How could we ensure our children would integrate our Catholic Social Teaching and Belief Structure into their lives beyond the hour a week of Mass and Faith Formation? For many of our Parish Family, CYO was the answer for them. Catholic Youth Organization, or CYO, was the place where life-long friendships were kindled on the basketball court. Spouses were met at dances and socials. Purpose to help the homeless was developed during trips to the soup kitchen. CYO integrates our faith and our

community into the youth of our Parish Family.

Unfortunately, we found that has been defunct in the state of Florida for over 36 years now. That was not acceptable to us, so we have restarted CYO here at Saint John and spearheaded its growth for the entire area. The fruits of this labor are already showing the tremendous promise of bringing families to the church and to our faith. Our new Life Center is ideally suited and up for this task. Please help us continue the success of bringing youth and families to our faith through our CYO activities with your support, participation (we can always use a cheering section, along with coaches and instructors), and prayers.



 $extbf{T}_{ ext{oday}' ext{s}}$  Gospel reading is an amazing passage of scripture. In this passage Jesus gives us a beautiful picture of what a life based on love looks like.

Now, I know what many of you are thinking. That's impossible! We can't live like that. It demands too much of us. Who can love their enemies, do good to those who hate them, pray for those who mistreat them? I mean, besides Jesus. He certainly did each of those things. But can we? Can we love like Jesus loved? I believe we can. Maybe not perfectly – after all, we're not Jesus. But we can do better than we're doing.

Jesus' entire philosophy of life was based on love. This is the important truth you simply cannot miss. Do you see what Jesus is trying to do in today's Gospel? He is giving His listeners a new picture of what their lives should look like. Jesus was surrounded by a huge crowd. This crowd included Jewish citizens and members of the Jewish ruling class, the Pharisees. It also included folks from Tyre and Sidon, pagan cities that practiced Baal worship, and Roman troops who exploited and oppressed the Jews. These folks were standing shoulder-to-shoulder with their enemies as Jesus spoke.

When Jesus said, "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you . . ." He was introducing them to a whole new way of looking at life. This is how things work in the Kingdom of God, Jesus was saying to them. Jesus' entire philosophy of life was rooted in love.



I am constantly amazed how many Christians miss that truth. There's a reason for that, of course. Maybe we have never really listened to the teachings of Jesus. Notice how Jesus begins this teaching: "But to you who are listening, love your enemies . . ." That's interesting. "To you who are listening . . ." Not everybody is listening, are they?

Let us open our ears, our minds, and our hearts to the teachings of Christ. We are called to risk being generous with our love and forgiveness. We are called to be light for the kingdom.

We find Bishop Bob Barron and his film crew in Italy to tell the story of St. Thomas Aquinas.

The relationship of faith and reason was under intense scrutiny in an age beholden to the competing claims of fundamentalism and secularism. So called "new atheists" insisted that the claims of religion amounted to mere superstition, a retrograde holdover from

a time long ago. Others insisted that the life of faith is a retreat into emotions and subjectivism. St. Thomas Aquinas anticipated these objections and trends and demonstrated that to believe is to think and that the life of the mind is integral to life in Christ.





Presents Film: Bogdan's Journey Sunday, February 24, at 2:30 p.m.

at St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church, Pulte Center

A Roman Catholic man works to heal a 69-year-old rift between Poles and Jews. In a story that begins with murder and ends with reconciliation, one man persuades the people of Kielce, Poland, to confront the truth about the darkest moment in their past: Kielce was the site of Europe's last Jewish pogrom.

In 1946, forty holocaust survivors seeking shelter in a downtown building were murdered by townspeople. Communist authorities suppressed the story, leaving the town deeply embittered.

For Bogdan Bialek, a Catholic Pole, anti-Semitism is a sin. This conviction is the animating force of his life. Conflict over the pogrom was still a festering wound when Bialek moved to Kielce in the late 70s. He was shocked by the poisoned atmosphere of his new town. Trained as a psychologist, he has made it his life's work both to persuade people to embrace their past and to reconnect the city with the international Jewish community.


