Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

For three years, Jesus had gone from village to village doing good, teaching, and healing. Everywhere He went, He was surrounded by crowds of people who listened to Him, and sought things from Him. It had been an incredibly full and active three years. Yet during all that time, He had been in control. He came and went more or less as He pleased.

But when He was handed over to his enemies in the garden of Gethsemane (handed over by one of His own), all this came to an end. It represented a turning point in His ministry. From then on, He began to undergo suffering. And that's when His passion began. From that moment on, He was no longer in control of what was happening. Things were now done to Him rather than by Him.

Thus He was arrested, put in prison, led before Caiphas, Herod, and Pilate, interrogated, scourged, crowned with thorns, given a cross to carry, stripped of His clothes, nailed to the cross, mocked ... and finally, He died. Jesus fulfilled His mission not only by what He did, but also, and more especially, by what was done to Him – by His passion. We have to be very clear about one thing: the Father didn't throw Him to the wolves. Jesus died voluntarily. He gave His life.

Much of our lives are determined more by what is done to us than by what we do: in a very real sense, this is our passion. It is this passion, if we can genuinely accept it, as well as our actions, that leads to salvation. It is important to realize the extent to which we are acted upon. As children, we are 'at the mercy' of adults. As we move through life, there is fate, betrayal, bad-luck, illness of one kind or another, loss of friendships, failure in relationships, disappointments with spouses and children, the death of loved ones, the drudgery of the workplace, and so on.


Of course, there are joyful moments and periods of peace, too. But the reality is that there are many things which are outside our control. They are all part of what it means to be human. We do, however, have a choice in how we respond to what life throws at us. It can make us or break us. Jesus survived as Himself – strong, pure, good. Who would we be, if loss, or crisis, or the depredations of time were to take away from us the trappings of success, of self-importance, even personality, itself?




The Passion Story shows how Jesus responded to what was done to Him. He absorbed all the violence, transformed it, and returned it as love and forgiveness. This is the victory of love over all the powers of destruction. There was nothing but love in him. Even when they nailed his hands and feet, he was loving. It helps to think about that when we are going through hard times.







Celebrating the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday



The Triduum celebrations begin with evening Mass on Maundy Thursday, which recalls the Last Supper and Christ's institution of the Eucharist.

On Good Friday, after the reading of the passion according to St. John, special prayers for the whole world, and the adoration of the cross, comes the Mass of the Presanctified, in which there is no consecration, but hosts already consecrated are distributed.

After sunset on Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil celebrates Christ's resurrection and our dying and rising with him in baptism. A service of light and the blessing of the paschal candle introduce a series of scriptural readings that recapitulate the whole history of salvation from creation to the resurrection. The catechumens are baptized, they and the candidates are confirmed, and the whole community renews its baptismal promises before the Eucharist is celebrated.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy as a Novena

The Lord promised, "By this Novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls."

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy.

The Novena will begin on Good Friday. We can make this novena for our personal intentions, for others and for the souls in Purgatory.

Most Merciful Jesus, whose very nature it is to have compassion on us and to forgive us, do not look upon our sins but upon our trust which we place in Your infinite goodness. Receive us all into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart, and never let us escape from it. We beg this of You by Your love which unites You to the Father and the Holy Spirit. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon all mankind and especially upon poor sinners, all enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, show us Your mercy, that we may praise the omnipotence of Your mercy for ever and ever. Amen.

Second Day - Today bring to Me THE SOULS OF PRIESTS AND RELIGIOUS

Most Merciful Jesus, from whom comes all that is good, increase Your grace in men and women consecrated to Your service, that they may perform worthy works of mercy; and that all who see them may glorify the Father of Mercy who is in heaven. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the company of chosen ones in Your vineyard-upon the souls of priests and religious; and endow them with the strength of Your blessing. For the love of the Heart of Your Son in which they are enfolded, impart to them Your power and light, that they may be able to guide others in the way of salvation and with one voice sing.

Third Day - Today bring to Me ALL DEVOUT AND FAITHFUL SOULS

Most Merciful Jesus, from the treasury of Your mercy You impart Your graces in great abundance to each and all. Thus may they never fail in love or lose the treasure of the holy faith, but rather, with all the hosts of Angels and Saints, may they glorify Your boundless mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Fourth Day - Today bring to Me THOSE WHO DO NOT BELIEVE IN GOD AND THOSE WHO DO NOT YET KNOW ME

Most compassionate Jesus, You are the Light of the whole world. Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who do not believe in God and of those who as yet do not know You. Let the rays of Your grace enlighten them that they, too, together with us, may extol Your wonderful mercy; and do not let them escape from the abode which is Your Most Compassionate Heart. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls of those who do not believe in You, and of those who as yet do not know You, but who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Draw them to the light of the Gospel. These souls do not know what great happiness it is to love You. Grant that they, too, may extol the generosity of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart all meek and humble souls and the souls of little children. These souls send all heaven into ecstasy and they are the heavenly Father's favorites. They are a sweet-smelting bouquet before the throne of God; God himself takes delight in their fragrance. These souls have a permanent abode in Your Most Compassionate Heart, O Jesus, and they unceasingly sing out a hymn of love and mercy. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon meek souls, upon humble souls, and upon little children who are enfolded in the abode which is the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls bear the closest resemblance to Your Son. Their fragrance rises from the earth and reaches Your very throne. Father of mercy and of all goodness, I beg You by the love You bear these souls and by the delight You take in them: Bless the whole world, that all souls together may sing out the praises of Your mercy for endless ages. Amen.

Seventh Day - Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ESPECIALLY VENERATE AND GLORIFY MY MERCY

Most Merciful Jesus, whose Heart is Love Itself, receive into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls of those who particularly extol and venerate the greatness of Your mercy. These souls are mighty with the very power of God Himself. In the midst of all afflictions and adversities they go forward, confident of Your mercy; and united to You, O Jesus, they carry all mankind on their shoulders. These souls will not be judged severely, but Your mercy will embrace them as they depart from this life. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls who glorify and venerate Your greatest attribute, that of Your fathomless mercy, and who are enclosed in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. These souls are a living Gospel; their hands are full of deeds of mercy, and their hearts, overflowing with joy, sing a canticle of mercy to You, O Most High! I beg You O God: Show them Your mercy according to the hope and trust they have placed in You. Let there be accomplished in them the promise of Jesus, who said to them that during their life, but especially placed at the hour of death, the souls who venerate this fathomless mercy of His, He, Himself, will defend as His glory. Amen.

Eighth Day - Today bring to Me THE SOULS WHO ARE DETAINED IN PURGATORY

Most Merciful Jesus, You Yourself have said that You desire mercy; so I bring into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart the souls in Purgatory, souls who are very dear to You, and yet, who must make retribution to Your justice. May the streams of Blood and Water which gushed forth from Your Heart put out the flames of Purgatory, that there, too, the power of Your mercy may be celebrated. Eternal Father, turn Your merciful gaze upon the souls suffering in Purgatory, who are enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. 


Zumba at St. John
