## Gospel Reflections

### Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Disfiguration and transfiguration. Picture an old oil lamp covered with layers of dust and dirt. How wretched and useless it looks. Then someone comes along, cleans off the layers of dirt, polishes it until it begins to sparkle, and then lights it. Suddenly the lamp is transformed. It positively glows, radiating light and beauty to every corner of the room. Whereas prior to this, it was disfigured with dust and dirt, now it is transfigured with beauty. Yet it is the same lamp. When an object (or a person) is loved and cared for, it is redeemed, and rendered brighter and worthier.

As Jesus went about Galilee, His divinity was cloaked by His humanity.

But on Mount Tabor, God's light burst forth from the body of Jesus, and He was transfigured. The three apostles got a glimpse of His divinity, hidden in the depths of His humanity. They were overcome with the beau and brilliance of it. It was not a surface thing, but an inner essence shining through. God was in Jesus.

There are two potentialities within us – the potentiality for evil and the potentiality for good. Take the potential for evil. We are capable of such things as hatred, bitterness, cruelty, greed, envy, lust ... These are ugly things and bring out the worst in us. They corrupt the heart, and corruption of heart coarsens the face and darkens the eyes. Evil disfigures us.

Take our potential for good. We are capable of such things as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, mercy, compassion ... These are beautiful things and bring out the best in us. They purify the heart, and purity of heart softens the face and causes the eyes to shine. Goodness transfigures us.

Basically, we are transfigured by what we love, what excites us, what moves us, what rouses our spirit, what causes us to be awake and alive. What shows us at our brightest and best.

Van Gogh was not noted for his physical beauty. In fact, his face was described by some as being repulsive. Yet as soon as he began to speak about art, his melancholy expression would disappear, his eyes would sparkle, and his features would make a deep impression on those around him. It wasn't his own face any longer; it had become beautiful. It seemed that he was breathing in beauty.

At times, all of us can feel down, a prey to feelings of failure and worthlessness. But then suddenly something nice happens to us – a friend calls or we get a letter with some good news in it – and suddenly everything is changed. The truth, of course, is that nothing has changed. It's just that a spark of joy or hope or love has been kindled in our hearts, and we see ourselves and our lives in a new and better light.



We are made in the image of God; we carry the splendor of divinity within us. However, sin tarnishes that image and so disfigures us. But virtue causes that image to shine and so transfigures us. We are at our best when we are good.

Like the apostles on Mount Tabor, we, too, can experience rare moments of light and joy. We get glimpses of the promised land towards which we are traveling in faith. In His love for us, God allows us to taste on earth the joys of the world to come.


### Parish Financials

This week, we wanted to provide some deeper numbers than just the financials. 2019 was another banner year for Saint John the Evangelist. Here are some numbers to showcase it:

The first obvious trend is that we are growing in nearly every facet of the Parish Family, even with the church building being out of commission (which contributed to not being able to provide several weddings in 2018 and 2019). The only exception to that trend is our Funerals, which decreased year-over-year. The next trend to watch is the reduction in Individual Registrations (a single person or widow joining the Parish) as opposed to the sizeable increase in both Couples and Families (with children). It will be very interesting to see the 2020 information on these same statistics as we continue to expand programs that draw more to our Parish Family.

This includes not just the wonderful gifts of the Parish Family collected in the basket, but also our online donations and separate Offertory gifts from families that may be giving outside the normal Mass time.



### Traffic and Parking Safety

With so many changes to our Church Building, we thought it would be helpful to our Parish Family to provide some suggestions and guidance on how to enjoy this faith-enriching environment. This "Survival Guide" will take many forms, from this column to a consolidated pamphlet and even walking tours of the church to help us all **Finish the Church**. Please join us in embracing these wonderful changes and prayerfully consider any support you can provide to complete this campaign.



As we continue to discuss the safety of our Parish Family, I wanted to broach a very tough subject. Our campus parking and traffic situation continues to be a major concern for each and every one of us. We have recently undergone major upgrades and enhancements to our campus parking lots and pedestrian areas to make it as safe as possible. In fact, many of these changes, including the new lighting, handicap spots next to the church building, enhanced entrances and exits, and redesigned front and back lots,

may not been fully understood. Here is the new map of our campus:

As you can see, the large back parking lot next to the Pulte Family Life Center provides ample on-campus parking. If you were here during Ash Wednesday, you may have noticed that our Parish Family and Friends took significant liberties with their parking:







This became even worse with our neighbors, with our own police support having to direct traffic away from the school and sprinkler heads being destroyed at the cemetery next door. We need to treat our neighbors with the same respect we would like. It is, after all, the Golden Rule. These steps have been taken to keep you and our entire Parish Family safe.

However, there is a small group of people that are disregarding these essential safety steps, endangering our Parish, as well as our neighbors on either side of us. It is important that we all work together to create the loving and embracing church we are supposed to represent to the world. That starts right here on the campus.

There is a very specific reason that we have created fire lanes on our campus. If someone has a heart attack in our church, we need to ensure the emergency responders and their vehicles can reach that person as quickly as possible. When someone parks in a fire lane, or where there are "No Parking" signs, they could delay the EMTs, police, and/or firemen from reaching that person. Please ensure you choose a properly marked parking space when you arrive on campus. I understand that may mean you will have to park further away from the church, in one of our central or even back lot spots. It may not be the most convenient to have to park in those more distant locations, but that additional walk could save someone's life.

I want to thank all of you, who are in the vast majority, who understand this safety concern, and who do park in the proper locations and ensure we can all enjoy the love, mercy, and happiness that is the heart of our Catholic Faith.

### **More Lenten Practices**

Friends, in today's Gospel, MATTHEW 6:1-6, 16-18, the Lord prescribes prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as our Lenten disciplines.

The Church traditionally says there are three things we ought to do during Lent, and I put stress on the word do. In recent years we've emphasized the interior dimensions a little too much—that Lent is primarily about attitudes, about ideas, and intentions. In the traditional practice of the Church, Lent is about doing things, things that involve the body as much as the mind, that involve the exterior of your life as much as the interior.

The three great practices of Lent—prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—are three things you do. This is going to sound a little bit strange, but my recommendation for this Lent is, in a certain way, to forget about your spiritual life—by which I mean forget about looking inside at how you're progressing spiritually. Follow the Church's recommendations and do three things: pray, fast, and give alms. And as you do, pray to draw closer to the Lord as the center of your life—and the reason you do everything.

Reflect: How do you think the practices of Lent, specifically prayer, almsgiving, and fasting, can lead us to a deeper relationship with Christ?

## Celebrate the Joyous Occasions of Weddings as Part of the Wedding Ministry

The Wedding Ministry is in need of several people interested in learning how to coordinate the wedding rehearsals and attend the weddings the next day. It does not take a great deal of time. The schedule of weddings is given to us at least six months in advance. The number of weddings vary – it could be six to eight a year.

The duties involve communicating with the Bride, usually beginning a month before the wedding, obtaining information about the family and wedding party, usually by email, and/or phone, organizing and attending the rehearsals, and attending the wedding. Most weddings are on Saturday at 1:00 p.m., or occasionally at 6:30 p.m. Rehearsals are the afternoon before at 4:00 p.m.

The image is based on the writings of Saint Faustina, a Polish Nun who wrote a diary recording revelations she received about God's mercy. The image originated from a vision she had on February 22, 1931. "... Jesus said to me, Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world."

"The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for Water, which makes the soul righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood, which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy, when My agonizing Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him."

"I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I, Myself, will defend it as My own glory."

"I want the image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it."


