By the numbers, our Parish responded to this vision with substantial support. When we finally closed the initial campaign on March 8, 2018, (the three-year window allowed by the Diocese at the time), we had collected an impressive \$11 million. And not just a small fraction of our Parish gave to this campaign. We had over 2,000 individuals and families participate, which is well over half of our Parish Family. The normal Catholic Church campaign currently has 27% participation in the U.S. We shattered that statistic, and we easily gathered enough for the construction of the Pulte Family Life Center, and much more to shape the future of the campus:



We were just about to identify the additional partial campus improvements we could move forward with the success of our campaign in September of 2017, when we had a visitor... Hurricane Irma.

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

The picture many people have of how the Magi came to Bethlehem goes somewhat like this. They saw a bright star in the eastern sky and began to follow it. The star guided them unerringly, first to Jerusalem, where it temporarily disappeared, and then to Bethlehem where they found the Child Jesus. Put like that, it sounds very simple and very exciting.

But how true is this picture? If we read the Gospel account carefully, we will see that it is quite false. In the Gospel it says that they saw the star 'as it rose.' It says nothing about the star guiding them. What this suggests is that the star was no more than a sign that something unusual had happened, or more precisely, that someone special had been born.

The next time the star is mentioned is when they were on the road to Bethlehem, that is, as they neared the end of their journey. The text says: 'There in front of them was the star they had seen rising.' From this we conclude that in between they traveled in darkness and had to ask and seek and enquire.

Their journey was neither simple nor easy. They encountered difficulties, doubts, and dangers. Yet, in spite of these, they persevered in their quest and were rewarded when they finally found Christ.

This is why their story has such relevance for us. Like them, we too are on a journey. When we start out on the road following the call to be disciples of Christ, we too are attracted by something bright – an ideal or vision or hope. But this initial 'star' does not remain forever in our sky. It grows dim. Clouds get in the way and deprive us of its light.

And we must expect to encounter difficulties and doubts. Some people think they are losing their faith when they experience doubt. We should not be surprised when this happens. We must imitate the Magi. We must not be too proud to ask for guidance. We must believe that the darkness will pass, and once again we will see the initial star beckoning to us. The Magi can serve as models for us on our faith journey. They were single-minded. They refused to be put off by difficulties and hardships.

When they found Christ, they offered Him gold, frankincense, and myrrh.



This shows what happens to those who find Christ. Their hearts are awakened and burst into life. When we find Christ and offer our love to Him, He will help us to open the treasures of goodness that lie buried inside us, so that we can offer "gifts" to our brothers and sisters, especially those who are in need.

Having worshipped Christ, the Magi "returned to their own country by another route." This suggests not just a new geographical route, but a new mentality. Having met Christ and heard his Gospel, we too will travel through life by a different route. We will have different attitudes, different values, different goals. It is impossible to encounter Christ without it affecting the way we live our lives.





This is an exciting time of year at our parish; our seasonal members return and enliven our liturgies and programs, we begin a new decade (although some say the decade doesn't begin until January 2021), we are fully in our new spaces, church, life center and the rest, and new programs kick off the Adult Faith Formation opportunities for you.

Pull Out and Save

We continue with a focus on the Mass, our time to encounter Jesus Christ, converse with Him and enjoy a meal. This winter there are two new programs exploring the Mass, and one new facilitator. We welcome Laura Huggett to our team; she has decades of experience and nothing but rave reviews. She will utilize six great Brant Pitre lectures to explore **Why We Worship**.

A shorter and more focused program, **Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist**, will dig into the constantly challenging belief in and understanding of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Whether you are interested in the Bible stories from the thousand years between David killing Goliath and the Ascension of Jesus, or the Church from the 14th century through the Reformation, Modernism, the Second Vatican Council, to today, there is a *Timeline* program for you.

The Bible Timeline arranges the narrative books of the Bible in chronological order to help you see the big picture. **Epic: A Journey Through Church History** presents the key events and people in Church and secular realms in relation to each other so you can understand why the Church developed as it did.

Two books of the New Testament will be studied in depth. This Liturgical Year, Cycle A, features the **Gospel of Matthew**, and this program will focus on the Chapters that have been chosen for the weekly readings, beginning with the birth of Jesus proceeding to His Ascension in Chapter 28. Deacon John Sebastian has become a member of the team and will take the lead on this program.

Also, from the New Testament, one of Paul's later letters, the Letter to the **Romans** will be read and discussed. It provides a

comprehensive yet simple way to understand salvation.

Christian Meditation returns, but with new presentations. This combination of lecture, discussion, and practice is great for both those interested in an introduction to meditation as well as those who look to take meditation to a deeper level.

Women of the Word continue to meet on Thursday mornings and there is a new **Mornings for Men** that has begun to meet on Sunday mornings. Check them out.

Programs for Parents will continue to meet during youth faith formation times. More details will be forthcoming from Natalie.



The key to understanding the Bible is finding the story that ties it all together. As you see the story unfold, you will see the "big picture" of the





- Fill the peripheries of the world even the digital ones
- Bear witness to the tenderness and mercy of Jesus

For many of us, this trip was our first visit to the midwest. We toured downtown Indianapolis on a bicycle-built-for-16, got really excited when snow fell from the sky, and attended Sunday Mass at St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church (yes, really!) next door to the Indiana Convention Center.

NCYC is a bi-annual event championed by the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry. Attending was inspirational, informative, and invigorating to our relationship with Jesus Christ! SJE's CYO Youth Group is already planning to attend NCYC in 2021. Thank you for all your prayers and for the financial support you provided to make this experience possible.
