Our Parish Family has always responded to the needs of our community. From the moment the decision was made to create our Parish, and we moved into the Naples Park Elementary School cafeteria, through the fundraisers to create the Parish Activity Center and Claussen Family Center, to our most recent endeavor to Build Our Future, Serve Our Past Capital Campaign. We have had a challenging road together these past years:

3/2015 Parish Launches Capital Campaign

9/2017 Hurricane Irma Hits Campus

3/2019 Pulte Family Life **Center Opens** 













7/2017 Life Center Site **Preparations** Begin

But we have now come to see the fruits of our labors. The Pulte Family Life Center is full of youth and adults laughing and engaging in activities every day. Our new church is open and has drawn praise at every level as a house that enlivens our faith. We are very blessed to have come through these years stronger than ever.

As we discussed last week, we took the opportunities presented to us with the Campaign and the damage inflicted on our campus from Hurricane Irma to complete our Five-Year Capital Plan and more all at once. The demolition from the insuranceapproved repairs allowed for "future-proofing" of our campus, with special consideration for the safety and security of our Parish Family. We were able to completely overhaul the electrical environment, which will save money in the long run. We were able to put in surveillance and access control systems that are centralized for the entire campus, making it easier to protect every individual who enters our safe space. We did not just do "like-for-like" replacements of major components of our church. For example, the pews are substantially improved and provide over 1700 seats now, an increase in the total available seating. Most importantly, by executing all these repairs and renovations at the same time, we avoided another church closure in five years from now if we were to undertake the renewal efforts that had been planned during the Campaign.

All this effort, however, did require additional investments that were over and above the \$11 million gathered in the Capital Campaign. While the insurance did defray a component of this cost, the overall \$16.4 million in construction on our campus in the last two years has left us with about \$1.8 million left to fund. The Diocese has graciously assisted us in this effort, and will now allow us to fundraise without impacting our CFA Assessment for the remainder of this shortfall. It is now up to us again, as we have done in the past, to rally together to Finish Our Church.

As part of this last component of our Capital Campaign (which, coincidentally, nearly matches our Pinnacle Goal from that original effort), we have some very unique memorial opportunities within our new church:

**7** olstoy tells a story about a peasant called Pakhom who desperately wanted to own some land. By saving every penny he had, he bought forty acres. He was overjoyed. However, he soon felt cramped, so he sold the forty acres, and bought eighty acres in another region. But this didn't satisfy him for long, so he began to look again.

One evening, a stranger arrived. Pakhom talked about his desire for more land. The stranger told him that beyond the mountains there lived a tribe of simple people who had lots of land for sale.

Off he went the next day. The chief welcomed him and said, "For only a thousand rubles, you can have as much land as you can walk round in a day. But you must return to the spot from where you started on the same day, otherwise you forfeit the money."

Pakhom was thrilled. He couldn't sleep all that night, thinking of all the land that would soon be his. As soon as the sun peeped above the horizon, a marker was put down on top of a knoll, and he was off. Men followed him on horseback and drove stakes into the ground to mark the path he traced out.

He walked fast and made excellent progress. The farther he went the better the land became. In his eagerness to encompass as much as he could, he lost track of time. Then to his horror he saw the sun beginning to go down. He headed for the knoll as fast as he could. He just made it to the top as the sun vanished. Once there, however, he collapsed face downwards on the ground.

"I congratulate you," said the chief. "You have earned more than any man I can remember." But Pakhom made no reply. They turned him over. He was dead.

Money and material possessions are necessary.

Jesus' parable is not about need but about greed. The farmer was rich to begin with, but he still wasn't satisfied. Greed is like a fire – the more wood you pile on it, the hungrier it gets.

When the crow builds a nest in the forest, it occupies but a single branch. When the deer slakes its thirst at the river, it drinks no more than it needs at that moment.



My friends, all of us have a craving for security. In biblical times, when famine was a recurrent threat, they sought security by stockpiling grain. In our times, we seek it by stockpiling money and possessions. People accumulate things and cling to them, because they give the illusion of security. But security cannot be found in possessions. It can be found only in God.

Earthly things can never satisfy the human heart. Only God can give us the kind of happiness our hearts long for. Hence, St Paul says, "Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth." And Jesus urges us not to store up treasures on earth but to make ourselves rich in the sight of God. What makes us rich in the sight of God is not what we own, or even what we've done, but who we are.





# Adult Faith Formation and RCIA

### Preview of Programs Coming to St. John the Evangelist in September:

Over the next few weeks, we will introduce the Adult Faith Formation programs that you can participate in this Fall. This week:



Just as the Bible Timeline explores Genesis to Jesus, Epic examines the last 2,000 years from Saint Peter to Saint John Paul II.

As Catholics, we are heirs to a remarkable heritage. The history of our Faith is so much more than the recitation of popes, people, places, and events. It is a fascinating story of adventure, rebellion, tragedy, and triumph. It is the epic story of our ancestors in the Faith – the heroic men and women who shaped civilization and spread the Gospel throughout the world.

Knowledge of our Catholic story helps provide meaning to the present, and the present determines the future. Many in our society misunderstand and even attack the Church for its supposed past misdeeds. Topics such as the Crusades, the Inquisition, and Galileo are used in an attempt to discredit the Church and its role in the world. What is the truth concerning these events and persons? How can you answer the objections?

Teachers and historians Steve Weidenkopf and Dr. Alan Schreck developed *Epic: A Journey Through Church History* to help Catholics learn their family story and answer common objections about the Church. Utilizing the same structure as *The Bible Timeline, Epic* divides the two thousand years of Church history into twelve time periods.

This exciting 20-part DVD series takes you through the major people, places, and events that make up the history of the Catholic Church. See the glory of the Church founded by Christ, and understand where you fit into this Epic story.

*Epic*, as the name suggests, takes on one of the most fascinating subjects in history – the rise and impact of Christianity on the world – and delivers it in bite-size format. From humble beginnings in the remote Roman province of Palestine to its now global presence, the story of the Catholic Church is a triumphant story of hope.

A story 2,000 years in the making, one word best describes Catholic history: Epic. In *Epic*, history is not only an interesting subject; it becomes a living reality. This "journey through Church history" is the story of the People of God. It is the story of God's family on Earth.

# Ministry Spotlight

### Boy Scout Troop 226 Travels to Colorado for Summer Camp

For the first time, St. John's own Boy Scout Troop 226 has gone to Colorado for their annual Summer Camp experience. The Troop chose to visit Camp Dietler, located 35 miles northeast of Colorado Springs on the Peaceful Valley Scout Ranch, not only for its scenic landscape, cooler temperatures, and rigorous Scout Skills program, but also to make this more of a true camping experience than most Summer Camp programs offer. For this, they had to bring their own tents, set up their own campsite, and prepare and cook each of their three daily meals, using the "Patrol Method" of teamwork that Scouting has always taught.

"At all our past Summer Camps, our meals were served by the camp staff in a large mess hall," said Senior Patrol Leader Stephen Sedio. "At Camp Dietler, we had to hike half a mile before each meal to pick up the food and recipes, and then hike back to our campsite where each Patrol was equipped with their own prep table and stoves to cook their meals." We hauled a lot of our own equipment all the way from Florida.

Troop 226 patrol members, ranging in age from 11-16, took turns performing all the different tasks required to provide their patrol a hearty meal, from preparing and cooking to dishwashing... easily the least favorite task.

"It was a lot of work, but we learned a lot about teamwork" said Patrol Leader Hunter Lund.

In addition to the cooking skills the Scouts developed, they also attended Merit Badge classes all week, where they were given hands-on instruction in a variety of different areas, like Citizenship, Emergency Preparedness, Metalworking, Geology, and Safe Rifle and Shotgun handling, to name a few.

Another highlight was the Outpost Survival Campout. This required the Troop to hike two miles deeper into the woods and, once there, work together to build a shelter to shield themselves from the elements for the night. Two of our Scouts, Patrol Leader Landin Rautenkranz and Assistant Patrol Leader Thomas Lund, used the Outpost experience to earn their Wilderness Survival Merit Badge. Said Landin, "We were only allowed to build our shelter with natural elements, like tree branches, leaves and rocks. No sleeping bags!"

Overall trip highlights included visits to the U.S. Air Force Academy, the Garden of the Gods National Natural Landmark, the iconic Manitou Springs Incline hiking trail, and a drive to the summit of Pikes Peak, where these Scouts from Florida got to experience snowfall in June, and have an impromptu snowball fight. It was actually snowing so much that they were not able to continue all the way to the Summit. Their busy week of Scouting concluded with an exciting white-water rafting trip down the Arkansas River.

Scoutmaster Steve Sedio and all the Scouts and Leadership of Troop 226 express their tremendous gratitude to the Parishioners of Saint John the Evangelist for their continued support for the Troop and for making such great experiences possible for our boys.
