### The Beatification of Fr. McGivney is a Cause for Celebration for the Order



On Saturday, October 31, 2020, a beatification Mass was held in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, Conn. Father Michael J. McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, was declared "Blessed," and his feast day will be set. Father McGivney was the first U.S.-born priest who spent his entire priestly ministry in a parish to be beatified. This is a great boost to the priesthood and to the Catholic Church in America.

He was a central figure in the growth of Catholicism in America, and he remains a model today. Decades ahead of his time, Father McGivney had a keen sense of the layman's unique vocation, needs, and potential contributions, and he drew his people into the life and activities of the parish.

This respect for the laity led Father McGivney to found the Knights of Columbus, a fraternal organization for Catholic men, in 1882.

## Gospel Reflections

## Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

To visit the great National Parks of America is an unforgettable experience. But to explore one of them is better still. There you will find carefully laid out trails for hikers and walkers. On those trails you will find lots of markers. In difficult uphill or downhill parts you will find steps cut out in the rocks. In marshy places you will find stepping-stones laid out. And in dangerous parts you will see warning signs posted.

Thanks to these well-made and well-worn trails, even amateurs can make their way safely through deep forest and rugged mountain terrain. As you travel these trails you marvel at the hard work that went into the making of them. And one thing becomes abundantly clear: without those trails the ordinary hiker would be completely lost.

The saints have done something similar for us. They have laid out paths for us. They have put down markers on those paths. They have travelled the way ahead of us, a great host of them. They have shown us what ordinary human beings like us can achieve when they avail of the grace of God. They have set us an example of determination, dedication, and sacrifice.

Christians have always turned to the example of the saints. Some saints went straight to the goal. Others fell, stumbled, blundered, before finally getting it right. But all have expanded the possibilities of human love and courage.

Such examples are not confined to the roll of official saints. All around us, even in our own times, there are men and women whose stories guide us on our journey – people in whom the two great commandments, love of God and love of neighbor, have been joined to an extraordinary degree.

We draw encouragement and inspiration from these men and women who have gone before us and blazed a trail for us. Each one has made the path that bit easier for the rest of us. And when we experience weariness and a sense of failure and futility, it's as if they are saying to us, "We are with you. Don't give up."

However, there is a tendency to put the saints on such an exalted pedestal that we feel justified in excusing ourselves from imitating them. In this case devotion to the saints becomes more of a hindrance

than a help.



The saints serve as models for us precisely because they were sinners like us. They are reminders to us of what life is about. They inspire us, guide us, encourage us and give us hope. And, of course, they also intercede for us.

But they can't do it in our place. Nor will they provide us with shortcuts and ways of evading the hard slog and the narrow road. We must not expect others to do for us what we cannot discipline ourselves to do. We ourselves have to walk the path. We have to make the journey. The saints help us to dare that journey.

## Thanksgiving in the Park 2020 Suspended Due to COVID-19 Pandemic Response





## Ministry Spotlight

### Blessed Michael J. McGivney

Father McGivney's special vocation was to develop Catholic manhood, to bind into one conspicuous solidarity all the elements that make for strength of character, and to bring out that solidity of character prominently in its strength before the world. Thanks to his labors, the Society of the Knights of Columbus was organized in 1882. His example of charity, evangelization, and empowerment of the laity continues to bear fruit and guide Knights of Columbus around the world.

Father McGivney lived in times not unlike now. He died in the Asian Flu Pandemic of 1890. He is known to intercede especially in four area of contemporary concern:

- Employment and finances. Just as parishioners looked to Father McGivney for help when "No Irish need apply" was often included in job postings, today many receive help when they are laid off or seeking a better job.
- Substance abuse. In Father McGivney's day, alcoholism
  afflicted the immigrant population, and many now find
  relief from drug or alcohol abuse after praying to him.
- **Family reconciliation.** Father McGivney helped immigrant families struggling to stay together and to make ends meet. Today, Father McGivney continues to respond to the prayers of families.
- **Return to the faith.** Father McGivney founded the Order to keep men from joining anti-Catholic societies. Today, many Catholics receive favors when calling upon him to help their fallen-away children return to Mass. (from *Columbia* magazine)

Celebrating the Saints St. Jude of Thaddeus



St. Jude was one of Jesus' twelve apostles. He was also the bother of St. James, the Less, who was also an apostle. St. Jude is the patron Saint of Hope and Impossible Causes. St. Jude shared the Gospel with great love and enthusiasm, having great impact on those around him.

St. Jude is often portrayed as carrying an image of Jesus with him,

a reminder of a great miracle when Jesus impressed an image of His own face on a cloth and gave it to St. Jude to go and cure King Abagar of Edessa, who was suffering from Leprosy.

After Jesus' death and resurrection, St. Jude continued to preach the Gospel along with St. Simon. St. Jude died for his faith in Christ, and we pray to him today to intercede to Jesus for us. ## Covid-19 Updates

## SJE COVID-19 Response Updates for November 2020



We are blessed that so many of our Parish Family have continued to engage our faith together, both in-person as well as virtually, through this Pandemic. It is incredibly important that our church is a refuge and support mechanism for those in need, physically, spiritually, and emotionally. The isolation many are feeling is palpable, and Saint John is here to serve you and your loved ones through the COVID-19 Response and beyond.

We have been able to update some of our Policies and Procedures from the initial Public Attendance for Mass participation recently. A message was sent out to the internal Ministry leadership of the Parish to evaluate their Ministry's ability to meet again on-site. Some additional changes we would like to announce are:

### Opportunities for Reconciliation Move Into the Church Building

For the last several months, the clergy of Saint John the Evangelist have been providing the healing Sacrament of Reconciliation in our Middle Parking Lot, rain or shine (including blazing hot summer mornings), for individual Confessions on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays. We are now authorized to provide Reconciliation back in the Church building, rather than outside. Beginning November 1, 2020, all Confessions will be held in the Inner Sacristy room immediately after the Daily Masses on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays still. Penitent individuals may wait in the Narthex (Church Lobby) socially distanced and the priest will come out and receive the individual to bring them into the Sacristy.



Confessions will start after the Daily Mass completes (around 9:00 a.m. on weekdays and 8:30 a.m. on Saturdays) until all are heard.

### **Pulte Family Life Center Expands to Saturday Hours**



We are now able to allow individuals who have memberships to the Pulte Family Life Center to use the building on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. for their personal health and wellness activities, along with our normal weekday hours of Monday – Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Only members are allowed to enter the facility during these times and everyone must follow our Pulte Family Life Center COVID-19 Policies and Procedures while in the building.

### Continuing Our Health and Safety Practices for All Activities on Campus

Saint John the Evangelist has instituted significant operational activities to ensure the healthiest environment possible for our Parish Family to attend Mass, Faith Formation Programs, and many other activities on our campus.
