Ministry Spotlight

NET Missionaries Inspire Othes and Change Lives

My name is Sierra Studer. For the past three years, I have spent much time with the NET Missionaries assigned to our parish. This organization has made such a positive impact on my life that I feel called to do the same for others.

When my family moved to Florida in 2011, we joined St. John The Evangelist Parish, where I was an altar server for several years before joining our youth group and Confirmation class. In May, I will be graduating from Gulf Coast High School here in Naples as a member of the National Honor Society, member of our leadership team with the FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes), and a four-year letter winner on our girl's golf team.

Throughout high school, I participated in many community service projects including Meals of Hope and teaching English as a Second Language to local employees. In 2018, I joined a group from SJECC in the March for Life in Washington DC. Last summer, as well as this coming summer, I will be joining a group from our local FCA Chapter in a Mexico Mission Trip to build homes for those in extreme poverty and unlike most of my friends from high school that are going on to college, after much prayer and discernment, I have decided to take an exciting ministry opportunity.

NET (National Evangelization Teams) Ministries challenges young Catholics to love Christ and embrace the life of the Church. Every August, 175 young Catholics aged 18-28 leave behind their jobs, school, family, and friends to devote nine months to serving with the NET. In August, I will travel to MN to participate in a five-week faith-training program where I will learn how to grow in my own personal faith and how to effectively communicate the Gospel to young people. The first half of training has a deep emphasis on personal spiritual formation, and the second half focuses on the practical ministry skills that NET uses to reach young people today.

From September through May, I will be in full-time active ministry with my NET travel retreat team facilitating retreats six days a week for youth in junior high and high school. In an average nine-month season, our team will travel 20,000 miles, serve seven to eight dioceses, facilitate nearly 150 retreats and reach 8,500 young people one-on-one with the Gospel. Throughout the entire retreat, the youth are extended the invitation to embrace their faith and cultivate a personal relationship with Christ.

Since 1981, NET teams have led over 32,000 retreats and ministered to more than 2 million young Catholics. To participate in this group and mission work has been a dream and goal of mine for the past three years.

May I ask for your help to partner with me? In order to cover the costs of training, transportation, equipment, and a small monthly stipend, I need to raise a minimum of \$7,000 for this year of service. I will be available before and after every Mass next weekend (May 11th and 12th) to answer any questions you may have. I have donation envelopes, or you can visit www. netusa.org/donate. NET Ministries is a registered 501(c)(3) tax-exempt charitable organization. I also ask you to also pray for me as I ask God to guide me through this next year and participate in this very exciting program. I thank you in advance for your kind consideration.



Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

The reading from Acts tells of the opposition the apostles encountered from the Jewish authorities. They came out of it with great credit, especially Peter. It's hard to believe that this is the same man who, a short time before this, denied Jesus three times. Now he stood his ground and courageously bore witness for Jesus. And suffered for that stand: he and his fellow apostles were flogged. But they were glad to suffer for the sake of Jesus. From where did Peter get his new-found courage? He got it from the Holy Spirit and from the support of his fellow apostles.

Fortunately, ever since the time of the apostles there have been Christians who, by the grace of God, have been able to overcome fear and witness to the Gospel, even in the most difficult circumstances.

In March 1983, the Russian poet, Irina Ratushinskaya, was sentenced to seven years hard labor and five years internal exile. Her crime - writing poetry, which the communist authorities didn't approve of. In prison she suffered beatings, forced feeding, and solitary confinement in freezing conditions. She developed heart, liver, and kidney trouble, as well as chronic bronchitis. Even in such conditions, she continued to write, smuggling the poems out on scraps of paper given to sympathetic warders, soldiers, and visitors. She was released in October 1986.

Her Christian faith was vital to her survival. She says: "When you are in trouble, under pressure, God always seems closer. God was like a hand on our shoulder in the camp."

People like Irina are an inspiration to us. They expand the possibilities of human love and courage. It's easy to believe in God when you are on your knees with your eyes closed, just as it is easy to be a Christian far away from the clamor and the trials of the world of people. But it's a poor religion that believes God is to be found only in places far removed from the world. God can't be confined in this way.

We are disciples of Jesus. He depends on us to bear witness to him in the world today. Few of us will be called on to suffer what the apostles or people like Irina suffered. But we may have to face something which is almost as bad - the deadly indifference of our fellow citizens.



We can't tell in advance where the Christian vocation will take us, or what it may demand from us. If we could see those places, perhaps our hearts would grow faint and courage would fail us. In that respect, we are like Peter. When he first responded to the call of Jesus, he had no idea that it would lead him to martyrdom. But whatever the Christian vocation demands of us will be returned with a hundredfold increase.


