The Joy of Love: Easter Renewal Signals Renewal of **Entirety of Saint John**

Happy Easter to all!

We are tremendously blessed as a Parish Family to have all of us together on this day of resurrection and joy. I hope you can take a moment before Mass begins or after it is over to greet those around you, no matter if you have seen them in the church every weekend or if this is the first time you have seen their face. Our Joy of Love comes directly from Our Holy Father, Pope Francis. His calling to the Catholic Church is to be a faith of love, a faith of mercy, a faith of hospitality and inclusion. That can only be possible if we all take to heart the message of Jesus to love each other as we wish to be loved and then live it out in our daily lives. We need to take tangible actions to spread this joy to the world, and it starts right here. Saint John the Evangelist is renewing and transforming our campus and our mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community.

You may be sitting in our church today. If you are, you may not be able to immediately recognize the significant damage and destruction to this beloved building caused by Hurricane Irma. You cannot see the complete and total loss of the tile roof, including the skylight above the altar that is currently patched with plywood. You may not be able to see the shadow of water damage on our cedar ceiling, or the carpet and pews. This summer, we will be undergoing a major construction effort to repair the environment of our church. There are many essential efforts we will take on to renew the church and ensure it is safe and accessible for generations to come.

If you are sitting in the Ballroom today, the changes are much more noticeable. The total transformation of the Ballroom, our primary social space for our Parish Family and a resource for hundreds of groups in the area annually, had to be prioritized due to the storm damage that completely destroyed this space. As of this writing, we are working tirelessly day and night to make it ready for Easter, but it almost certainly is not complete. Once it is finished, it will be a spectacular location for our activities ranging from Big Band Dances to wedding receptions to fundraisers to the Naples Council of World Affairs.

Depending on where you parked today, you can also see the new hub for activities and events at Saint John - the Pulte Family Life Center (pictures on Page 9 of this bulletin). This is where the renewal and new programs of the Catholic Youth Organization and the Catholic Adult Organization will take place to transform Saint John as the hub of both faithful action and exciting events for the community. This new, 30,000 sq. ft. facility will house a tremendous set of activities every single day for all ages. In the early morning, it will be a gym and physical fitness center with Zumba, boot camps, and exercise equipment for adults. The mornings will provide additional physical fitness and activity opportunities for our Experienced individuals, with bocce, luncheons, cards, and silver sneaker programs. The afternoon transforms the Life Center into an afterschool program space, with physical activities, arts, music, science, and technology as a safe, productive, and engaging environment for the youth of the area. Finally, the evenings will hold something for everyone, from open gym and hangout time for youth, CYO sports games and practices, adult pickup basketball and soccer, open mic nights, happy hours, family movie nights, bingo, music concerts, theatrical events, and so many more activities to ensure every person and every family can find something interesting to do here at Saint John.

If this is the first you are hearing about our Life Center, we are looking forward to having you check it out starting this summer. If you have heard me drone on about it for the last three years as part of our Parish Family, we have done it, all thanks to your prayers and support. We still have many challenges to overcome in this next year, but we are up to the task to spread the joy of our faith to the entire community through our renewed programs and our actions every single

The goal is always to raise funds for those who have the very least in a part of the world that is only a short flight away from the coast of Florida. For twenty years we have dedicated our ministry to the medical, dental, and optical clinics in both the Kingston and Montego Bay Diocese. In addition to those clinics, we are also heavily involved in supporting schools and offering scholarships to needy students. In fact, we have provided shoes and uniforms to children who were unable to attend school because of lack of money to purchase these necessities.

In Jamaica, access to education beyond the sixth grade is not granted to those who cannot afford the tuition. Over the years we have awarded thousands of dollars in scholarships to worthy students who have no hope of attending grades beyond the elementary level. We are the dependable friend and the caring sponsor for deserving students who have few resources and little opportunity to better themselves. Making a difference in the lives of the people we serve has always been our mantra and contributions from St. John parishioners have always played a significant role in our efforts to fulfill that pledge. A Stone Rolled Away -Death Set Aside (John 20: 1-9)

hen we visit a grave, we are confronted with the transience of life, and we enter the realm of memory. It is there that we stop, mourn the loss, and say a prayer in hopeful anticipation of the time yet to come for each one of us. In the Rite of Christian Burial we pray, "The grave is a sign of hope that promises resurrection, even as it claims our mortal bodies." For those who have no faith, the grave represents a barren wasteland that surrenders itself to eternal death. However, for those of us who believe, it is a sure sign of metamorphosis and

> transformation. Our perspective of the grave radically changes because of what took place in a garden of rest two thousand years ago.

Reflection Questions

- Why is the resurrection of Jesus important to you?
- How does the empty tomb transform the graves of those you have lost?
- How do you experience the presence of the Risen Lord in your everyday
- What is your ultimate destiny?
- What choices can you make to lead you to heaven?
- How does the promise of resurrection color your view on your own relationships?
- How does this promise help you build your relationship with God?

There is no way to know what was going through the mind of Mary of Magdala as she set out to pay her respects at the grave of Jesus. Every step that she took from her home to his tomb must have been haunted by what had gone on three days earlier. Her life had been transformed by the gentle mercy and healing of the one who embodied the compassion of God. Then she saw this man, this instrument of God, being insulted, tortured, and killed before her eyes. Mary had heard Jesus talk about the rebuilding of the temple, but it probably did not resonate in her soul. On the first day of the week, this broken-hearted woman set out to the tomb so she could grieve for the one who was so dear to her. She had surrendered to the painful reality that she had endured. However, when she arrived at the tomb, saw the stone removed, and noticed the burial cloths discarded, she entered yet again into the extraordinary life that Jesus had to offer. She ran back and reported what she had found; the disciples set out and when they had arrived, they discovered the truth in what she had reported. The youngest one saw and believed that Jesus had been raised. The days that followed gave witness to that belief as

Jesus appeared several times to his followers.

Jesus died and rose again to pave the way for our eternal salvation. The empty tomb fills us with the tremendous possibilities of everlasting life. Jesus shows us that death is not the end, but a new beginning. When we find ourselves at the funeral of a loved one and face the finality of the grave, we are to remember always the journey of Christ's death and resurrection to assure us of the hope that is truly ours. The stone that was rolled away from the tomb represents Christ's victory of death. It symbolizes the removal of death giving way to the newness of life.

As we celebrate this Easter day, let us give thanks to the Lord for the lives of all those who have gone before us. Let us let go of our fear of death and embrace the hope of resurrection. Each day for us is a step closer to the kingdom that awaits us, and so we are to appreciate that the sacrament of the present moment ultimately leads us to this promise of life.

Faith Formation at St. John the Evangelists Serves Pre-K through 12th Grade

Happy Easter to our St. John families, and a special welcome to all of our visitors to the parish this Easter Weekend. If you currently have children in Pre-K through 12th grade, we invite you to consider Faith Formation as an enriching opportunity for your children. At St. John the Evangelist, our Faith Formation program aims to meet children wherever they are along their faith journey and encourages them to a deeper relationship with Jesus, as they learn about the many beautiful aspects of our Catholic faith. Children study the upcoming Gospel Readings each week as part of the program, enriching their understanding of the Good News of the Gospel and naturally lending to fuller participation during the celebration of the Sunday Mass.

Our Faith Formation program, which runs from September through May, also provides sacramental preparation for the Pre-K through 12th grade youth of Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church. Youth are encouraged to be part of a continuous, spiraling curriculum that builds upon prior knowledge with each consecutive year of engagement. Specifically, to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist, children must be at least seven years old and in the second grade.

To receive the sacrament of First Communion, children must meet the requirements to receive First Reconciliation and First Eucharist, as well as have a minimum of two consecutive years of religious instruction. To receive the sacrament of Confirmation, children must have a minimum of two consecutive years of religious instruction, have received their First Reconciliation and First Communion, be at least 15 years old, and be in the tenth grade.



The Pivotal Players Continues Wednesday, April 4th Featuring The Theologian, St. Thomas Acquinas



We find Bishop Bob Barron and his film crew in Italy to tell the story of St. Thomas Aquinas, and explore how this 13th century theologian shaped the life of the Church and changed the course of civilization.

The relationship of faith and reason was under intense scrutiny in an age beholden to the competing claims of fundamentalism and secularism. So called "new atheists" insisted that the claims of religion amounted to mere superstition, a retrograde holdover from a time long ago. Others insisted that the life of faith is a retreat into emotions and subjectivism. St. Thomas Aquinas anticipated these objections and trends and demonstrated that to believe is to think and that the life of the mind is integral to life in Christ.

Bishop Barron recounts that, "He was famously absent-minded. They say that a brother Dominican was assigned to sit next to him at meals to make sure he didn't put anything inedible in his mouth." Discover more stories and learn more about where St. Thomas lived, learned, and wrote.
