The Time is Now: Life Center Planning Starts

It is really quite extraordinary. In less than 10 months, the Parish Family of Saint John the Evangelist has gathered over \$8.3 million in pledges and already deposited over \$3 million in our Diocesan Savings Account. This gets us very close to the initial amount required for us to break ground on the Life Center. This savings account is set up so we are NOT assessed for the use of the money for the campaign purposes for the next several years, and it also provides us with a great interest rate. The more we put in, and the faster we do it, the more interest we will accrue for our Parish Endowment, which will fund Missions and programs for years to come.

We are now putting a timeline in place for the construction of the Life Center. A major undertaking like this must be planned well before any walls go up. This building is going to house new programs and requires new operating models for our church. We have to prioritize these planning efforts, so not only will we be successful in creating this comfortable, engaging space for all ages, but it will be filled with activities on Day 1. It will require leadership that can understand the development of buildings and the creation of social events, food service programs, and wellness activities.

This Life Center Planning Committee will be created in the beginning of 2016 to hit the ground running. They will begin to provide updates to you via this page and on our *Life Center Building website: http://saintjohntheevangelist.com/about-us/saint-john-life-center*.

While we have begun the work our current blessings have allowed us to accomplish for the **Build Our Future**, **Serve Our Past** capital campaign, we still need our entire Parish Family to give in order to reach our additional goals. SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

with the help of the Men's Club. The Youth Group decked out our Ballroom for Prom, complete with the Hollywood theme,




complete with red carpet pictures and decorations. Young and old learned each others' dance moves, had a marvelous dinner, and even crowned a king and queen of the prom.

 St. John has begun this process for the divorced and separated individuals of our community by providing


them a safe place to talk and relate to each other every Wednesday evening.

• Thanksgiving in the Park – Feeding over 1,700 people on Thanksgiving could not have occurred without the dedication of







• Feeding Hunger, Filling Hearts – For the first-ever fundraiser for Guadalupe Social Services, the Catholic Charities organization in Immokalee, St. John and several groups like the Ladies of Charity, Knights of Columbus and Pelican Sound, worked together to provide two seatings of soup in our Ballroom. The over \$13,000 in donations raised by this event was a blessing to so many in need.



• A Simple Gesture – In our first attempt at a persistent food pantry support program, St. John provided over

260 reusable blue bags to our Parish Family, asking them to fill them with



groceries every two months, which would be delivered to food pantries in the area all year round. The Holy Spirit is truly alive in our work, as we received back over 350 bags and boxes worth of groceries (the original blue bags as well as many plastic bags and boxes). In total, the groceries are worth over \$10,000. Another 400 bags were taken for the next round.

• Companion Driving Ministry – One of the most needed services is for our own Parish Family. We know that as we get older, it becomes harder to get outside our homes and we can start to feel alone. St. John was proud to begin its Companion Driving Ministry, to assist anyone who needs help coming to weekend Masses. You should never miss out on the Holy Sacrament and our community.

That barely scratches the surface of all the new and renewed programs we have been working on this year. Next year is going to be even bigger, but you will have to wait until next week to get a sneak peek at our plans.





The Ultimate Family

oday we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family in the midst of the Christmas season. The Holy Family of Nazareth is a perfect example of what family life is all about — total reliance on God, total acceptance of his will, and total commitment to one another. Today's gospel account tells of the finding of Jesus in the temple. What wisdom Jesus had at twelve to realize that his family extended far beyond his earthly ties. He recognized that he was in his Father's house, his true Father was in heaven and that his family reached far beyond the little dwelling in Nazareth. We also get a little insight into Jesus'

hidden years. We learn that he was obedient to Mary and Joseph, and that he advanced in favor before God and the people. Mary ponders all the things Jesus said and experienced, keeping them close to her heart.

Most of us were born into a family context. For those who were orphaned, often the orphanage became the family. Our families ought to be modeled on the Holy Family as the ultimate of virtue, witness and commitment. Today's feast challenges us to extend our understanding of family life. In the First Letter of St. John we are all recognized as the children of God, belonging to one spiritual family. We call God "Abba", Father in heaven. In doing so, we become spiritually connected to and responsible for one another. This is what the Church is all about. When we say that we are the Church, we are also saying that we are family. As in any family, the family of the Church faces challenges, joys and disappointments. In recent times some members of the Church have fallen from grace bringing scandal to the Church family. Just like any other family, the Church has to become unified to bring peace, unity and stability to a world of fragile and broken promises. The family is constantly under attack. The number of divorces in our nation is staggering. Notions of lifelong commitment are thought to be antiquated. Children experience instability as estranged parents battle for custody rights. Family ties become weak as a result of abuse. Familial bonds are untied as

a result of a lack of commitment. In the midst of this, the leadership of the Church calls us to recognize the family as the basic unit that offers stability to society. Broken marriages, however, are a reality and

as Church we are called to respond with compassion and to continually offer hope.

As a Church, membership is never exclusive. All of earth's people must always be called God's children. The late Archbishop Derek Worlock of Liverpool, England, once said, "I am my brother's keeper and he is sleeping fairly rough these days." His comment demonstrates the great responsibility that each of us bears for all in the world. As Church we must reach out to those who find themselves outside the Church so that the love of Christ may become a reality.

It is the amazing true story of a man who maintained his cultural identity as a Jew even after converting to Catholicim and joining the priesthood. Lustiger was

appointed Archbishop of Paris by Pope Jean Paul II and found a new platform to celebrate his dual identity as a Catholic Jew. When nuns plan to build a convent within the walls of Auschwitz, Lustiger may be forced at last to choose his side.

a mature faith you can apply to meet the challenges of today's postmodern world.


