

New Adult Meeting Space: Providing Environments for All Ages

For those of you who are familiar with the entirety of the St. John campus, which encompasses two large buildings aside from the church, I am sure you have been impressed about how we can squeeze the 4,800 events we have annually into the various rooms, nooks and crannies we can find. Just this past week, we had Theology on Tap the same night as our Adult Catholicism Class while the Irish Step Dancers danced in a classroom and Al-Anon met next to them. Every age group, every type of program happening here constantly enlivens our Parish Family. While we are bursting at the seams, we are happy and joyous in doing so.

However, there are certainly gaps in the environment's ability to support the various functions we have here at St. John. Several of those gaps will be filled with the new Life Center. Others will be supported through the renovation of the current buildings, making sure mission-purpose is part of the design process. One mission essential capability we simply do not possess in our current buildings is a comfortable space for adult small-group discussion. Classrooms, of which we have 15, are good spaces for youth learning, and can be substitutes for various meeting spaces, but they are not conducive to encourage a relaxed, mature conversation. Working with our new Adult Faith Formation Coordinator, Jack Kindsvater, and the Capital Planning Committee, we determined a priority for this year to develop such a space. There was a large office in the Claussen Family Center that was underutilized, and so we have repurposed it as our new Adult Meeting Space. With comfortable seating for 10-12 adults, along with technology and tables, this room is ideally suited for small group discussions. It will be used by not only the Faith



Formation program, but also for our Divorced and Separated Support Group and our Bereavement Support Group, which is expanding with additional services to lift up those who have lost loved ones. By creating this adult space, we are hopeful that we can engage the faithful journey of all our Parish Family, through their entire life.

While we have begun the work our current blessings have allowed us to accomplish for the **Build Our Future**, **Serve Our Past** capital campaign, we still need our entire Parish Family to give in order to reach our additional goals. If you have

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



Expectation and Joy

ohn the Baptist appears a second time as we journey through advent and the year of Luke's gospel. We hear how people may prepare within their own specific way. In order to make straight the pathways for God, they are to share a cloak if they are blessed with more than one and to share food. The tax collectors are asked to be honest in their dealings as well as the soldiers. John the Baptist is reminding the people of his day that repentance was not just changing the mind but mending ways. Many wondered if John was the Anointed One. John tells them he is not the Messiah. In fact the people are told by John that he was unworthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. The Christ would be the one who would empower others

with the baptism of the Spirit. When the Christ was to arrive, people would know that a mighty savior was in their midst. They would know Emmanuel, i.e. God with Us!

As we journey toward the celebration of Christmas, we are being reminded that our Christian calling is not just to give lip service to the gospel, but to allow that good news to penetrate our lives. The Word of God has to be alive and effective in our lives. The decisions that we make have to be imbued by the example of Christ. As we observe the world around us we can see that there is so much suffering and many needs. Our Christian community is asked to respond to those needs and support God's poor. Many organizations do great things to help needy families during this special season. There is a special grace that is experienced when we reach out in love to others. There is an inherent dignity in bringing happiness to others by supporting them with the blessings of our treasures. By the virtue of our baptism we are anointed by the same Spirit that Jesus bestowed upon the first community of disciples, to engage ourselves in charity.

Since the Incarnation took place the Lord is forever near us. Every time we gather in Jesus' Name, he is there. Whenever we listen closely to the gospel proclaimed, Jesus speaks to us. As the gifts are brought to the altar in our churches and the priest calls down the Holy Spirit in epiclesis, Jesus becomes truly present in the bread of life and the cup of eternal salvation. As we go forth from our churches to love and serve the Lord, He is near in the guise of the poor and the broken-hearted. We are baptized by a Holy Spirit that enables us to see life in a new way. Such knowledge instills joy in our hearts and hope for the dream of the soul. We now live in the expectation of the coming of the savior in our own individual lives, especially as we approach our journey's end. Preparing for Christmas ultimately reminds us that we must always be prepared to meet Christ for he is forever near.

As we journey toward Christmas, may you find our hearts ready to receive you, O Lord. Empower us with that Spirit that will set the world on fire with the desire of your love. Let every step that we take walk more deeply in your ways. Joy and peace are the fruits of your presence. May our prayer and decisions fill others with those beautiful gifts. Amen.

Preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation: How Can I help?

As 70 of our children enrolled in Faith Formation continue preparing for their First Reconciliation, here are some ways that parents and caregivers can help:

• Go over the Sign of the Cross prayer with your child, help them practice. They will begin their confession with the *Sign of the Cross*.

In the name of the Father, And of the Son, And of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

• Help your child learn an *Act of Contrition*. The priest will ask your child to make an act of contrition. Most of the children are learning this prayer in Faith Formation.

O my God, I am sorry for my sins, In choosing to sin, And failing to do good, I have sinned against You and your Church. I firmly intend, With the help of your Son, To make up for my sins And to love as I should. Amen.

- Consider receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation in the days or weeks before your child's First Reconciliation. Share your experience with your child. Consult the bulletin for Reconciliation times and Advent Penance services in our area during this Advent season.
- Set aside 30-45 minutes to do each lesson in your child's packet with them. Make this quality one-on-one time, if possible.

Preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation: How Can I Help? (continued)

• Encourage your child through this time of preparation. Bring them to Mass wearing the necklaces they received at the Enrollment Mass. Show them by your example, that just as your faith brought them to the sacrament of Baptism, you are here with them as their first teachers to love and support them as they receive the sacrament of Reconciliation.





Faith Formation

Being Catholic

"Our Catholic Faith is a wondrous and expansive world, full of history, deep theological discussions, and enlightenment. We want to make sure every individual who is part of our Parish Family has the opportunity to grow in their faith, in a spectrum of ways. Some may want to have small group discussions around certain topic. Others may want formalized classes and curriculum. Others still may desire individual discernment.

We are not waiting for our Capital Campaign to be completed in order to start these initiatives."

With these words, five months ago Jean-Paul Boucher, General Manager, announced a new focus on Adult Faith Formation at Saint John the Evangelist Parish and the appointment of a Coordinator of Adult Faith Formation to proactively address the needs of all adult Catholics in our parish, women and men, to continue to grow in their faith.

For those of you I have not had the pleasure to meet, my name is Jack Kindsvater and I'm the Adult Faith Formation Coordinator. I have been a parishioner for 14 years, retired for 10, and since retiring, for my own Faith Formation, earned a MA in Pastoral Theology from Barry University through the diocesan Blessed Edmund Rice School for Pastoral Ministry where I was introduced to the need for AFF in our Church today.

You may ask, what exactly is Adult Faith Formation? And you have good reason to ask since it has not typically been the "Catholic way". For many of us religious education and formation ended when we were confirmed, and though we may be highly educated, we are still operating with the religion we received as a child. It's quite difficult to address adult questions with eighth grade answers.

The Charter for Lifelong Christian Formation published by the Episcopal Church describes Christian faith formation as

"a lifelong journey with Christ, in Christ, and to Christ. Lifelong Christian faith formation is a lifelong growth in the knowledge, service, and love of God as followers of Christ and is informed by Scripture, tradition, and reason."

OK, you may ask, what does it look like? A great example is multi-media study program based on the documentary film series **CATHOLICISM**. Over 11 Thursdays this fall 50 parishioners were taken around the world and deep into the faith to consider what

Catholics believe, and why.

After watching the award-winning DVD presentations that have been viewed by thousands on PBS, they discussed them to increase understanding and to explore their application to their life in the world today.



For the thousands of parishioners who did not attend, this **CATHOLICISM** program will be repeated. This program begins January 6th and will be offered at two times of day to enable more parishioners to fit it into their schedules. One session will be at lunchtime (11:30 a.m. -1:00 p.m.) on Wednesdays and the other will be on Thursdays evenings (7:00 - 8:30 p.m.). 
