Mission Garden: Teaching Missionaries to Fish to Feed Those in Need


We have received the response for our Site Development Plan from Collier County. As expected, they have found some small issues, like adding 111th Avenue North to the plans, even though the building is far recessed from the main road, and referencing the proper SDP number on our cover sheet. There were a few environmental components we are going to resolve as well, which are appropriate in the focus of our Catholic Church and Pope Francis' encyclical "Laudato Si". We are tending the garden of earth in God's name, and it is our responsibility to take care of the planet and leave it better than we found it. Did you know that between the Ballroom and the new Life Center is a nature preserve that is filled with endangered tortoises? If you take a walk to the back of our campus, you may be able to spot them walking around between the tortoise sanctuary and the pond.

We will need to ensure the flowers and plants around our building are native, especially near the preserve. We will also need to make sure those tortoises are safe during the construction and that will require special fencing and even potentially relocating them. Most importantly, we are creating a brand new Mission Garden. The set of vegetable and fruit trees will be irrigated and fed by the pond, which will be stocked with fish. This self-sustaining agricultural environment will feed us and the poor in the area, with the youth and experienced of our Parish Family working together to fish and pick, as well as to ensure the health of the vegetation. Additionally, missionaries will come to St. John to learn how to build and maintain this environment so it can be replicated in areas around the world where people do not have enough to eat.

#ToLove – Silence: Martin Scorsese Delves into 17th Century Japan and Catholic Missionaries

Have you ever questioned what it really means to be a martyr? What pain would you be willing to endure for your faith? Would you watch dozens of others writhing in pain or sent to their death because you were not willing to simply say you did not believe in God? What would you think of a God that allows for such torture to occur and stayed silent while you suffered these trials? These are some of the most powerful questions that are coming to life in the upcoming weeks with the movie **Silence**, directed by Martin Scorsese and staring Andrew Garfield and Adam Driver, and derived from the novel of the same name by Shūsaku Endō, one of the most respected modern Japanese authors and Catholic since the age of 11.

Silence tells the story of Catholic Jesuit missionaries and their quest to find their mentor, who was sent to Japan in the midst of the purge of Christianity from the country. At its peak, it

was thought there were over 300,000 Catholics in Japan. But, starting 1597 and continuing until the re-opening of Japan to the Western world in 1865, hundreds, if not thousands of Catholics were systematically persecuted, tortured and forced to apostatize, meaning

to renounce their religion. These Jesuits attempt to find a way into this country and are met by Catholic Japanese that are so devoted, they are willing to endure these trials for their faith, and it makes them question their own strength and devotion. They are especially concerned because their teacher was said to have apostatized and is now living with the torturers, rather than taking the path of honorable martyrdom.

One of the most important themes of this book in my mind is the universality of the Catholic Church, which truths and fullness are able to resonate to all various people of the world, no matter their cultural differences. In fact, the author Endō states:

But after all it seems to me that Catholicism is not a solo, but a symphony... If I have trust in Catholicism, it is because I find in it much more possibility than in any other religion for presenting the full symphony of humanity.

I hope that if we ever have to meet the silence of the questioning of our faith that Father Rodrigues deals with



The O Antiphons & Advent Each of the seven verses of O Come, O Come Emmanuel is associated with a particular day of the Octave (or "eight days") before Christmas Eve, the "Golden Nights": December 17th through the 23rd. The "O Antiphons", as they are known, each employ a different title for the Messiah, as foretold by the prophets Isaiah and Micah, of Jesus the Christ. The Church has used them at Vespers (Evening Prayer) for as many as 1500 years; perhaps even longer.

They include, beginning on December 17, O Sapientia (O Wisdom), then O Adonai (O Lord), O Radix Iesse (O Root of Jesse), O Clavis Davidica (O Key of David), O Oriens (O Dawn), O Rex gentium (O King of nations), and O Emmanuel (O God with us). Fascinatingly, the first letters of each title, read backwards, also spell the Latin phrase ERO CRAS, "Tomorrow, I will be [there]", a phrase completed only on Dec. 23 with the singing of the final antiphon. Thus: after we have called upon the Lord to come to us, he answers us, "ero cras!", referring to his coming in the great Solemnity of the Nativity!



Fourth Sunday of Advent: Year A

he Vord &

From the Ordinary Comes the Extraordinary

he events surrounding the story of the Incarnation challenge us to discover the extraordinary in the midst of the ordinary. Our attention is drawn to Mary and Joseph in the last Sunday of Advent. What do we know about them? The scriptures indicate that Mary was a simple virgin who said "yes" to the angel and, as a result, was found with child through the power of the Holy Spirit. God chose an ordinary girl to give witness to the extraordinary reality of God. Mary gave birth to a Son who was to be known as "Emmanuel" which means "God with us". As we listen to the first reading today, Isaiah prophesied about this. He tells us that God will give the ultimate sign when the virgin shall conceive and bear a son and name him "Emmanuel". God is with us in the story of Nazareth. The humble dwelling of a simple girl becomes God's dwelling place. Mary's womb becomes the tabernacle in which the presence of God is tangible. This ordinary girl in an ordinary little town becomes the reference point of the extraordinary point of change in the history of salvation.

We are all too familiar with the foundations of our history of faith. Such a familiarity can lose the



profound significance of the Christ event. Mary and Joseph were merely simple human beings who lived in a small town. However, their response changed our world history forever – giving their lives extraordinary significance. The figure of Mary has dominated our church because of her willingness to answer God's call to become the Mother of God. Joseph is the biblical dreamer who follows the voice of the angle in his sleep. In following his dreams, he helps fulfill the promises of scripture and becomes the foster father of Jesus.

As we enter into the fourth week of our Advent season, we have to realize that the coming of Christ involves all of us. Divinity finds its resting place in the person of Jesus. As we contemplate the meaning of our Christian faith, we constantly remind ourselves that we must clothe ourselves

in Christ. When we consciously do so, we are also clothing ourselves and participate in a divine reality. The story of the Incarnation reminds us that we must comprehend that it is to people like us that God sends his messengers to. The people who witness these events are just like you and I. Christ becomes flesh so that we may be able to comprehend how we are to live the truth in love. The message that goes forth from the manger and into the world, through the lips and actions of Jesus, is the same message that captures the hearts and imaginations of many Christians today. In our final week of preparation for Christmas, every one of us ought to be aware that it is such an event that gives us dignity as human beings, which ultimately paves the way to a destiny of resurrection and hope!

Prayer

Marantha, come Lord Jesus. Come enter into our lives as you did in ancient times. We know that you entered into the lives of Mary, Joseph and the prophets from of old – so enter into our lives. May you find a welcome in our homes and in our work. Let us always be aware of your presence in our world. As we approach the day of your birth – may we learn from your humanity and know your saving love. Amen.
