Life Center Opens Again June 8

Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church is blessed to be able to serve our Parish Family and the larger community with our Pulte Family Life Center, a place for wellness: body, mind, soul, and spirit. The building has been closed for all individuals and activities since the Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

We have been given authorization to once again open the Life Center for limited hours and participants beginning Monday, June 8. Our initial operating hours will be Monday – Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. All activities will be required to conform to these hours as we evaluate the usage and the policies required to ensure everyone’s safe and healthy return to the Life Center. Further announcements of various programs will be provided as we approve their activities can be performed with appropriate social distancing and conformance to the listed rules and regulations.

During this First Phase of Recovery, there are some significant rules and regulations for use of the Life Center that must be adhered to. If you are caught out of compliance with these rules, your membership to the Life Center could be terminated immediately. If you plan to come to the Life Center, please read the rules and regulations document and sign it prior to your arrival. Copies will also be available at the Life Center Desk and our Front Office.

Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

It is necessary to be alone sometimes, for the soul requires solitude in order to maintain its individuality. But we couldn't live like that. We'd go mad. The fact is: we are remarkably dependent on one another. We need other people in our lives - for support, affirmation, encouragement, companionship. They nourish and sustain us in a hundred different ways. And of course we nourish them also.

Today people are schooled in individualism with the result that they find community difficult. There is a lot of loneliness in the world today. Many people are crying out for a friend, for a companion, for a sense of belonging.

The word 'companion' is a lovely word. It comes from, two Latin words: cum which means with, and panis which means bread. So a 'companion' literally means someone with whom I share bread. It's not everyone that you enjoy a meal with. Not everyone that you invite in for a cup of tea. There has to be a bond. And that bond is deepened by the sharing of food and drink. When people invite us to their table they offer us more than food. They offer us trust, welcome and friendship. We feel honored. The talk is as much a part of the fare as the food. Afterwards we feel nourished, not only in body, but also in heart and spirit.

The Eucharist is the meal that we share in the Lord's memory and at his command. By inviting us to partake of the sacred food of the Eucharist, Jesus makes us his companions and friends. And in doing so we ought to become companions and friends to one another.

We need Christ - that's obvious. But we also need one another. To be a believer, or just a spiritual person, in today's world can be a lonely business. Here is where the community comes in. We are a community of believers whose common faith strengthens the faith of each individual.

The first Christians supported one another. They forgave each other's offenses, shared their possessions, and fostered the spirit of community. Sharing creates a bond, and bonding leads to sharing. The Eucharist was at the centre of everything. It was this that bound them together and enabled them to offer a loving service to one another.

Recalling the words of Jesus, the Catholic Church professes that, in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats

this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. . . . For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink". The whole Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearances of bread and wine—the glorified Christ who rose from the dead after dying for our sins. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist. The risen Christ is present to his Church in many ways, but most especially through the sacrament of his Body and Blood. I give thanks to God in a special way for that most incredible gift of his Real Presence in the Eucharist and for the fact that we are back together as a community.



Phase 1 Reopening of PFLC

Pulte Family Life Center Rules and Regulations

Background

Due to the COVID-19 Outbreak, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the State of Florida, and the Diocese of Venice all provided guidance to close all facilities and activities on the campus of Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church. This included our Pulte Family Life Center (PFLC), a gym and wellness facility that provides youth and adults various programs for their physical, mental, social, and spiritual growth. Our Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) and Catholic Adult Organization (CAO) programs were halted until further notice.

The Governor has now authorized the opening of gyms as long as they provide appropriate social distancing and cleaning procedures, as well as the availability of summer camps throughout the state. Saint John would like to open the Life Center again in a very limited capacity during Phase 1 of Florida's Recovery, utilizing the below Rules and Regulations.

Hours of Operation

The Pulte Family Life Center will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Monday-Friday for access by members only. CYO and CAO activities can occur at various times based on an authorized instructor's presence, and only the participants in that activity would have access during any off hours.

Capacity

The Pulte Family Life Center will have a maximum of 25 people in the facility at any one time. This is inclusive of the staff required to ensure compliance with these rules and regulations, as well as any cleaning or disinfecting required for operations. The breakdown of the capacity limits are:

- Gym: 10 People Maximum
- Nazareth: 10 People Maximum
- Boneyard: 5 People Maximum
- Cardio Room: 5 People Maximum

Access

All access to and from the Pulte Family Life Center will be through the front doors of the building. Any propping open of doors or use of any other entrances/exits other than due to an emergency immediately terminates the membership of the individual.

All individuals who wish to use the Life Center must be members with an active 2020 Usage Agreement. A staff member will be stationed at the Front Office of the PFLC at all times to check for fobs and ensure the member signs in with their names for access to the building. If the maximum capacity of the building has been reached, the staff member will request the individual wait outside until another member leaves. The Sign-Up procedure is:

1. Sign-Ups will be constructed by first come, first serve basis for 30-minute increments (two reservations at a time maximum) and will be communicated via text message.
2. All Sign-Up participants must wait in their car for communication of their spot in the Life Center.
3. If they have not arrived to check in within five minutes of being alerted, their spot is voided and given to the next Sign-Up member, negating their spot on the list.

Usage

If you have any illness of any kind, or are exhibiting any symptoms, please stay home. If you have been sick, please do not use the Pulte Family Life Center for two weeks after your symptoms have

passed.

If you are "at risk," including over the age of 65, have an underlying health condition, or are taking care of a loved one that is at risk, please consider staying home.

All tables and chairs will be removed from the PFLC. Members are to use the facility for their wellness activities only, not for socializing or refreshments.

Vending Machines will remain off, and only water via the members' own bottles will be allowed in the building. Bottles may be refilled at the water fountains.

Usage is limited to staff and existing PFLC members only. No guests will be permitted during this time. 2020 Usage Agreements will be evaluated and checked. No weekly "Try-Out" memberships will be provided at this time. If a visitor would like to sign up as a member, they will be directed to the Parish Activity Center Front Office, where the Usage Agreement and Payment can be finalized.

All participants are to remain at a safe six-foot distance from each other while working out. This is inclusive of all equipment usage locations as well as in open spaces. If a machine is in use, please do not use the immediately adjacent machine(s).

All participants in activities, especially physical fitness or sporting efforts, are not required to wear masks, but all coaches, trainers, and other by-standers (parents, spectators, etc.) must wear masks the entire time they are within the Life Center per CDC Guidance for sporting activities: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/schools-childcare/youth-sports.html>

equipment, etc. are to be wiped down immediately before and after using them.

All equipment must be returned to its original location after usage

There will be no group training sessions or activities. Individuals who are training together must be of the same household or related and in a group of three or less.

All personal training is to be conducted in a safe and distant manner for the protection of both parties involved.

Group CYO and CAO activities like fencing and pickleball must maintain the maximum capacity of the room they are using, and ensure proper social distancing and sanitation to meet or exceed CDC Guidance for Fitness Facilities. The instructor or leader of that activity will be responsible for the state of the facility. If it is found to be out of compliance, the activity will be cancelled.

Indemnification

In consideration of my participation in the Pulte Family Life Center, I hereby release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and to hold harmless the Parish, and the Diocese of Venice in Florida, their officers, directors, employees, clergy, agents, contractors, subcontractors, partners, and volunteers, from and against any and all liability, claims, personal injury, sickness, or death, as well as property damages and expenses, and including, without limitation, attorney fees and court costs, and any and all other liabilities of any nature whatsoever which may be incurred by me or which may arise from my participation in the Program.

Consequences for Non-Compliance

Failure to follow any of the above policies and procedures, the guidelines laid out by the 2020 PFLC Usage agreement, or any verbal directions from the Saint John staff member who is managing the Life Center will result in removal from the facility, termination of entire family membership without refund, and possible permanent expulsion from the PFLC.

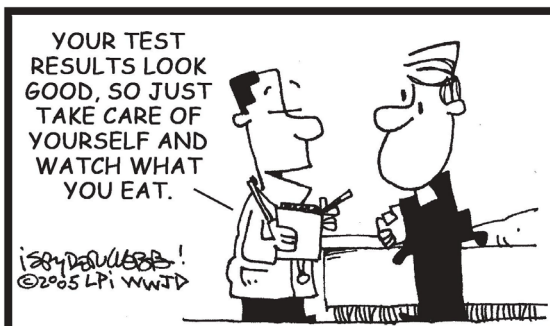

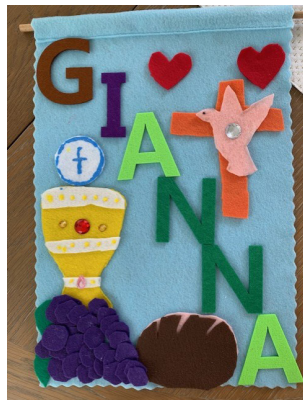
First Communicants Enjoy Making Banners At Home!

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ)

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever..." John 6:51



Corpus Christi celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. This feast was established in 1264 by Pope Urban IV while living in Orvieto, Italy. He requested Saint Thomas Aquinas compose an office – a series of hymns and prayers – for Corpus Christi. We still sing some of these great hymns today, including Panis Angelicus (angel bread) and Tantum Ergo.

St. Thomas also penned this prayer:

O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament left us a memorial of your Passion: grant, we implore you, that we may so venerate the sacred mysteries of your body and blood, as always to be conscious of the fruit of your redemption.

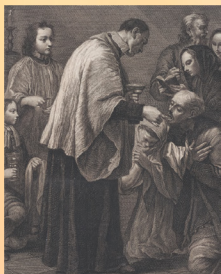
In 1551, the Council of Trent described the festival as a 'triumph over heresy.' When Christians celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, they affirm their belief in the doctrine of transubstantiation, and thus the victory of the Church over those heretics who denied that the consecrated wafer became the real body of Christ during the Mass.
