This is the message the Church gives us today. This is what Jesus says so forcefully: 'New wine in new wineskins.' Habits must be renewed in the newness of the Spirit, in the surprises of God. May the Lord grant us the grace of an open heart, of a heart open to the voice of the Spirit, which knows how to discern what should not change, because it is fundamental, from what should change in order to be able to receive the newness of the Spirit. – Pope Francis 1/18/2016

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow — New Financial Processes for Church Provide Greater Transparency for You

As we enter into this new calendar year, St. John has been doing some "housecleaning" of both our campus, as well as our financial processes. Some of the basic components of running a church, as with any organization, include an efficient financial program that allows for us as a Parish Family to fulfill the mission of our church, To Know, To Love and To Serve God, in His Church and in Our Community. One of renewed components of this financial effort that will assist us as good stewards of the gifts of our parish is a completely reformatted Chart of Accounts.

The Chart of Accounts is a listing of the names of the records an organization has identified and made available for recording transactions. The Diocese of Venice has provided specific accounts that churches should follow and St. John has the flexibility to tailor its chart of accounts to best suit its needs. We have done exactly that. Our new chart of accounts is structured to help us identify exactly what we are spending, where we are spending it, and why. We can now see exactly how much we spent on the power bill for the Church, as well as what rental fees we were paid by businesses that utilize our Ballroom. By clearly understanding what we are spending, our Finance Council can advise the clergy and staff in prioritizing our resources and making better decisions for our Parish Family.

Additionally, each area of our church now has a yearly budget that is designated for these accounts. Each employee with responsibility for those areas have provided their planned expenses for the year on a monthly basis, and those have been consolidated for your viewing in our upcoming changes to the financial charts in the bulletin. Instead of a "static" \$28,000 weekly budget, which does not reflect the actual budget or expenses of our tremendously expanded set of programs and events that last year equaled \$3 million, you will see a fluctuating budget based on the anticipated weekly needs. There are a few other changes, like the consolidation of the weekly and year-to-date collection summaries, and the special collections, that will make the charts easier to read and more transparent to show where your wonderful donations are going.

oday we hear Jesus proclaim that he is the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah. Isaiah prophesied that a time would come when the Spirit would bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to those held captive, healing to those who were broken, and release to those oppressed. Can you imagine how powerful it was to experience such a revelation and see the very power of God unfold through the ministry of Jesus of Nazareth? Words would have been inadequate to express those first eyewitness accounts of such restoration to a kingdom already, but not yet. This preface to the ministry of Jesus communicates that God comes to dwell not in the midst of perfection, but in the midst of a world yearning to be healed, restored, and freed from captivity. The gospel of Luke provides the framework of Jesus' life-project and makes us aware that Jesus is the fulfillment of the promise made throughout the ages. When Jesus opens the scroll and declares its fulfillment, it is not a time for sadness and weeping, but a day of rejoicing for the whole of creation.

Throughout the gospels, there are numerous accounts of Jesus reaching out to those who were considered outside of the Jewish Law by the religious leaders. Jesus, who came to proclaim glad tidings to the poor, was himself one of the poor, who chose simple tradesmen (fishermen) and sinners (tax collectors) to follow him, making the kingdom of God known. *This scripture is also being fulfilled as we listen today.* When we humbly place ourselves before God with our failures and our sin—his presence is made known through Word and Sacrament. Christ forgives, removes our blindness, and frees us from our captivity through the sacrament of reconciliation. In our gathering for the Eucharist, Christ speaks to us in a new way, offering us eternal life. As we approach the altar of sacrifice,

Jesus offers us his body and blood — blessed and broken for each one of us.

The realization of Isaiah's prophecy continues to unfold. Today we are invited, through our anointing at baptism and confirmation, to join Christ in his work — to bring hope to those who are poor, blind, oppressed, and

captive. In the words of St. Paul, we are the Body of Christ, who must work together to give witness to the gospel. The fulfillment of God's promise is also birthed through the witness we give to Christ in bringing these attributes of mercy and compassion alive.

Lord, may we always give both our time and our treasures to those who are poor. May we offer new sight to those who allow their vision to be blurred by prejudice and narrow-mindedness. Enable us to become the voice of freedom for the people who are trapped by fear and injustice and encourage their liberation. May others find in us, a resting place of God's love. Amen!






