New Church Survival Guide: Wheelchair Access

With so many changes to our Church Building, we thought it would be helpful to our Parish Family to provide some suggestions and guidance on how to enjoy this faith-enriching environment. This "Survival Guide" will take many forms, from this column to a consolidated pamphlet and even walking tours of the church to help us all Finish the Church. Please join us in embracing these wonderful changes and prayerfully consider any support you can provide to complete this campaign.

From the uneven Spanish tile, to the narrow aisles, to the door thresholds, our previous church building was not very conducive for those members of our Parish Family members in wheelchairs. This challenge was taken head on with our new church design, and we are proud to have implemented key tasks to ensure wheelchair access to our Sanctuary and the Sacraments is a priority. Here are some of the changes we instituted:



ADA Approved Confessionals

Our Confessionals were expanded in size to accommodate a wheelchair, so now a penitent individual can enter and turn in any direction so they can receive the healing power of Reconciliation within the Confessional, if they so choose.



Pews with Integrated Wheelchair Seating

We now have five locations within the church where the pews have specific integrated seating for wheelchairs. This will allow those in the chairs to stay right next to their loved ones and our Parish Family, rather than having to transfer to the pew seating, or be relegated to the aisle.



Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

In the Gospel we see that Jesus didn't hide the reality from His disciples. He pointed out the difficulties, the hardships, and the sacrifices that would be required of those who would follow Him. He told them in no uncertain terms that it wouldn't be easy. So they could not complain later on, "Oh, we never thought it was going to be like this."

It's possible to be a follower of Christ without being a disciple. One might just be a camp-follower rather than a soldier of the King. One might not be pulling one's weight, or playing one's part. One might just be a hanger-on in a great work. One might be a talker rather than a doer.

Once someone approached a famous professor about a young man and asked, "So and so tells me that he was one of your students. Is that correct?" To which the professor replied, "That man did indeed attend my lectures, but believe me he was never a real student of mine."

It is one of the supreme handicaps of the Church that in it there are many people who follow Christ at a safe distance, but very few real disciples, that is, people who actually do what He said.

Let's face it. It is not easy to be a disciple of Christ. Discipleship has some practical demands that one cannot escape under pain of betraying the Gospel. Yet we have many comfortable church-goers who gave little heed to the misery of the needy and the groaning of the poor. Still today the Christian is called to renounce many things that are taken for granted by others.

Some followers melt away as soon as a demand is made on them. Others are destroyed by opposition and criticism.

Jesus said in following Him there is a place for common sense, for prudence, and for counting up the cost. We mustn't take on more than we are capable of. Of course, we won't know in advance what we are capable of. We may underestimate or overestimate ourselves. We may need a challenge to bring the



best out of us.

We can draw encouragement from the example of the apostles. The Gospels show that they struggled at every point to follow Jesus. Yet He did not write them off.

By looking at them we discover our own inadequacies. The Gospel offers hope to Christians who fail. Repentance and a second chance are always possible. Jesus is generous with His grace to those who strive to answer His call.






New Testament Bible Studies

Dr. Edward Sri will guide you through the Gospel of John. He will explain how Christ's encounters with His disciples, the Samaritan woman, the man born blind, and others, are examples of how He lovingly and persistently calls each of us to a more intimate and life-changing relationship with Him.

From the very beginning, Paul's letter to the Romans has been at the center of reflection, conversion, and controversy. *Romans: The Gospel of Salvation* provides a Catholic, comprehensive, and simple way to understand the overarching theme of Romans—salvation. It explores the ways in which Jesus is the fulfillment of Israel's prophecies, which leads to the universal, "Catholic" family of God.

In this program, theology professor Dr. Andrew Swafford and Jeff Cavins examine Paul's letter to the Romans, provide historical context and highlight the connections to Jesus and Christianity Paul makes with the Old Testament.

One word best describes Catholic history: *Epic*. In *Epic*, history is not only an interesting subject; it becomes a living reality.
