Tremendous Survey Feedback Response

In only two weeks since we announced the survey for the persistent programs for our Parish Family and the local community, we have already had over 500 views of the survey and half of those have finished their responses, giving us a wealth of knowledge and understanding of the need for these types of activities designed to bring us together in fellowship. One comment I have heard recently I think is especially true:

"As recently as fifty years ago, the Catholic Church believed that by creating belief in its members, it would also develop belonging. This belonging allowed the church and the community to rely on each other and connect deeply. And that held true for several decades as the churches thrived and became the center of their neighborhoods and events. However, it is clearly true now with the research that has been accomplished, that this concept has reversed itself. Those churches that have not changed are closing. Now, people in search of community desire the feeling of belonging first. Once that feeling has been fostered, it then brings people into deeper and closer belief. That is why this area and the Catholic Church need what we are doing."

I am not anywhere as smart or as experienced as the individual who provided this insight, but it is clear that we are on the right path.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.







A Renewing Spirit

s we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, we recall the monumental occurrence that gave birth to our Church and gave the apostles the courage to fearlessly proclaim the gospel. The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of the disciples gathered *in a house of fears*, waiting for God's

helper. They are infused with the Holy Spirit, also known as the Advocate, who renews their faith, their confidence, and their reason for living. As a result of the experience of Pentecost, the disciples proclaim the very message that led Jesus to his death. Even though these simple

people did not have the gift of being multi-lingual, the miraculous power of God enables foreigners to hear the message of the kingdom.

This Spirit, who renews the Church

in every age, is at work in us and in the Church to this day. Millions upon millions of lives have been inspired and changed by the Spirit of God that continues to be the Advocate of the Church. The Advocate is the driving force behind our Church, inspiring us all to listen to its murmurings, encouraging us to love, to forgive, and to live with a compassionate heart. Although many people consider the Holy Spirit to be the "neglected" third person of the Trinity, its power continues to call countless numbers to the priesthood, the religious life,

and the lay ministries of the Church. Even though we cannot see the Spirit, it remains the hidden companion on our faith journey. Each journey is blessed by the Spirit's seven-fold gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. The gifts of the Spirit enable the Magisterium of the Church to offer concrete leadership and guidance in matters of the faith. And it is the Holy Spirit who enables the bread and wine to be transformed into the body and blood of the saving Christ during the Eucharistic Prayer.


When we think of the Spirit in an academic light, we realize that it is the third person of the Trinity. We catch many glimpses of the presence of God in the realities of life. Some people have turned away from their addictions because they heard a voice within urging them to change their destructive behavior. *The Holy Spirit?* Relationships are often fractured as a result of the words or thoughtlessness of others. When people are stirred to forgive, what is it exactly that moves them towards reconciliation? *The Holy Spirit?* The Holy Spirit is like the air that we breath, unseen but vital. The Advocate, the Helper, the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit is the unseen mover who changes hearts. It can be likened to the wind that makes things move even though it cannot be seen with the naked eye.

In this chapter the Pope discusses divorce, conscience, and sin in the context of accompanying, discerning, and integrating weakness. And, consistent with his pastoral focus, he also points out that the Eucharist "is not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak."

Looking ahead, the next week we will jump to Chapter Five, Love made fruitful, which deals with children. It addresses the role of mothers, fathers, and grandparents in a family.

There are many forms of prayer, and meditation is one. There are many forms of meditation, classic and centering prayer are two. In June another form of meditation that works especially well for people who have trouble meditating with a mantra or sacred word will be introduced and practiced.

As a prayer form, meditation is very healthy for your personal consciousness. It can quiet anxieties and reduce needless worry. By consistently practicing meditation you can be calmer and more peaceful deep inside where it counts. These are only a few of the advantages of meditating regularly.

Every other Wednesday in June there will be image led meditation sessions, one at 11:00 a.m. and another identical session at 7:00 p.m. Each session will include a conversation about consciousness because the more you understand consciousness, the more you will understand how meditation works to heal. Your personal consciousness is all yours. Only you can heal it. You can have help, but you still have to do the work. During a deep meditation your mind works to heal itself, but you have to do the work of meditating.
