Finish the Church: Hurricane Irma's Impact on Our Campus

We are blessed to be back in our church, again whole with our enlivening faith environment. This new persistent message: Finish the Church, is our final push of the Capital Campaign, to complete the transformation of the entire campus and ensure our success for the next 30 years. While we have come far already, we will all need to work together to complete our vision of the new Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church.

September 10, 2017, was the single worst day in our campus' history. The eye of this massive storm passed right over our church, tearing the Northern corner of the building off and sent tiles flying throughout the campus, some even impaling our air conditioning units. The force of the storm was so tremendous that it sheered palm trees in half and sent a branch seven feet into the ground of our Memorial Garden (and yet it did not hit a single urn or headstone).





The storm did not spare a square inch of Saint John. Then, our issues were compounded with the loss of power for over two weeks. The impact of no air conditioning within the buildings that were saturated from the rain and water of the storm caused even more damage than originally anticipated.

The challenges presented by Irma have nearly been overcome. We have almost completely transformed the campus of Saint John the Evangelist, not just repaired the \$4 million in damages approved by the insurance adjusters. Irma gave us a unique opportunity. Instead of just doing the basic repairs identified by insurance or the minimal renovations envisioned at the outset of our Capital Campaign, we had the chance with every wall opened and all the issues of the past 30 years clearly visible, to cost effectively confront deeper renovations and substantially renew every facet of our campus. From parking to plumbing, sound and lighting to flooring and seating, we were able to create a brand-new Saint John that still feels like home.

We need your help to **Finish the Church**. In the next few weeks, you will be hearing more about this last push for our Capital Campaign, and how you may be able to prayerfully consider assisting us with our effort.



Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

"Gratitude is the heart's memory" (French Proverb). The ten lepers in the Gospel owed their lives to Jesus; yet only one of them came back to thank Him.

It's seems strange that the one who came back to give thanks was an outsider – a Samaritan. But isn't that how it often is? The insider takes everything for granted and is taken for granted, too. The outsider, on the other hand, sees everything as a gift.

We find the same thing in the First Reading. We see the foreigner, Naaman, coming back to thank Elisha for curing his leprosy.

We are better at demanding gratitude than at giving it. This indicates how selfish much of our giving can be. If anyone finds his brother ungrateful, it is not the other person's happiness he is seeking, but his own.

Jesus demanded gratitude, but not for Himself. What He said was, "Has no one come back to give praise to God except this foreigner." From this, it's clear that He wasn't thinking of Himself. He was thinking of the lepers. It is a good and necessary thing for the recipient of a favor to be able to show gratitude.

It is very important for us to be able to express thanks. It's good for ourselves in the first place – it forces us to acknowledge the debt we owe to others. And of course it's good for the other person – it makes him/her feel appreciated. The person who does not give thanks for little, does not give thanks for much. Hence the importance of being grateful for and appreciating the small favors done and services rendered every day.

As for expressing gratitude to God: God doesn't need our thanks, but we need to thank God. It reminds us that everything we have, we owe to Him. It's easy to be grateful to God for the good things that happen to us. But we must try to be grateful for all of our lives – the bad as well as the good, the sorrows and the joys, the failures and successes. This is no easy task. We can truly call ourselves grateful people only when we can say thanks for everything that has brought us to this moment. This kind of gratitude

enables us to reclaim our whole past, and to see it as the concrete way in which God has led us to this moment.

When we look back over our lives, we see that the things that hurt us and the things which helped us cannot be separated from each other. We must try to see the guiding hand of a loving God in all that has brought us to where we are now.

Today, at a Mass in Piazza San Pietro in the Vatican, Pope Francis Declared Blessed John Henry Newman, the 19th-Century British Cardinal, a Saint



Saint Cardinal John Henry Newman

By the pope solemnly declaring Newman a saint, the Church offers him as a model of Christian holiness for the faithful and an intercessor in heaven.

Newman was the 19th-century's most important English-speaking Roman Catholic theologian. He spent the first half of his life as an Anglican and the second half as a Roman Catholic. He was a priest, popular preacher, writer, and eminent theologian in both Churches.

Newman has been characterized as the greatest theologian since St. Thomas Aquinas. He has also been praised as the "absent father of Vatican II" because his writings on conscience, religious liberty, Scripture, the vocation of lay people, the relation of Church and State, and other topics were extremely influential in the shaping of the Council's documents.

To discover more about Saint Cardinal John Henry Newman, come to a special screening of Bishop Robert Barron's Pivotal Player episode describing this controversialist, apologist, theologian, educator, and poet, who, through it all, was a lover of the Truth. Seeking the Truth, especially the Truth about God, was the principle passion of his life, and it remained so until his dying day.

Newman was an early proponent of Adult Faith Formation. The Newman Club for Catholic Students is named after him with the first established at the University of Philadelphia. The club now operates at many colleges and universities in the United States.

At Newman's beatification Mass in Birmingham, England, in Sept. 2010, Pope Benedict XVI said that Newman's "insights into the relationship between faith and reason, into the vital place of revealed religion in civilized society, and into the need for a broadly-based and wide-ranging approach to education were not only of profound importance for Victorian England, but continue today to inspire and enlighten many all over the world."

"What better goal could teachers of religion set themselves than Blessed John Henry's famous appeal for an intelligent, well-instructed laity: 'I want a laity, not arrogant, not rash in speech, not disputatious, but men who know their religion, who enter into it, who know just where they stand, who know what they hold and what they do not, who know their creed so well that they can give an account of it, who know so much of history that they can defend it," Pope Benedict said.
