What is most impressive to us is the completeness of our Parish Family that supported the event. Nearly every Ministry joined together, along with hundreds of volunteers from our church and the area to ensure a successful endeavor. From everyone who brought 252 turkeys and 138 pies (or supported the purchase with gifts) on Bring Your Turkey to Church Weekend to the multiple shifts of turkey shredders the day before to the dozens of dedicated individuals that served the meals, this Thanksgiving in the Park could not have been better organized and executed. Fr. Len and Fr. Tom helping with shredding (and cleaning up) during the turkey pull as well as Fr. Bob and Fr. Tom serving meals in the Park all day. Our SJE staff also put in countless hours. Tricia Schwarz assisted with communication and coordination. Ovidio and Jesus, our tremendous Facilities staff, worked nearly around the clock all week to ensure we were able to get the food safely in place and took care of just about every facet of the program.

And, most importantly, I want to thank my beautiful (inside and out) wife, Donna. She took on this extremely complicated project last year, and she has made it flourish with her strengths in organization and execution as a full-time job. I am so grateful to Donna for dedicating her life and our family to this effort and to our Parish Family every day. Celebrating the Saints: Our Lady of Guadalupe and Saint Juan Diego

Under this title, Our Lady is the patron of Mexico, the United States, and all of the Americas, as well as the protector of unborn children. In 1531, she appeared in a vision to the peasant Juan Diego on Tepeyac Hill near Mexico City and charged him with asking the bishop to build a church on that spot. But the bishop demanded a sign, so Our Lady had Juan gather flowers in his cloak in December to take to the bishop. When Juan opened his cloak, the colorful image of Guadalupe was emblazoned on the cactuscloth. That icon is preserved in the most famous shrine in the Western Hemisphere, and Our Lady of Guadalupe continues to inspire poor and oppressed people worldwide.
