Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

The media has done a good job reminding us that today, February 2nd, is a rather special day. Special in the sense that it is Ground Hog Day, and everybody is wondering whether or not the ground hog in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania will see his shadow, determining whether or not we will have six more weeks of winter. Nobody really believes the ground hog can predict the future (except possibly in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania) but it is fun to speculate as to what will happen in the next six weeks with regard to winter. Not that it affects us that much here in beautiful, sunny Naples.

February 2nd is also the day on which the Church celebrates the Presentation of the Lord. The Presentation was the ceremony in which the infant Jesus was brought to the Temple and Mary was purified after childbirth.

The prophet Malachi tells us that the Lord will send a messenger. He will send someone who will be a purifier, someone to help prepare the people for entrance into the temple of the Lord.

Luke provides us the scene at the temple where Mary and Joseph bring their first-born son to be offered to the Lord. Simeon recognizes the child as this purifier, as the one sent to be a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel.

It is in the Letter to the Hebrews, however, that we come to understand how Jesus is that purifier. Though God could have saved us any number of ways, He chose to send His only Son to become one of us.

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews states that surely Jesus did not help angels but rather the descendants of Abraham. It is because Jesus was sent to help us that He became one of us. Hebrews says that in order to be a merciful and faithful high priest before God, Jesus had to become like His brothers in every way. Why was it that the creator of the universe had to become one of us in order to fulfill the prophecy of Malachi and the other prophets? Why could not God have simply chosen some other way?

The mystery of this choice will certainly never be completely understood, but we read in the Letter to the Hebrews that because Jesus, himself, was tested through what He suffered, He is able to help those who are being tested, and are we not tested every day?

This is an astonishing sign of the love of God for His people. Unlike the gods and deities of other faiths, where no doubt people are sincerely seeking God, it is in the Christian faith, and only the Christian faith,



where we can say that God knows, truly knows, what it means to suffer. When we struggle with self-doubt and the pain of loss and anxiety for the future and the suffering of love in its many forms, we can turn to God who knows exactly what that means.

God is presented as a broken king, a suffering servant, a dead man on a cross who came to lay His life down for you and for me. The man on the cross is God, and God knows our suffering and yearns to comfort us as our Mother Mary no doubt comforted the infant Jesus that day. When Mary and Joseph presented Jesus that day, they participated in God's Plan to give meaning to our suffering and to provide a light to the nations, a new hope for the world.

Saint John Financial Dashboard




In our continued evaluation of the most effective and efficient way to communicate our financial environment here at Saint John the Evangelist, we welcome your suggestions. The past few weeks, we have illustrated the true Income of the Parish Family, as well as its expenses. We want to make that information even more digestible, while providing clarity on what and how we utilize your wonderous gifts for our Mission. In following weeks, we will delve into specifics of programs, Ministries, and operations. This week, we wanted to try out a visual representation of the specific details of both our Income and our Expenses on a weekly basis.

Our Income is made up of three core areas. The Offertory, which includes the donations provided in the collection baskets, as well as our online giving program called WeShare, is the bulk of the funds provided to the Parish. Our Standard Income includes special gifts provided outside the Offertory, as well as the rental of our facilities, our Religious Education, and our Poor Box, which goes immediately to the direct support program of our Saint Vincent DePaul Ministry. Our Other Income is made up of the various Ministry activities, the Divine Gift Boutique, and our CYO and CAO Programs. This past week, the total of all three areas was \$59,976.88.

Our Expenses are made up of only two areas. Our Standard Expenses include the cost of the payroll and benefits of the clergy and staff, the operations of our facilities, and the services we provide on a pastoral basis, including our tuition assistance to the local Catholic Schools. The Other Expenses include Ministry Activities as well as the cost of the CYO and CAO Programs. This past week, our total expenses were \$28,284.66.

You may be under the impression that this showcases a significant surplus of funds for the Parish. However, that is not the case. The weekly expenses will fluctuate, especially when larger costs, like the electricity for our buildings or a payroll week, occur, and we must operate understanding there are monthly, quarterly, and annual expenses to consider. That is why we had traditionally placed our weekly budget in the chart with the Offertory report, so you could see a more consistent number. Please provide us with feedback if that is something you would again find helpful, and we will include the week's budget in this new chart format or if you have any other suggestions or questions you would like answered.




Isn't the Church Already Complete?

After Father Tom's stirring Homily last weekend, describing the state of our Parish Family and our campus, as well as illustrating the final step we will need to take together to complete our loan to the Diocese, members of our Finance Council and our Buildings and Grounds Council were ready to explain the situation in detail and openly discuss our next steps together. The question we received the most, and that we have been hearing since we described our **Finish the Church** Campaign, was "The Church looks done to me. Why do we need to finish it?"

Of course, we are excited that the church is nearly complete and, to the standard view, looks to be "finished." The reality is different in two tangible ways, and that is why we have the **Finish the Church** call to action:

- 1. Financial Responsibility: The transformation of our Sanctuary, and truly the entire building of our church, was a massive effort. We are so blessed that we only have \$1.5 million left to pay off the loan. As father mentioned in his Homily, if every family of Saint John was able to contribute \$456, our loan would be completed. We completely understand that this number is unattainable for some, and yet for others, they could contribute for 10 other families. We hope you will be able to assist us **Finish the Church** by paying off this loan as quickly as possible.
- 2. Church is Not Actually Complete: We are still working on the final touches that, while smaller than the brand-new marble altar and statues, need to be completed. For example, we will be completely transforming the parking area immediately adjacent to the front entrance of the church. You may recall that area had been reserved for the priests and only one or two handicap spaces. This area will now become fully utilized for handicap and special needs individuals and families, including expectant mothers. Streaming of the Mass onto the large displays in the Narthex for the families and others that participate in that section of the church has just been activated for this weekend. Handicap Signage for the pews was just installed last month. These smaller projects still need to be completed, hence we still need to **Finish the Church**.






