

Learning What Easter Is All About, Alleluia!

As the school year draws to a close, the Pre-School, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd/Atrium afternoon and evening classes prepared for the great feast of Easter. At the beginning of Lent, each child made their own "Alleluia" card which they symbolically buried or tucked away with the understanding that we do not say this word during the Lenten season. With the arrival of

Easter, the children dug them up and brought them out and proclaimed the word joyfully!

In preparation for Easter, the children were given the presentation on The Last Supper where they saw that the materials found in the Altar Area were first used at this special meal. When Easter arrived, the children were introduced to the presentation of The Empty Tomb where they heard about the events surrounding Jesus' rising from the dead. The children have also received the Easter Celebration presentation where the Pachal Candle was introduced and each child received their own candle symbolizing the "Light of Christ".

Many of the children are drawn to practical life

works where they learn how to care for the environment within the atrium with activities such as flower arranging, dusting and carpet sweeping. Other practical life work requires concentration and fine motor skill development that help in their abilities to learn to draw and write.

Some of those programs may include stretching and calisthenics, pick-up basketball games, bocce, cooking demonstrations, and futsal. All of these activities promote healthy and active living, which is essential for spiritual wellness.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow — Finance Spotlight: Tuition Assistance Supports Youth of Parish at Catholic Schools

It is getting to be that time of the year. Families across our parish are thinking about their plans for next year. While we have some exciting announcements planned for next weekend's Families in Christ about programs beginning for the upcoming school year, I wanted to take a few moments this weekend to discuss Catholic School tuition assistance. St. John has been able to support the elementary, middle, and high schools in the area providing quality Catholic

education steeped in the humanities and continuing the

environment.

A joint committee of the Finance Council and the Pastoral Stewardship Council assist Fr. John and me with the dozens of applications for our tuition assistance on a yearly basis. We have some very clear criteria for the award of this support:


ethical responsibility that comes from a Catholic educational

- 1. Financial Need Did you know it can cost over \$11,000 a year for a Catholic education in Naples? While this may be less than some of the other private schools, it can cause a significant financial concern for a family. There are families that are struggling to make ends meet without this burden and we take those needs into consideration.
- 2. Active Participation in our Parish Family I have made comments in the past about utilizing our offertory envelopes to illustrate your time at church. It does not have to have a single penny inside of it, but it helps us understand and appreciate the fact that you are coming to church. Other efforts, like participation in parish events and programs, like Faith Formation, youth activities like Lectors, Altar Servers, Youth Group, the Cub and Boy Scouts are tremendous illustrations of that participation as well. We have some youth who volunteer at Guadalupe Social Services in the Soup Kitchen. Still others who teach Faith Formation. Adult participation is also key. We have opportunities like Vacation Bible School, the Knights of Columbus, and the Ladies of Charity as just a few volunteer opportunities. These services to our parish and

the community are clear illustrations of the connection to our faith and we support those students and their families.





The Wisdom of Love

s we journey through the Easter Season we encounter the many human emotions experienced in the characters of the early Church. In today's gospel we are taken back in time to the event of the last supper to remember how the early disciples are informed by Jesus that he will be departing their company. The disciples must have been confused or heartbroken at this news. Jesus offers them the wisdom of love as the model for their future. In offering the love of Jesus to others the Church begins to grow and flourish. In embracing the gift of Christ's love the healing and teaching of Jesus continues in the ministry of the apostles and early disciples. Although Jesus cannot be seen, his love can be felt. The people who live in

first century A.D. Israel know the Christians by this love.



At the Saint Vincent de Paul food drive last November, St. John parishioners donated hundreds of grocery bags filled with essential food items to fill a two-ton truck from floor to ceiling. The items were distributed by the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul Food Pantry.

We are called to love as Jesus loved. This seems to be a simple task when simply stated, but the love that Jesus offered the world was quite radical and life-changing. Jesus' love is a gift that is to be offered to all peoples of every time and place. It is quite evident in the gospels that Jesus loved all people regardless of their sin or ignorance – Jesus hated the sin but loved the sinner. Our love is not to be offered in isolation to those who offer us love, but also to the ones we have difficulties with. The purest ideal of love is to offer it without conditions – in this we find much favor with God. We are called to love the sinner even when their sin has affected us or hurt us. This is indeed a difficult task in all honesty.

If we were to look at a good example of unconditional love, we could look to the vocation of parenthood. Parents watch their child grow and sacrifice themselves to provide the necessary nourishment for that growth, making safe the environment in which the child is to mature. Sometimes parents struggle inwardly when they see their child fall and make mistakes. True parents pick up their child when he falls and helps him move beyond his mistakes by offering this unconditional love that Jesus gave to his disciples. In order to

see the child truly grow, parents have to embrace the gift of letting go in order to let the child find his way. Many parents at this time are preparing to deal with this reality as they see their children graduate high school and are faced with their leaving home. There are also many parents who have lost children through premature deaths, illness or sudden death. There are so many examples of selfless giving in society today. The early Church's witness to the unconditional love of Jesus continues in the Church today as people offer their lives to the ministry and the mission of the Church. People sacrifice countless hours in visiting the sick and tending to the needs of the community. Others put there lives in danger to minister to God's poor in countries that are devastated by famine, rebellion and oppressive governments. People are challenged in many ways to extend their love in the areas of society where love is yet to be born!







Were You There -

- when our catechumen were baptized at the Easter Vigil?
- when our Candidates were received into full communion with the Catholic Church?
- when our teens and adults were strengthened by the Holy Spirit through confirmation?

These were joyous experiences, but they did not mark the end of the journey; they were only the beginning of a lifelong process of living, learning, growing in and sharing our faith for them AND for our entire faith community here at Saint John the Evangelist parish.

The catechumen, candidates, and confirmandi are now in the final period of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, called "mystagogy", from the Greek words meaning "to lead through the mysteries." Traditionally, mystagogy extends throughout the Easter season, until the feast of Pentecost.

This is a period during which the new Catholics, and those who reaffirmed their faith, discover what it means to fully participate in the sacramental mysteries of the Church.

The newly baptized are called "neophytes," from the Greek words meaning "new plant," because the faith has

been newly planted in them. Even though their catechetical preparation has been completed, they still have much to learn about what it means to live as Catholic Christians. Things often look different from the inside! Once they find themselves really on the inside, the neophytes often have more questions about living a life of faith.

They need the ongoing support of the community so that the faith newly planted in them can grow deep roots. They are looking for ways to put their faith into action, to get involved. Invite these newly received Catholics to participate in the life of our parish.

If you have an opportunity, share your faith with these new Catholics, answer their questions, and demonstrate the life of faith through your actions. Invite them to participate in your ministry. Make them feel welcome in the Saint John the Evangelist parish community.

As we celebrate these neophytes, we cannot forget others we know — family members, friends, co-workers, and others — who might be interested in learning more about what it means to be Catholic. Invite them to attend Mass or another activity at St. John with you. Invite them to contact Jack Kindsvater, Adult Faith Formation and RCIA Coordinator, to get answers to their questions and learn more about the process for someone to "become a Catholic".


