Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

During the course of our lives we have lots of encounters with people. Most of these turn out to be of little significance and are soon forgotten. You could meet some people every day but never get close to them. Surface meets surface. You could talk to some people for hours, even years, without feeling that you had ever revealed your true self to them. You could live for years in the same community as people and never get to know them or talk about the deeper things of life with them. Some contacts with others throw us back on ourselves poorer than when we left. This is one of the great sadnesses of life.

But other encounters turn out to be of great significance; they enrich our lives and sometimes change them utterly. You may have just one meeting with someone, and an immediate bond is formed. You are able to reveal yourself in a true and clear light. This is one of the most delightful and rewarding things in life.

When a friendship is born, there is no tangible change in one's life, just an awareness that one's life is different, and that one's capacity to love and care has miraculously been enlarged without any effort on one's own part.

It is wrong to think that love comes from long companionship and persevering courtship. According to Kahlil Gibran, 'Love is the offspring of spiritual affinity, and unless that affinity is created in a moment, it will not be created in years or even generations.'

Many significant encounters appear to happen by accident. Some people will tell you that this was how they met their marriage partner: the circumstances of that first encounter are never forgotten. Once we come to love or hate someone, we remember almost every detail of that first encounter.

This helps us in understanding the importance of that first meeting between Jesus and three of the men who later became his apostles – Peter, Andrew, and John. It's clear they had a wonderful encounter. Years later, when John came to write his Gospel, he could remember the exact time of day in which the encounter took place, it was about the tenth hour (four o'clock in the afternoon).

One meeting with Jesus and they were captivated by him. He gave them as much time as they wanted. They knew they had met a remarkable person, and a rare friendship was born.

They felt totally at peace in His presence. Through their contact with Him they began to discover themselves. Because of the kind of person He was, they got a vision of what they themselves might become.

There is a huge difference between power and influence. Those who wield power over us oppress us, trying to turn us into slaves or copies of themselves. Those who exercise influence on us do not try to convert us, or change us, or mold us. They offer us the space in which we can find ourselves and our own way. Jesus didn't exercise power over His disciples,

but He had a profound influence on them. That encounter changed forever the lives of Peter, Andrew, and John.

We can't encounter Jesus in the flesh. But we can encounter him spiritually in faith as a Friend, a Brother, and a Savior. Not to know Jesus is not to have discovered what Christianity is about. Christianity involves a close relationship with Jesus.

Jesus is forever passing by. He is always available to those who are sincerely looking for Him. But He never forces Himself on anyone. To those who are interested in knowing more, He says what He said to John and Andrew: 'Come and see.' Of course it is not a once-and-for-all encounter but a growing relationship with Him that we are talking about.

Providing the Highest Quality Online Mass Experience Possible

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is core to our faith as Catholics. It has been incredibly difficult for so many that are at risk or are concerned for their family's health to participate in it weekly. Our priests here at Saint John are spectacular, and their messages ring true with each Gospel Reading. The music continues to be a wonderful enrichment of the Mass experience. We are in a position to be able to share the Mass to the entire world, and have been doing so since the Pandemic Response began in March. We stream our Daily Mass each weekday, and also three separate Masses on the weekend, with all these Masses being available on demand via various online locations. Here are a few ways to view our Mass online (or help your loved ones get to it):

Watch on Our Website



The easiest way to view our Masses is to go to our website (sjecc.com) and click on the "SJE Live Streaming Mass" Page (which can also be viewed directly

as <https://saintjohntheevangelist.com/featured/sje-streaming-mass>). If it is during one of our live time frames, it will show the live feed. If it is after the Mass concludes, it will show the On Demand version of the Mass, so you can watch it whenever you want.

Pro Tip: If you are going to watch a Mass On Demand, you will see a little white circle on the timeline of the video (see image with red highlight). Clicking that will bring you right to the start of the Mass.

Watch on Your Smart TV (or Device) with the Vimeo App

Saint John the Evangelist uses Vimeo for the highest quality streaming and on demand video system available. Did you know that we can stream an 8K version to a large screen TV? The best experience for a SmartTV, or for anyone that has an AppleTV, Amazon Fire, or any other device, is to download

the Vimeo Application for free from the App Store on that device. It should look like this blue "V." Then, you can follow these steps:



1. Open the Vimeo App on your device/ TV
2. Go to the "Search" and type in "sjecc" (you may have to select "People" to see the results)
3. Choose from any of our On Demand videos, or if we are currently Live Streaming at the time you are looking at our account, you will see the Live choice as the first option.
4. If you create a free Vimeo account, you can then "Follow" St. John the Evangelist, and any time we put a video up or start streaming, you will get an alert to watch.

Posting YouTube Masses



We also post our Daily Masses and the On Demand Weekend Mass on YouTube. If you already view videos via YouTube, you can subscribe to our channel by searching for "Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church Naples" (there are several other Saint John the Evangelist churches on YouTube, so look for our blue eagle logo to make sure you choose the correct one).

We currently do not stream our Masses live to YouTube due to licensing restrictions imposed by Google, even though they have our properly structured music licensing for streaming functionality.

Continue Giving to Our Parish Family Remotely

Another tool we have here at Saint John to assist our Parish Family is our online giving system. We would not be able to continue our Mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community, without your generosity. And, as many of you know, we have significantly decreased our environment to allow for us to continue to operate with the constrained funds that are being donated. We completely understand the challenges we are all facing, we are facing



The Diocese of Venice has required all Parishes to use an online system for our Parish Information called ConnectNow, by a company called ParishSOFT. One great feature about this system is the ability for every family that is part of Saint John to be able to access their own information in what they call "My Own Church." This system will enable you to change your phone number and address if you move, sign up for Youth Faith Formation, and even view your giving statements at any time. 2022 Mass Intention Book Opens January 25, 2021

As our Parish Family has continued to expand and attract more members to our church, one question we have been consistently asked is: "How can I have a Mass said for a loved one?" This has been challenging in the past, with some confusion as to how to ask for a Mass Intention, the person or family the priest prays for during a Mass. There has also been difficulty in requesting Masses due to the volume of requests we receive on an annual basis, far more than the amount of Masses celebrated at Saint John.

Our clergy and staff have come up with some consistent guidelines to assist in ensuring as many people as possible can receive the prayers of our Parish Family, especially for those who have lost a loved one and desire to memorialize them. These policies will be in effect beginning with the 2022 Mass Intention requests, which we are opening for requests beginning January 25, 2021:

1. Only one (1) Mass Intention can be provided for each

Mass.

2. Each individual can request up to five (5) Masses a year.
3. An individual or family can have up to five (5) Mass Intentions said for them in a year.
4. Mass Intentions are provided in a first come, first served fashion for the dates and Mass times requested.
5. Mass Intention requests must be made at the Front Office of Saint John, and cannot be requested of the priests in the Church or in other locations. You may call or walk into the Office during our normal business hours to select your Mass Intention(s).
6. Mass Intentions are \$10 a Mass. This is a Diocesan requirement. If additional gifts would like to be provided over that amount, a separate payment should be provided. Cash can only be given in exact change, and checks and credit cards can be used as well.

"I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter.


