



Claussen Family Center: Library and Adult Space

You may have heard from Fr. John last weekend about the amazing progress we have made so far with our Capital Campaign. He also told you a little about the rest of our plans that we are continuing to work towards. We have gone through our needs for the church and the PLC. The most recent building on our campus currently is the Claussen Family Center, named for a pillar of our Catholic community, Bob Claussen, and his family. Those of you who attend the 9:00 a.m. Mass in particular know of his warm and engaging personality. This building was developed with several functions in mind. It provides meeting space, offices for Faith Formation, and classrooms. As we have discussed before, these classrooms are effective for youth engagement, especially Faith Formation classes, but not supportive for small group discussions of adults. We plan to resolve this issue with several major improvements to the building design, along with several important repairs:


- Air Conditioning: When the Claussen Family Center
 was designed, the air systems were planned on several
 separate units, all controlled independently. In order
 to deploy a more energy efficient system, we will
 be implementing a central cooling unit for the entire
 structure, with the ability to service each area with
 different temperature ranges and humidity management.
- New Library: I have had a hard time describing our current "Library" in the PLC. There is nothing about it that makes it a Library. We will be designing and implementing a large library within the current Youth Room space in the Claussen Family Center. This library will include study space and both digital and paper books for those wanting to expand their knowledge of the Catholic Church and faith. It will include a group discussion space too, with video conferencing with the Diocese and around the world so
 - we can connect to experts and theologians whom we would not be able to reach otherwise.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToLove, #ToServe — Enhancing Safety at St. John: Crowd Management and Safe Environment

And the Academy Award for Best Motion Picture goes to: *Spotlight*

In case you missed my discussion about the importance of the movie *Spotlight* when it was released last November (http://saintjohntheevangelist.com/ministries/continuing-to-create-our-safe-environment-for-the-entire-parish-family),

I underscored the fact that the Catholic Church is currently under the microscope for our behavior and lack of action in the face of real suffering at the hands of the members of our communities. This is real. This is not something that can just be forgotten or swept under the rug. The story of *Spotlight* is the uncovering of abuse that occurred in Boston by the Catholic Church in 2002. It continues to remind us that we must remain vigilant for all those who

come to St. John, in search of healing, love, and acceptance, no matter if they are 5 years old or 105. We are all vulnerable in some way, and it is our responsibility to create this safe environment here within the campus of St. John, a sanctuary where people can worship, laugh, cry, and come together in a joyous and restorative way every single day.

I have to take a moment to thank all of our ministries and their members for embracing this environment and moving forward with our Safe Environment program for all active ministers. It is essential to our Parish Family to make sure that every face they see at St. John not only illustrates the loving and merciful gaze of Jesus, but that they are ready to provide the protection of our Catholic Church. This program includes a Safe Environment Training program, which is only two hours long and full of important information on how to keep people safe and the warning signs we should be able to spot for people in trouble.

Several groups that are directly responsible for our safety, namely the Ushers and Greeters and the Knights of Columbus, have started the next step in our Safe Environment program. We

were able to have the North Naples Fire Department come to St. John this past week to train and certify over 20 members in Crowd Management. What is Crowd Management? It is the ability to understand the physical environment and the people within it to ensure their safety. For example, we had

over 750 people attending the Parish Picnic last weekend (a record, by the way). We needed to ensure that everyone was able to attend safely and that there was adequate emergency support for someone in case they had a medical issue, as well as to see when the room was over capacity to communicate the outdoor seating. Some of it is common sense. Some of it is situational awareness. Looking around the church, seeing it bursting

at the seams during many Masses with standing room only, you can see how important Crowd Management is to our church.

St. John is unique in this area for putting such an emphasis on your safety. We are proud of that fact. In fact, the other churches send their ministers to our offices and ask us questions about how to implement Safe Environment. It is not always easy and the systems are not perfect, by a long shot, so I appreciate all of your patience if you have had an issue in your background checks.

My wife can attest to the fact that I stay awake at night worrying about the safety of each one of you who so generously choose to make St. John part of your life. It is part of the fabric of our Parish Family that every single person who comes to our campus can feel safe and protected by God's love and mercy.

Fighting Hunger, Feeding Hope!

The Jamaica Outreach Program (JOP) is a local nonprofit organization founded in 1997 at St. John the Evangelist Church in Naples, Florida. Its goal is to make a difference in the lives of the poor in St. Pius X parish located in a desperately poor section of Kingston, Jamaica.

Annually the JOP replenishes a Food Pantry on the grounds of St. Pius X church. This year the Food Drive at St. John will be held next weekend. The shipping container will hold up to 1,000 cartons of food. Can you, would you help us fill it?

Where do your food donations go?

The Food container travels from Naples to Coconut Creek, FL, where *Food for the Poor* puts it on an ocean-bound ship. From there the container is dropped on the docks in Kingston, and, after it passes "muster" with Jamaica Customs, is transported by truck to *Food for the Poor's* warehouse in Spanish Town, just outside Kingston. The contents are confirmed as to destination and, finally, the container with its contents is delivered to the St. Pius X Food Pantry. The parish staff and volunteers unload the container into the food pantry storage area; later they divide the food into family portions. Twice per month the St. Pius Food Pantry distributes food as available to up to



500 families. To those who donate, we extend heartfelt thanks for your willingness to help those among us who have the very least.







The Friend of Sinners

oday's gospel account is often called the "Parable of the Prodigal Son". We could also name this parable "The Parable of the Compassionate & Forgiving Father", or "The Parable of the Reluctant Forgiver". Jesus is criticized for his association with tax collectors and sinners. His religious contemporaries looked upon such people with disdain and most definitely disassociated themselves from such company. Jesus' choice to be with the tax collectors and sinners is a radical statement from God who wishes to dwell with those who are most in need of His message of redemption. Jesus' choice of parable is likewise a radical statement of the Incarnate Word, pointing out that God's initiative differs from that of the religious contemporaries of his day.

Let us examine this parable. The younger son is no stranger to sin. He disgraces his father by asking him to give him what would be naturally given him after his father's death. Such an action would bring disappointment to a father. After sinning, the young man decides to turn to his father for help. The response of the father in the story is unconditional love. Obviously, the older son resents the sinner — he refuses to celebrate the return of

the prodigal son. This is a very human response to a very broken situation. The father invites the older son to participate in his compassion, mercy and forgiveness. Jesus is clearly demonstrating that it is the will of the Father in heaven to celebrate when a sinner returns to Him and offer his unbounded mercy and forgiveness. He is also teaching us that everyone has the right to be forgiven no matter what sin we have committed. Once we are contrite, the Father waits for our return. The older son represents the resentment that many often feel when someone has been given a second chance. The father in the parable ultimately shows us that we should turn such resentment into gratitude.

This parable challenges all of us to examine the way that we deal with the hurt that others can cause in our lives or those whom we love. When we ponder this parable, most of us could imagine ourselves, if we are honest with ourselves, occupying the shoes of every character of the story. It may well be the case that we have disappointed others by what we have said or done. Hopefully, we have thought about the wrong we have done and have been contrite for such sin and have asked for forgiveness. We might find ourselves in the shoes of the older brother resenting someone we know because of the pain they have inflicted upon us or someone

we know. We often find ourselves reluctant to forgive because we fear being hurt again or find it hard to trust. The character of the father shows us that Jesus invites us to love unconditionally, to forgive unconditionally, and to celebrate the generosity of our God. We are called to hate the sin but always to love the sinner. When Jesus Christ befriends the sinner, he is teaching us that we must do the same. At this point in our Lenten journey we are asked to search deep within and see if there are any person(s) or situations that need to be reconciled. If there are, we are invited to show the mercy and forgiveness of the compassionate Father.
