Never again should our Parish Family feel like we need to rush off campus after Mass or when dropping a child off for Faith Formation. We should feel like we can enjoy our "Third Place" with each other. Grab a coffee. Take in a concert or read some poetry for Open Mic Night. Meet friends for bocce or Happy Hour. Join in a discussion with other business professionals or try to beat your best time on the exercise equipment.

Father John's vision extended to our church building as well. We will be moving forward with his thoughts and plans for the liturgical environment that will invigorate our faith and serve us for years to come. More details on these efforts will be coming soon.
