
SJE Financial Report to the Parish – September 2020

Today we are providing our Fiscal Year 2020 financial results (July 2019-June 2020) to our Parish Family.

The COVID-19 Pandemic and Response has altered our lives considerably, including our worship lives. We have been reacting and adjusting as quickly as possible to our environment. This included acting quickly to reduce expenses given our COVID-Era operating approach. Closed buildings drove reduced maintenance needs and eliminated our hospitality and food service. Refining our needs for landscaping, pest control, housekeeping, and other services delivered significant savings.

A difficult aspect of the Pandemic has been the suspension of programs at the Parish and the reduced outreach we are able to support. Programs have been dramatically pulled back in a response to the understandable reduction in the gifts provided to our Parish Family.

Here is the snapshot of the 2020 Fiscal Year, including July and August 2021 actuals and forecast expenses for the balance of FY 2021 (assumes our current operating profile). Please note the reduced actual expenses each month beginning with March 2020 running right through August.

Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

One of the greatest things we can give another person is our word. In fact, there are those who believe that our word is the only thing we have to give. But it's easy to give our word. It doesn't cost anything there and then. The cost comes later, if and when we honor our word.

Some people are very generous with their word. They will promise you the sun, moon, and stars. But you can't rely on them. They don't really mean it. Their word is worthless. Their promises dissolve like salt in water. How painful it is to deal with such people. There is not one of us who has not experienced the pain of being let down by someone who failed to keep his/her word.

But there are others who are slow to give their word. They don't make promises easily. But when they do make a promise, you can rely on them to honor it. Their promise is like a chain around their leg. How lovely it is to deal with such people.

When the father in Jesus' story asked his two sons to go and work in the vineyard, one of the sons said an immediate and definite 'yes.' He gave his solemn word that he would go. But he didn't keep his word. He didn't go. The other son also gave his word. He said he wouldn't go. However, later he changed his mind and went.

Jesus was not holding either son up as an ideal. Yet we can learn from both. The son who said he would go but didn't is meant to act as a warning to us. We call ourselves Christians but outsiders sometimes accuse us of being hypocrites because our lives do not bear witness to the faith we profess with our lips. Sin does not necessarily imply doing something wrong. The greatest sin is not to do good: the sin of inactivity, of doing nothing.

And we can learn from the son who said 'No' but later changed his mind. To change one's mind is generally regarded as a fault and a weakness. But this is not always the case. It takes humility to admit one's mistake, and courage to put it right.

The second son, because he finally obeyed his father, is a lot better than the first. The ideal son, however, would be the son who immediately and willingly carried out his father's wishes. That is what we should aim at. Jesus is the ideal Son. As St. Paul says, 'He emptied himself and became obedient to the point of death, death on a cross. Therefore, God exalted him.'



The parable teaches us that promises can never take the place of performance, and fine words can never be a substitute for fine deeds.

Faithfulness is one of the greatest and most necessary things in life. But faithfulness is costly. It is not an easy road. It demands unselfishness and a spirit of sacrifice. But even here on earth it brings great rewards in terms of growth, serenity, and joy. There are no such rewards for the unfaithful. There is no happiness at the end of the day for the one who gives his word but fails to honor it. But there is great joy for one who gives his word and honors it.

It is said that a person is as good as his word. If that is so, then the question I must ask myself is: How good is my word?



SJE Financial Report to the Parish – September 2020

Our Income Statement and Balance Sheet for the fiscal year have been adjusted to reflect only Church operations. The "Finish the Church" campaign debt and Catholic Faith Appeal results are noted separately below.

Our Income Statement shows that we finished the year with a surplus of \$77,400. At the end of our fiscal year, we created a full depreciation schedule for our fixed assets in accordance with Diocese policy. We have excluded a required catch-up depreciation schedule from the illustrated Income Statement. It amounted to \$2,728,339 and will be shown in our future Income Statements – approximately \$704,000/year.

Our parish holds one-two months of expenses in a checking account to operate the Parish, per Diocesan Policy. Specific ministries carry balances, as well (ex. Thanksgiving in the Park, Scouts, Social Ministry, etc.). Our savings is used to fund our normal summer deficits. The Balance Sheet incorporates fixed assets net of accumulated depreciation.

As a direct result of the Pandemic, we applied for and received a PPP loan of \$219,355 on which we will apply for forgiveness this fall.

FINISH THE CHURCH

The Hurricane Irma damage has been explained with pictures and in the context of our Capital Campaign to build the Pulte Center and reinvigorate our campus. At the high point we had borrowed well over \$2 million dollars from the Diocese on a line of credit to complete repairs, obtain Hurricane Irma related insurance reimbursement, and to "Finish the Church." In the early part of 2020, we continued to incur costs to complete the many details of the campus repairs and enhancements.

In May, we completed work and formalized a 10-year, \$1,214,460 loan with the Diocese related to the entire campus renewal. At June 30, 2020, the loan balance was \$1,110,875, and as of September 1, thanks to your overwhelming generosity, our loan balance is \$976,240. We are making progress and will continue to need everyone's help to eliminate the debt!

CATHOLIC FAITH APPEAL (CFA)

Our CFA goal this year is \$572,000. As of August 27, we have pledges of \$402,657 and are \$169,343 away from our goal. The CFA remains a critical component of how we deliver support to our region in a shared way as part of a 61 Parish Catholic community. Your support is critical to the many programs we work to deliver in our Diocese. Please review the good works of the CFA on our website!

CONCLUSION

Our Parish Family's financial outlook is considerably positive, even in the midst of the challenges that have been thrown at us over the past three years. There is increased need in the community due to COVID-19. It is more difficult to serve those people as we normally would because of our debt of \$13,000 a month that we must prioritize.

We are committed to being good stewards of our resources and are committed to the financial viability of our Parish. Soon, you will be receiving a letter from Father Tom, describing a new initiative to Finish the Church and asking you to prayerfully consider how your family can help. Thank you for your generosity and continuing to support our Mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God, in His Church and Our Community.






