envelopes or ask questions about how to become more involved in our community. If you do not know your envelope number, or have asked to not receive envelopes in the past, please contact our office 239.566.8740, or *info@sjecc. com* to get your questions answered.

Some of the work that we have done recently includes:

- Sending "seed money" to start a vegetable garden to feed the hungry with nourishing fruits and vegetables to Queen of Angels Catholic Church in Georgia *(see photo)*.


How are we able to do all of this? The answer is simple: **YOU**, our parishioners at St. John, who support us.





Jamaica Outreach Program Next Weekend Your Pocket Change Can and Will Work Miracles

To most of us a small one room cottage with two windows and one toilet would not seem luxurious or the answer to a prayer, but to a Jamaican family living in a makeshift shack with cardboard or tin walls, a dirt floor and a blanket for a door, that little cottage is a life changer. A sturdy roof and a locked door spell safety; a toilet spells luxury.

To date, the JOP has partnered with Jamaican contractors and built 485 homes in Kingston, Jamaica. The partnership not only provides housing for the poor but also creates jobs for contractors across the city. That small cottage costs \$3,200; we pay for it by dedicating one Pocket Change Weekend a year to this worthy cause. However, there is much more to the story.

Two years ago the Jamaican government established a matching program that doubles the \$3,200 to \$6,400. This means that in place of a small one room cottage, a two bedroom home with a loft, a toilet and a shower becomes a possibility. This is especially helpful to large extended families.

The majority of the JOP houses built over the years



have been financed by individual donors who donate an entire house to the JOP in honor of a loved one's special birthday or passing.

Pocket Change weekends allow all of us the opportunity to participate in the housing initiative as one parish family.

We have only 15 more houses to go to reach the magic number of 500 homes. That's 500 families who will be living a better life because of the generosity and good will of Saint John

the Evangelist parishioners.



Volunteers will be stationed at the main doors of our church next weekend. We invite you to contribute and share in this wonderful initiative that has compassion and empathy written all over it.

n listening to today's gospel, one can almost visualize the powerful scene Jesus was observing. People came to the treasury to offer their gifts to God. One after another, people entered to offer their gift to God. There is such a joy in giving. We are told that many rich people came to make

large contributions for the care of the temple building that housed their worship. A widow enters the equation, putting a mere couple of coins into the collection. Jesus recognizes this as the greatest gift offered. The widow gives everything she has to make her sacrifice for God and her place of worship. The others give from their surplus, not feeling the great sacrifice of the widow.

This gospel account teaches us about sacrifice. The widow contributed her whole livelihood in sacrifice for what she believed. The two coins were not of much value in the world's terms. However, they signified great value in the world of faith. The widow's mite involves an act of the heart and great act of will. She had a huge place for God in her heart and surrendered her whole livelihood to Him.

There is a powerful message being offered to us today. The witness of the widow's mite invites us to consider our commitment to God and the Church. We are asked to discern how willing we are to sacrifice to advance the work of the

kingdom. As members of the Body of Christ, we are called to participate in the work of the gospel in the ministries of the Church. Everyone has gifts that may be applied to any given ministry. As a people of God, we are asked to sacrifice time in order to reach out to others in many different ways. As the baptized faithful, everyone is asked to take the time to pray and inform one's self in the faith. If we truly believe with a heart and mind that the God of Jesus Christ is the foundation of our lives, then we will make the time to act on his behalf and discern his will for us.

We are also asked to share our treasure. Parishes all over the world need the support of parishioners to build the kingdom through programs and ministries. This

is how the Church incarnates the gospel message. Church buildings need to be maintained so that the faithful may give praise and glory to God through their worship. Catholic Schools need to be supported so that the message of truth may be instilled in the hearts of our children and youth. In this way our young people become the voice of the Church of tomorrow. The poor throughout the world



rely on our financial support to survive. Monies collected from our churches help to provide healthcare, education, food and housing, to those who have no voice. All this is possible when we consciously sacrifice.
