Gospel Reflections

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Many opportunities arise each day that afford us no second chance. In order to take advantage of them, one must seize the moment. Sad to say, many times people just fail to respond, and lose out on the opportunity. How many buying opportunities, travel opportunities, even work opportunities are lost because people fail to respond promptly? Connections are never made and meetings never take place because people fail to take action. Often, these people look back with regret and disappointment at what might have been.

Our God places an array of opportunities before his people; opportunities to choose life. God not only gave us life, He redeemed our lives and showed us the path to everlasting life. He also keeps calling us to choose the path of life. So many opportunities have been laid before God's people throughout the ages to respond to Him. God sent numerous prophets. He gave His laws and teachings. He continues to work great signs and wonders before us. He offers us forgiveness of sins and blesses us with His choicest blessings. Some seize these moments and choose the path of life, while others turn further away from the Lord.

Our Scripture readings today give us examples of people who seized the moment in choosing the path of life. The account of Jonah and the Ninevites clearly shows the opportunity that God laid before Nineveh through the prophet Jonah. The city and all its inhabitants would be destroyed unless they repented. The people of Nineveh seized the moment. The great and the small repented of their sins, and they lived. The story makes it clear that there would be no second chance. Only a prompt response would put them on the path of life – and they responded.

The call of the Apostles to follow Jesus was another blessed opportunity from God. We hear in the Gospel how Jesus laid this opportunity before Peter, Andrew, James, and John. Despite any apprehensions they might have felt due to family or work, they seized the moment. They abandoned their former way of life and followed Jesus. There was little time to think about it. Their prompt response placed them in the path of life, alongside the Lord.

Each of us was given new life in Christ in the sacrament of baptism. Since then, God has placed, and continues to place, opportunities before us to choose the path of life again and again. We are called to seize the moment; to use today to grow in faith. Today is the day to love your spouse in the same way that Christ does; to form your children in faith; to visit a sick friend or someone who is grieving. These



are the opportunities in daily life through which God calls us to live out our faith. A prompt response to his call can help keep us on the path of life and bring joy. A missed opportunity can leave us looking back with regret and disappointment in our Christian life.

As we look at the various opportunities God places before us each day, the words of today's second reading remind us that the time is running out ... the world in its present form is passing away. We are to seize every opportunity to repent, every opportunity to follow Christ, and every opportunity to choose the path of life.



Vatican Modifies Distribution of Ashes for Ash Wednesday



The health situation caused by Covid-19 continues to forces changes on daily life, which are also reflected in the Church's sphere.

Ahead of the beginning of Lent, on Wednesday, February 17, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments has published a note detailing how Catholic priests are to distribute ashes.

Instructions

After blessing the ashes and sprinkling them with holy water in silence, the priest addresses those present, reciting once the formula found in the Roman Missal: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

At that point, the note continues, the priest "cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places."

He then sprinkles the ashes on each person's head "without saying anything."

2022 Mass Intention Book Opens January 25, 2021

As our Parish Family has continued to expand and attract more members to our church, one question we have been consistently asked is: "How can I have a Mass said for a loved one?" This has been challenging in the past, with some confusion as to how to ask for a Mass Intention, the person or family the priest prays for during a Mass. There has also been difficulty in requesting Masses due to the volume of requests we receive on an annual basis, far more than the amount of Masses celebrated at Saint John.

Our clergy and staff have come up with some consistent guidelines to assist in ensuring as many people as possible can receive the prayers of our Parish Family, especially for those who have lost a loved one and desire to memorialize them. These policies will be in effect beginning with the 2022 Mass Intention requests, which we are opening for requests beginning January 25, 2021:

1. Only one (1) Mass Intention can be provided for each

Mass.

- 2. Each individual can request up to five (5) Masses a year.
- 3. An individual or family can have up to five (5) Mass Intentions said for them in a year.
- 4. Mass Intentions are provided in a first come, first served fashion for the dates and Mass times requested.
- 5. Mass Intention requests must be made at the Front Office of Saint John, and cannot be requested of the priests in the Church or in other locations. You may call or walk into the Office during our normal business hours to select your Mass Intention(s).
- 6. Mass Intentions are \$10 a Mass. This is a Diocesan requirement. If additional gifts would like to be provided over that amount, a separate payment should be provided. Cash can only be given in exact change, and checks and credit cards can be used as well.


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



